3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case on
4	our calendar is Case No. 20-PRO-00048, Wonder
5	Mart, License No. 116997. Ms. Andrews, can you
6	please elevate the rights of the parties in this
7	case, please?
8	MS. ANDREWS: Sure, stand by. That's
9	all, Mr. Chair.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Can
11	I have the parties identify themselves for the
12	record? Let's start with the Licensee? Can you
13	spell your name for the record, please?
14	MS. GEBREMESKEL: Thank you so much.
15	My first name is A-D-A-N-E-C-H and last name G-E-
16	B-E-R-E-M-E-S-K-E-L from Wonder Mart.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who else is
18	here from Wonder Mart?
19	MR. KETEMA: Thank you. My name is
20	Estegenet Ketema, E-T-S-E-G-E-N-E-T K-E-T-E-M-A.
21	I'm the owner of Wonder Mart.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Just as an FYI,
23	do you own at least more than one business in DC,
24	Mr. Ketema? Is that correct?
25	MR. KETEMA: Yes, sir.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The only reason				
2	I'm asking you is because you were on another				
3	case before, so I just want to make sure.				
4	MR. KETEMA: No, I was wrongly called				
5	upon to join the hearing. That's why I muted and				
6	I left the hearing, the hearing.				
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you weren't				
8	supposed to be on the other case?				
9	MR. KETEMA: No, I was not supposed to				
10	be there.				
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's why you				
12	were quiet when I was asking. Well, my apologies

14	MR. KETEMA: No problem.

17	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: This is Salim				
18	Adofo, the (audio interference) commissioner.				
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you please				
20	spell your name, sir?

23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, sir.				
24	You are from ANC what, please?

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What ANC are you 2 from, sir? 3 COMMISSIONER ADOFO: 8C. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. 4 Are 5 there any preliminary matters in this case? Preliminary matters are -- I'm just saying are 6 7 there any issues that you believe that should be 8 addressed by the Board? 9 COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Yes, sir. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on. 10 I know 11 that there has not been a mediation as yet, so we 12 will work towards scheduling a mediation in this 13 Any other issues, please? 14 COMMISSIONER ADOFO: I apologize, sir. 15 I may not be clear on the question. When you say 16 preliminary matters, what does that include? 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm just saying 18 is there any particular problem that you have in 19 this moving forward that you need to bring to my 20 attention? Not the substance of the case, but 21 just are there any procedural issues that you're 22 having? That's what that is. 23 COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Oh okay. Not on 24 my end, sir. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ketema and

Ms. Gebremeskel?

MR. KETEMA: Not for this time.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We will schedule this matter for a mediation. If this matter can be settled at mediation it will be, but the Agency will work towards scheduling mediation in this case. This is an application for a new establishment.

COMMISSIONER ADOFO: I have a question.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir.

COMMISSIONER ADOFO: I didn't -- is mediation mandatory that we participate in it?

I'm not opposed to it --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.

COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Okay, I'm just trying to understand the process.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: One of the things that I would ask that you do, we offer mediation. It does help. I'm sorry; it does help to offer mediation because at least each side will know where each side is. At least there's an opportunity to speak, but I would encourage the parties to go to mediation because at least you'll know what each sides are.

If you have never done a protest

hearing before, at least you can find some more information. At the end of this I'm going to give both sides some instructions to let you know who within our Agency will work with both sides to walk you through the process if you have any questions.

COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Yeah, I have a question before we get to mediation.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What is the question, sir?

COMMISSIONER ADOFO: My question is this establishment is already present in the community. From what I've gathered from some of the residents that we've surveyed and talked to, it's not an issue if the establishment can stay or not. It's the issue can the establishment have the retail license to sell alcoholic beverages right next to a school and with a liquor store right next to it, as well.

I don't have a problem -- nobody in the community has a problem with the store being there. It's that there's a liquor store right next to it already, so we didn't see a need for another liquor store. So we can go to mediation, I'm just trying to understand what would we

mediate if we're happy that the store can provide services, but not that particular service?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: There are regulations that exist about how many feet you can be in front of a school. I don't know what type of license -- I guess this is a --

MS. GEBREMESKEL: It is a Class B -CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on one
minute, please, ma'am. This is a B license
that's being requested, so this is a grocery
store. It's a little bit different, so there are
different rules and regulations about what type
of -- because say if it was an A license it
probably would be no. A B license I'm not sure,
but that is something that you can talk to our
representative about.

not by statute, whether or not a license can be granted to that location if you're saying that there is an A or B within certain feet of a school. That's something that you can bring to the attention of the Agency and dependent on where it is from a legal perspective, the Agency will make a decision to say this can or cannot move forward. That's something that I will say

as part of our investigation. That's part of the investigation that we will do before the license will be granted. That's something that you can find out from our Agency.

COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Yes, sir. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am, what were you saying?

MS. GEBREMESKEL: Just explaining about my application. It is Class B, 25 percent retail class B license.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm aware of that, ma'am. As I said before, I can't give you an answer right now whether or not based on the location of your establishment whether or not this is a license that can be granted. The Agency will make the determination whether or not based on what is within the vicinity of your establishment whether or not you can get that license.

There are two issues. One issue from a legal perspective, can you get the license?

The second issue is if you can get the license, then the Board, if it goes to a protest then the Board will make a determination based on the

presentation that's made by the ANC whether or not we're going to grant the license. There's two different analyses. One analysis will say you can get the license because of your location. If that's the case, that's what the law says, the matter is over.

The second issue is that yes, you're eligible to get the license, but should we, based on the information that's provided by the ANC, should the ABC Board grant this license? That's something that both sides can discuss in mediation, both sides can discuss with Ms.

Randall, and she can at least let you know whether or not from a legal perspective you can even have this license, okay? That's basically where we are.

MS. GEBREMESKEL: Thank you so much.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Anyway, so as I was stating, we will schedule a mediation. I am unable to provide you with a date for the protest hearing, but the Board will provide you shortly a date when we will have the protest hearing. We will provide that date to you, okay?

MS. GEBREMESKEL: Okay, thank you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Let me find the

instructions to read to you. Now that we have scheduled this matter for a protest hearing, there are a few things that I would like to instruct you about so that the protest hearing is focused and addresses only those issues that are being protested. You either have already received or will soon be receiving an email from Imani Moreland that contains a copy of a Protest Information Form, PIF, and a copy of an exhibit form. Both parties are required to complete and submit the Protest Information Form, PIF, and the exhibit form at least seven days before the date of the hearing.

If we do not receive a copy of your forms seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to dismissal. These documents not only need to be submitted to ABRA, but to the opposing party, as well. Please note that these documents greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parties on point during the hearing.

Each side will have 90 minutes to present their case. This includes all direct and cross-examination witnesses. The Board does not

intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to these issues that are being protested, nor will the Board tolerate repetitive testimony. Are there any questions by anyone?

So Mr. Adofo, the legal question that you were asking before with whether or not there is another store there, she can let you know from a legal perspective whether or not -- I know that once the application comes in, we do -- the ABC Board, our GIS map tells us what other licenses are within that location.

Because of the type of license that they are applying for, they might be eligible for it because of the particular -- although there might be a liquor store next to it. But based on the type of license that they're applying for, they might be eligible for it. But that's something that Ms. Randall can provide you more clarification on. The second issue, even if this license is available to them based on if we go to
