The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via WebEx videoconference, LaVerne Fletcher, Board's Agent, presiding.

MS. FLETCHER: There's one more case on the calendar today and that case is Power Night Club/Lounge/Restaurant 2325 Bladensburg Road NE. License number ABRA 104228. This is a Retailer Class CT license renewal.

The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order and quiet.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher conducting the roll call hearing as the Board's agent. Is anyone present on behalf of the establishment?

MS. YOHANNES: Yes, good morning.

Sidon Yohannes present on behalf of the licensee and that's S-I-D-O-N Y-O-H-A-N-N-E-S.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you and is the protestant present? Ms. Miller, are you present?

MS. MILLER: Sorry, I was trying to get off mute. Yes, Denesha Miller that is D-E-N-E-S-H-A Miller. I'm the president of the Adams Row HOA Association. I do believe we have some others that are on.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, Ms. Miller, we only received the protest letter from you. Okay?

MS. MILLER: Okay.

	MS. FLETCHER: Just making sure that
2	I don't have any other protest letters from
3	anyone else. I'm just making sure that there's
4	not someone (Simultaneous speaking.)
5	MS. MILLER: Yeah, I know some others
6	were sent. Gilbert, are you on and able to come
7	off mute?
8	MS. FLETCHER: Yeah, I don't have a
9	protest letter from anyone else, but let me get
10	the name of person.
11	MS. MILLER: Okay.
12	MR. SMITH: So, good morning, this is
13	Gilbert Smith.
14	MS. FLETCHER: Gilbert. Mr. Smith,
15	would you spell your name for the record, please?
16	MR. SMITH: Gilbert is G-I-L-B-E-R-T.
17	Last name Smith S-M-I-T-H.
18	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you and there's
19	someone else?
20	MR. SMITH: May I just, just for
21	clarification I did submit a protest and it was
22	acknowledged by ABRA.
23	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. Thank
24	you, Mr. Smith. Is there anyone else? Okay, so
25	Ms. Miller, you're here. Mr. Smith, you're here.

Mr. Smith, I don't see a protest letter for you, but I believe you, you say you sent one and it was acknowledged by us, so I'm just going to get the information that I need beyond today for the record, though, that I have here in my possession. Mr. Smith, do you by any chance know when you filed your protest?

MR. SMITH: Yes, it was between

November 15 and November (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. FLETCHER: Was it November 15?

MR. SMITH: Yes. It was acknowledged by Martha Jenkins of the General Counsel Office on the 18th and just further for the record, there would be other representatives from the community. I realize I have the link and a couple of others have them. One other representative that's on that hasn't been acknowledged yet, but our ANC chair will be on as well. She acknowledged the protest, but there was quite a bit of confusion in terms of communication on whether this was virtual, just for the record.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. One second.

Okay, so Mr. Smith, what I've written here is
that on November 15, 2022, is when you filed your

1	protest and that it was acknowledged by Martha		
2	Jenkins on November 18, 2022. What did you say		
3	about the ANC?		
4	MR. SMITH: Jackie Manning is our ANC		
5	commission.		
6	MS. FLETCHER: You believe she filed		
7	a protest as well?		
8	MR. SMITH: No, she was copied on the		
9	protest so she was (Simultaneous speaking.)		
10	MS. FLETCHER: Oh she was copied on		
11	the one you filed?		
12	MR. SMITH: Correct as well as Council		
13	Member McDuffy's office as well.		
14	MS. FLETCHER: Council Member		
15	McDuffy's office was copied and, Mr. Smith, the		
16	protest letter that you filed just had your		
17	signature?		
18	MR. SMITH: It was from my wife and		
19	myself.		
20	MS. FLETCHER: Okay and what's your		
21	wife's name?		
22	MR. SMITH: Cindy C-I-N-D-Y.		
23	MS. FLETCHER: And so, I don't have		
24	the letter in front of me, Mr. Smith, so I just		
25	have a question for you. How did you file your		

protest? Did you file it as neighbors, living 1 close by? How did you file it? 2 Just as neighbors or persons living near by the 3 establishment? Did you file it as abutting 4 5 property owners? I'm just trying to get a sense of the basis. 6 7 MR. SMITH: No problem. I just wanted to let you finish your statement. 8 9 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, I'm done. I filed it. (Simultaneous MR. SMITH: 10 11 speaking.) I'm sorry. I'm just trying not to 12 talk over you. I filed it as a 30 plus year resident that lives within 500 feet of the 13 establishment. I literally can see the 14 15 establishment from the front of my house and it probably is, well, within 500 feet. 16 MS. FLETCHER: 17 And, Ms. Miller --18 MR. SMITH: Does that answer your question? 19 Ms. Miller? MS. FLETCHER: Yes. 20 21 MS. MILLER: Yes? 22 MS. FLETCHER: I read in your protest 23 letter that you also live within 500 feet of the establishment. Is that the reason that you filed 24 25 your protest as well --

1	MS. MILLER: That's correct.
2	MS. FLETCHER: Because of how close
3	you live?
4	MS. MILLER: That's correct. As
5	stated, I'm the president of the HOA subdivision
6	here and so I represent 22 condo and townhome
7	properties that are also within 500 feet or a
8	mile or less of Power Night Club.
9	MS. FLETCHER: And your protest, Ms.
10	Miller, was based on the establishment having an
11	adverse impact on peace, order and quiet and
12	residential parking. Is it the same for yours,
13	Mr. Smith?
14	MR. SMITH: Yes, in summary, that is
15	correct. If you like, I can go through the
16	protests (Simultaneous speaking.)
17	MS. FLETCHER: I'll get your protest
18	letter when I get back to my office. Thank you.
19	MR. SMITH: All right, but in short,
20	yes, in answer to your question.
21	MS. FLETCHER: So what I'm going to
22	do, I'm going to read to you the definition, and
23	this is very short, of what an abutting property
24	owner is because what happens when you file a
25	protest of an ABRA, if you're going to file as an

individual or anyone is going to file where there's a group of less than two, those protests are dismissed unless you're claiming to be an abutting property owner, but I want to give you the description of that first. It's just a very short description.

It means any property where the property line is a boundary or boundary point in common where the walls touch and so from what you're describing now it sounds like you would be too far away for the walls to touch. You would need to be abutting where your ceiling would touch the floor or, but you get the idea in order to file a protest of less than a group of five. Did you have any questions about that?

MS. MILLER: No, that's fine. Again, I think we more than meet that, of course, as I'm the president of HOA in 22 plus units and then within a community that's also very interested in this matter.

MS. FLETCHER: And so, Ms. Miller, in your case, you filed the protest as an individual. I have your protest letter where you signed it as an individual and so in your case, your property, your address, what has to abut

that Power Night Club.

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MS. MILLER: Okay. (Simultaneous speaking.) No, so I wouldn't meet that, you're right. Would not meet that classification, I'm not attached to that property, but the other items certainly as far as parking and noise and things.

MS. FLETCHER: I'm going to give you some other information in a moment. Mr. Smith, does the same apply to you? You mentioned that you and your wife are approximately 500 feet away, so that means that your property does not abut that of the establishment?

MR. SMITH: That is correct.

MS. FLETCHER: So the protest filed by you, Ms. Miller and Mr. Smith and your wife, Cindy Smith, those protests are dismissed. They have to be dismissed because you're not abutting property owners, but I read your complaint at least, Ms. Miller, and it sounds like you already know about the option to take up your noise complaint, etc., with the Enforcement Division.

Am I right about that?

MS. MILLER: No, what would be the process for that? Is there a separate?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.

MS. MILLER: Office for that and people? Could you provide their contact information?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes, there's a separate process for that. You could even use the same letter; you too, Mr. Smith. You could even use the same letter that you filed as a protest as a complaint. With the Enforcement Division, you would be filing a complaint. The complaint will be what you said in your protest letter and once you do that, the Enforcement Division will assign the case to an investigator.

An investigator will come out and investigate your allegations. Once the investigator has completed his/her investigation, the investigative report goes to the ABC Board to determine what should be the next course of action.

You would receive a copy of the investigative report, but the Board would decide what happens next. But, that's what happens when you file a complaint with the Enforcement Division, which you can do at any time.

I'm actually going to have to, so Ms.

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Miller --

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MS. MILLER: Just so I'm clear, I thought that this meeting was in order to protest the additional extended hours of Power Night Club during the week which also extends their beverage and liquor license. (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Miller? Ms. Miller could you repeat that?

MS. MILLER: Sorry. I thought the purpose of this meeting was to protest the application that Power Night Club has filed in order to extend their hours and also to extend their beverage servicing hours during that time. So, that was what myself and Mr. Smith filed our protest in regards to because that's what we received that the purpose of today was, to have a protest for the extension of that. Now, I'm sorry, did you say it was abutment? That was not in reference to what was on the actual docket for today. (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. FLETCHER: So the case for today is related to the license renewal. I'm not familiar with the extension of hours that you're referring to Ms. Miller. Was there a placard posted for that?

1	MR. SMITH: Yes, yes there was.
2	MS. MILLER: Yes. (Simultaneous
3	speaking.)
4	MS. FLETCHER: There was a placard
5	posted for the what kind of placard? Do you
6	know what the placard notice said to be the
7	application, like this is a license renewal. Do
8	you recall what the placard said by any chance?
9	MS. MILLER: So it says, license class
LO	type C, tavern. License number ABRA 104228.
L1	Power Night Club and C5C04 has applied for the
L2	renewal of an alcoholic beverage license at this
L3	premise 2335 Bladensburg blah, blah. A
L 4	hearing will be held on 12/12 and then there also
L5	was a request for extending the hours to 2:00
L6	a.m. on certain nights, but that's
L 7	MS. FLETCHER: But that wasn't on the
L8	same placard notice, right?
L9	MS. MILLER: So, it says the date for
20	this discussion is 12/12, which I think is what
21	we thought was the purpose of this call today.
22	(Simultaneous speaking.) have on 12/12.
23	MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry. I'm looking
24	at the placard notice for the license renewal. I
25	don't see anything on it related to the extension

1	of hours. Are you looking at something
2	different?
3	MR. SMITH: Well, this was dated
4	October 7.
5	MS. FLETCHER: Right October 7, was
6	the day it was posted on and it's the license
7	renewal and there's also an endorsement on here
8	related to a cover charge, dance and that's the
9	same one you're looking at?
10	MR. SMITH: Correct.
11	MS. MILLER: No, well (Simultaneous
12	speaking.)
13	MS. FLETCHER: I don't see any
14	extension of hours.
15	MR. SMITH: Well, let me just the
16	endorsement says cover charge, dance. Can I
17	share my screen?
18	MS. FLETCHER: Yeah, I'm looking it.
19	I have the placard.
20	MR. SMITH: Okay. No problem. And
21	then it has the hours of operation from 2:00 p.m.
22	to 2:00 a.m. Hours of sales/service 2:00 p.m. to
23	2:00 a.m. and the hours of entertainment from
24	2:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.
25	MS. FLETCHER: Yes.

MR. SMITH: Those were the 1 understanding of the extension of hours because 2 those -- well, the understanding was that that 3 was part of the hearing process. (Simultaneous 4 5 speaking.) I'm sorry just to clarify, we did not 6 have a notice, if someone could go on mute here, I'm hearing an echo, if you're not muted. 7 MS. FLETCHER: What was the last thing 8 you said, Mr. Smith? 9 MR. SMITH: It was not our 10 understanding that those were the existing hours 11 12 that those hours were extended beyond the 13 original hours. (Simultaneous speaking.) I'm 14 sorry, go ahead. 15 MS. FLETCHER: No, go ahead. I'm 16 sorry. 17 MR. SMITH: Let me, if I may, give a little further history. This was the second 18 hearing that I have participated with regard to 19 Power Night Club. In my protest letter, I gave 20 reference to the history associated with Power 21 22 Night Club. 23 I've attended a hearing before, probably about two or three years ago, it's in 24 25 the letter, I just don't have the letter details

right now. That was with regard to an outside garden and going through ABRA's website, it is understood that that garden was approved during that hearing process. The only other, well there were some other investigations, but the only other hearing is this hearing that was the understanding to extend the hours.

MS. FLETCHER: Yeah, but this hearing (Simultaneous speaking.)

MR. SMITH: I'm sorry. I'm sorry. We may be in the wrong hearing to be honest with you and that goes back to my original comment about the confusion and the lack of responsiveness to understand the process. If I may also add, there was another protest letter by another family within the community, I don't have that information readily right now and they're not on this particular call, because here -- let me just try to explain it in this fashion.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.

MR. SMITH: If we were clear on the time, the agenda and the venue as far as virtual, there would be many more people in our community on this call. Fortunately, Ms. Miller shared the link with me. I shared it with Ms. Cook, who is

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1	also on and is in the community, but I started
2	that, you would have at least five at a minimum,
3	and more than that I would assure of that.
4	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, I understand
5	exactly what you mean. Let me ask, Ms. Cook?
6	MS. COOK: Yes, I'm here.
7	MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Cook?
8	MS. COOK: Yes.
9	MS. FLETCHER: Could you spell your
10	name for the record, please?
11	MS. COOK: M I-C-H-E-L-L-E Cook C-O-O-
12	к.
13	MS. FLETCHER: And, Ms. Cook, you're
14	here today because you filed a protest letter as
15	well?
16	MS. COOK: I did not. I live in the
17	community and I got
18	MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
19	MS. COOK: The link and I want to be
20	a part of what's going on in our community.
21	MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I just wanted to
22	make sure. Okay, it's fine that you're present,
23	I just don't need to determine whether or not you
24	have standing as a protestant. Thanks for
25	coming.

MS. COOK: Yes.

MS. FLETCHER: So, Mr. Smith, I understand what you mean. This hearing today is related to the license renewal, but based on what you're saying, there is or will be a substantial change application related to the extension of hours. In order to extend your hours, there's a substantial change application that has to be filed. It doesn't sound like that's the placard that was posted.

The placard that was posted was for the license renewal, which is the reason that we're here today. So, let me ask you something - the protest filed by Ms. Miller, Mr. and Mrs. Smith, those protests are dismissed today. You'll get a Board order dismissing them for the reasons that I stated already, that the properties are not abutting. You'll have 10 days to seek reinstatement of those protests if you believe that you should have been granted standing as a protestant. That'll be up to you, you'll have that option. You'll get the order, if you don't seek reinstatement then the protests just go away.

MS. MILLER: So, do I understand that,

this is Ms. Miller, in order to meet the 1 qualification for protest that your property has 2 to be abutting and so anything else that's 3 related to parking or noise or just general late 4 5 night traffic and foolishness, would not a part of the abutting protest for the license renewal? 6 7 MS. FLETCHER: Well, yeah, it could There would just need to be a group of at 8 be. least five individuals. 9 MS. MILLER: And so what about my role 10 as HOA president? Because I thought I said 11 12 Denesha Miller, Adams Row HOA, which is again is 22 units. 13 MS. FLETCHER: So, HOA's don't have 14 15 standing as a protestant. If you had filed as the president of the HOA, then that protest would 16 have been dismissed because homeowners' 17 associations don't have standing as protestants, 18 but residents do. 19 Okay, so if I understand 20 MS. MILLER: 21 the next steps is we need at least five people 2.2 and even if we don't meet the physical 23 qualification as far as the, was that word abutment? 24

Uh-huh.

MS. FLETCHER:

MS. MILLER: That we're filing for 1 noise, parking, etc., we can still do so if we 2 meet the minimum of five and we have 10 days --3 Well, there was a MS. FLETCHER: 4 5 deadline to file a protest related to the license 6 renewal so that deadline has already passed, but what you can still do is file a complaint with 7 the Enforcement Division and get them involved. 8 9 The deadline to file a protest for the license renewal was November 21st. 10 11 MS. MILLER: Okay. 12 MS. FLETCHER: But you can still 13 pursue this through the Enforcement Division, pursue your concerns through the Enforcement 14 15 Division. Okay and you'll provide 16 MS. MILLER: 17 that information or? MS. FLETCHER: I don't have the chief 18 of enforcement's e-mail address, Ms. Miller, but 19 when I get back to my desk, I'll send it to you. 20 MS. MILLER: Okay and then so going 21 back to the matter at hand, this was for a 2.2 23 license renewal. It was not for an extension of hours because that --24 25 MS. FLETCHER: Exactly.

MS. MILLER: Did not change. 1 Okay. Exactly. (Simultaneous 2 MS. FLETCHER: I don't know about the hours because 3 speaking.) I don't see a before and after here. Normally, 4 5 of course, substantial change is going to have 6 before and after, but it's a different placard, so as far as I can tell, this is for the license 7 8 renewal only. 9 MS. MILLER: Okay, I did check the website and I see that the hours are the same so 10 11 it does not appear to be --12 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. 13 MS. MILLER: A change in hours. MS. FLETCHER: Exactly. So then, what 14 15 I'm going to do when I get back to my desk, Ms. 16 Miller, and I'll send this to you, too, Mr. 17 Smith, I'm going to send you the e-mail address to our chief of enforcement. You can still 18 19 pursue your concerns, but it would have to be that way. 20 And we can send them 21 MS. MILLER: 22 pretty much the exact same letter, signed with 23 the e-mail contact information, okay? MS. FLETCHER: Yes, just tell him that 24 25 you're filing a complaint. Well, your letter is

a complaint. It says that, but you can just let him know that you're filing a complaint and the letter that you sent already would be attached.

MR. SMITH: So, Ms. Fletcher, if I could just add further clarity to the acknowledgment of my letter from Ms. Jenkins. She says, that she would forward my concerns to the ABRA Chief of Enforcement, Derrick Brooks, who was also copied on her acknowledgment and she says, please feel free to contact him directly in the future. So, it sounds like what you're saying is my letter that I sent has already went to the chief of enforcement. It should be, according to this acknowledgment. So, I just wanted to add that clarification.

I have another statement that I'm kind of reserving, I'll just hold off. Well, I'll just say it for the record. I'm a bit frustrated in the process; however, I understand what you're explaining, but I'm a native Washingtonian, I've been here all my life, trying to do the right thing and this is discouraging in terms of trying to file a complaint, go through the process and like.

I don't have that kind of time

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unfortunately, but I understand we're all trying 1 to do our jobs and trying to do the right thing 2 for the community. It's just I can't spend that 3 kind of time. I'm already over in time, I have 4 5 work commitments and I know everybody has other commitments as well. 6 I wish my ANC Chairman was on there 7 because I think she would be just as livid, but 8 9 nevertheless, I'm just saying that for the record. We'll do what we can. It's just 10 becoming unfortunate in terms of the community 11 12 and what's going on in the community. 13 I don't have anything personally against Power Night Club, but we need to have 14 15 peace and quiet regardless of the time. That's all I have to say for now. 16 17 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. MR. SMITH: I need to drop off because 18 19 (Simultaneous speaking.) MS. FLETCHER: Okay, Mr. Smith, well 20 21 thank you very much for coming. MR. SMITH: All right, thank you. 2.2 23 Thank you. MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. 24 So,

Ms. Miller, it sounds like Mr. Smith's letter was

copied to the chief of enforcement. 1 Mine was also actually, 2 MS. MILLER: but it looks like what happened is we each sent 3 in a letter and then there was an automatic 4 5 response saying we've received your letter, we're going to forward it to such and such. 6 7 MS. FLETCHER: Oh, okay. MS. MILLER: And at least I know for 8 9 my letter, it says that the letter would be forwarded to -- I got a response from ABRA Legal, 10 Derrick Brooks was copied and it said that it 11 12 would be forwarded and that he was copied. Then it further said, you know, 13 pursuant to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board 14 15 will only accept protests and it did provide what you need to do to do that protest, but Mr. Brooks 16 17 was copied in the response acknowledging receipt, but I'm happy to send it to him again and then to 18 document that this is the second letter. 19 MS. FLETCHER: But you haven't heard 20 21 anything? 22 MS. MILLER: I have not. 23 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Miller, do you have the date of that letter of acknowledgment? 24

MS. MILLER: Yes, let's see, November

18th. 1 MS. FLETCHER: November 18. 2 November 18 is when the e-mail was copied to Mr. 3 Brooks. Okay and does his e-mail address show up 4 5 on the document? MS. MILLER: Yes, I have it. 6 7 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, Ms. Cook, I see Thanks for coming. 8 your message. Take care. 9 Ms. Cook's signing off. I got a message in the Okay, Ms. Miller, you can send a follow 10 up, but I will send one from this end also. 11 12 MS. MILLER: Okay. 13 MS. FLETCHER: Anything else I can say to further clarify what's happening here, Ms. 14 15 Miller? MS. MILLER: No, I think I'm all set. 16 17 Thank you. MS. FLETCHER: Okay, well thank you 18 for coming today. I will go ahead and conclude 19 this matter. If you think of anything else, just 20 send me an e-mail. 21 Thank you. 22 MS. MILLER: Okay, great. 23 MS. FLETCHER: (Simultaneous speaking.) Have a nice holiday. 24 25 MS. MILLER: Okay. Bye.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Bye-bye.
