4	Okay. The next case in our calendar is Case No.				
5	23-CIT-00421, Provost, License No. 108015. Mr.				
6	Orellana, can you please elevate the rights of				
7	the licensee in this case?				
8	MR. ORELLANA: Chris, your access has				
9	been elevated. That is all, Chairman.				
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Ms.				
11	Gilchrist, can you turn your camera on, please?				
12	MS. GILCHRIST: Hello.				
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have a				
14	camera you can turn on, ma'am?				
15	MR. SOUTHCOTT: Can the Board hear me?				
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, yes, sir.				
17	I can hear I can hear and see you now.				
18	MR. SOUTHCOTT: Unfortunately, my				
19	internet went out. Now it seems like I can't				
20	hear the Board.				
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you want to				
22	log back off and come I can hear and see you				
23	now.				
24	MR. SOUTHCOTT: Forgive me. I'm going				
25	to try logging off and logging back in. I'll				

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1 return in a second. 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sure. That's 3 fine. 4 (Pause.) 5 MR. SOUTHCOTT: Good morning. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning 6 7 aqain. Give me one minute, please. Good 8 morning, Mr. Southcott. Can you please identify 9 yourself for the record? MR. SOUTHCOTT: Good morning. My name 10 11 is Chris Southcott -- first name, C-H-R-I-S, last name, S-O-U-T-H-C-O-T-T -- from D.C.'s Office of 12 13 the Attorney General representing the government. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning. 15 Good morning, Ms. Gilchrist. Can you please 16 spell and state your name for the record? 17 MS. GILCHRIST: My name is Nina 18 Gilchrist, N-I-N-A, last name, Gilchrist, G-I-L-19 C-H-R-I-S-T. I'm an owner at Provost Organic 20 Restaurant. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, 2.2 ma'am. Mr. Southcott, are there any preliminary 23 matters in this case? MR. SOUTHCOTT: I do not believe so. 24 25 I believe the terms have been communicated, but

there has yet to be an agreement that has been				
reached, at least as far as I understand.				
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Any				
preliminary matters you want to raise before, not				
substantive, just any preliminary matters you				
6 want to raise, Ms. Gilchrist?				
MS. GILCHRIST: When he says terms and				
conditions, I'm just confused. It's just the				
fine, right, that I got for the citation or				
something else?				
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I think that's				
what he's stating, ma'am, that the government has				
sent the proposal to say to settle this matter.				
4 This is what would you agree to pay this? And				
if not, we're going to a hearing. That's what				
he's talking about.				
MS. GILCHRIST: Just the citation?				
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am.				
Okay. All right. I don't have any questions				
other than the initial question. I asked the				
investigator that came out and made the				
presentation of the citation and when I went to				
the office. I was just trying to find out within				
the code where does this define when you filed				
the report prior to coming to the restaurant. I				

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was just trying to get --

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(Simultaneous speaking.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I think the 3 bottom line, ma'am, is that this charge is you 4 5 failed to file your quarterly payment timely. And for the failure to file it timely, the 6 7 regulations has a specific fine that you have to 8 pay because it was not paid -- it was not filed 9 timely. And so that's that case. And so if you 10 agree, so you can either agree now to pay the 11 fine or we'll go to a hearing and you're going to 12 bring documents and witnesses to state that the 13 fine was paid timely. And that's basically where 14 we are. 15 (Simultaneous speaking.) 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry. I'm That the filing was timely filed. 17 sorry. That's 18 what I meant. I'm sorry, ma'am. 19 MS. GILCHRIST: So if you file three 20 days or five days after the due date, that's 21 considered not timely, correct? 2.2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ma'am, I don't 23 All I can -- the only thing I can respond know. 24 to, the statute says when it's due. And if it's 25 not provided the day that it's due, then it's

untimely.

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2 I can't tell you one day, two days, three days, four days. I don't know. Just I can 3 state that it's a guarterly statement that's due 4 -- from what I'm told, it's due a certain time 5 6 every quarter. 7 And if the office does not receive it 8 at the due date, then it's untimely. I don't 9 know what the Agency does. But all I'm saying is that this is what I'm told. 10 11 And if you're contesting that, we can go to the hearing. This matter is scheduled for 12 13 a show cause hearing on January 24th, 2024 at 14 10:30 a.m. And then you can bring documents and 15 witnesses to state that if you context the 16 citation that was provided to you to say that a 17 document was not timely filed. Okay? 18 MS. GILCHRIST: Okay. All right. 19 I'll go to the hearing. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So 21 this matter is scheduled for a hearing on January 2.2 24th, 2024 at 10:30 a.m. Seven days before the 23 hearing, you are required to disclose the 24 documents and witnesses you're going to rely upon 25 at the hearing. You need to provide a copy to

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1 the government and also provide a copy to the 2 Agency. Failure by either party to provide us 3 the disclosure seven days prior to the hearing 4 unless reasonable cause is shown, the Board is 5 empowered to prevent you from relying on 6 documents and witnesses that have not been 7 disclosed seven days prior to the hearing. Any 8 questions, ma'am? 9 MS. GILCHRIST: No. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. All 11 right. So we'll see you then on January 24th at 12 10:30 a.m. Have a great day. Thank you. And I 13 believe that concludes your day, Mr. Southcott. 14 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 11:45 a.m.) 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 2.2 23 24 25
