The Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board met via WebEx videoconference, LaVerne Fletcher, Board's Agent, presiding.

MS. FLETCHER: The next case on the calendar is King Convenience Store. This is Case Number 23-PRO-00097, Addis Incorporated, 1535 U Street Southeast, License Number ABRA 089932. This is a retailer Class B grocery license renewal. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet. Is anyone present on behalf of King's Convenience Store?

MR. MPRAS: Emanuel Mpras representing King's Convenience Store.

MS. FLETCHER: Good morning, Mr.
Mpras.
MR. MPRAS: Good morning, Ms.
Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: Spell your name for the record, please.

MR. MPRAS: E-M-A-N-U-E-L, last name M-P-R-A-S.

MS. FLETCHER: Is the applicant here, as well?

MR. MPRAS: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: If you will state your name and spell it for the record, please?

The applicant? If you would state your name and spell it for the record? Mr. Mpras, is that going to be Mr. Wourkneh?

MR. MPRAS: Yes. I see him here, but maybe he's having technical difficulties.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, that's fine. I will note that he's here. I see his initials. Is that S.W., Mr. Mpras?

MR. MPRAS: The initials are S.W. First name, I'll spell that. It's SAY -- S-E-Y-O-U-M-E, last name W-O-U-R-K-N-E-H.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. I see him. Maybe he is having technical difficulties, but I'm documenting the fact that he is present today. Is anyone present on behalf of Group 11?

MR. O'KEEFE: Yes. Good morning, Ms. Fletcher. My name is Patrick O'Keefe, spelled P-A-T-R-I-C-K, last name O'K-E-E-F-E. I'm the designated representative for this group and I'm joined by five other representatives.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Would those individuals please state their names and spell them for the record?

MS. JOHNSON: Yes. Traci Johnson.
And that's T-R-A-C-I, last name J-O-H-N-S-O-N.

Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MS. ROBERSON: Hi, this is Julia
Roberson. J-U-L-I-A R-O-B-E-R-S-O-N.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. SCHISCTEL: Andrew Schichtel, A-N-D-R-E-W. Last name is S-C-H-I-C-H-T-E-L.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. The next person?

MS. MCGEE: Emily McGee. E-M-I-L-Y M--C-G-E-E.

MS. FLETCHER: And the next person?
MR. MCGEE: Daniel McGee, D-A-N-I-E-L M-C-G-E-E.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. There are a total of six individuals present, which means that the group has standing as a protestant.

MR. MPRAS: Ms. Fletcher?
MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Mpras?
MR. MPRAS: I'd like to object to that and I'd like to state the reasons for my objection.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh okay.
MR. MPRAS: This protest was filed in violation of 231602.4.

MS. FLETCHER: Mm-hmm.
MR. MPRAS: Which specifically requires -- groups of five or more residents protesting must sign their protest. These protests were not signed by the residents. This protest was apparently prepared by one person, as each and every alleged signature on the protest was created by some type of forms automation tool.

They're not e-signatures, they're not actual signatures, it is not signed, and thus it must be dismissed. The only provision for each signature is for ANCs and the community register, community or civic associations. This does not qualify.

MR. O'KEEFE: Ms. Fletcher, this is Patrick O'Keefe.

MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry, go ahead, Mr. O'Keefe.

MR. O'KEEFE: This is Patrick O'Keefe, spelled P-A-T-R-I-C-K O'K-E-E-F-E. I have written confirmation from the ABCA general counsel that the format that the signatures were collected in was acceptable for this purpose, so if there's any question about that we would
request an opportunity for an update to the file. But I did confirm specifically that this type of documentation was appropriate and would be sufficient --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MR. MPRAS: Oh, this must be done prior to the protest filing date. You cannot amend a supplement, as you all know.

Now, also it doesn't matter if they gave some type of other permission, all this has to be done pursuant to Chapter 49 of the D.C. Code, also known as a Uniform Electronic Transfer Act, and the board is bound by that, and the board signs its orders according to that act. This protest is null and void because it was not properly executed prior to the protest filing date.

MS. FLETCHER: Just for the court reporter, that was Mr. Mpras speaking. M-P-R-AS. Mr. O'Keefe, Mr. Mpras as well, the board has been accepting these types of signatures, and so I'm going to accept them today. Mr. Mpras, you intend to file a motion to dismiss?

MR. MPRAS: Absolutely.
MS. FLETCHER: I will go ahead and
give you the dates, and of course if the board decides to dismiss the protest, then all these dates go away. But I will give them to you today as they have been scheduled.

The day for the status hearing is February 7, 2024 at 10:30 a.m. The day for the protest hearing is March 6, 2024 at 1:30 p.m. We need to set a date for mediation. I will give you the next available day. The next available day for mediation is Friday, January 5. That's the next available day.

MR. MPRAS: Well, Ms. Fletcher, could -- can you give us the week after? I'd like the board to have time to rule on the motion.

MS. FLETCHER: Yes. How about Tuesday, January 16 at 10:30 or 11:30?

MR. MPRAS: Either works for me, 10:30's fine.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. What about you, Mr. O'Keefe?

MR. O'KEEFE: Yes. Either works for me, thank you.

MS. FLETCHER: Then let's make it
10:30. Excuse me one second. King Convenience mediation is set for Tuesday, January 16 at

10:30. And Mr. O'Keefe?
MR. O'KEEFE: Yes, ma'am?
MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Mpras is going to be filing a motion to dismiss your protest. If the board approves that or not, you will be informed. You'll also have an opportunity to respond to Mr. Mpras's motion to dismiss.

MR. O'KEEFE: Okay, understood. Thank you, ma'am.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Unless there are any questions, this matter is concluded.

MR. MPRAS: Thank you, Ms. Fletcher. Have a good day.

MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome. Thank you.

MR. O'KEEFE: Thank you. Bye.
MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome.
