MS. FLETCHER: The next case on the calendar is Rosemarino D'Italia. This is case number 22-PRO-00138, 1714 C, LLC 1714 Connecticut Avenue, NW. License number ABRA 109613. This is a Retailer Class CT license renewal. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order and quiet, real property values, residential parking and vehicular and pedestrian safety.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher conducting the Roll Call Hearing as the Board's agent.

MS. YOHANNES: Yes, good morning. Sidon Yohannes here on behalf of the licensee and that is S-I-D-O-N Y-O-H-A-N-N-E-S.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms.
Yohannes. Is anyone present on behalf of the Dupont Circle Citizens' Association?

MS. VOLMAN: Yes, Susan Volman S-U-S-
A-N V-O-L-M-A-N. I hope you can hear me, I'm sick. (Laughter.)

MS. FLETCHER: I hear you. I'm a little under the weather myself, but I can hear
you. You're losing your voice a little?
MS. VOLMAN: Yeah, I have COVID.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank heaven for virtual hearings, right? $I$ hope you feel better soon, Ms. Volman.

MS. VOLMAN: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: The DCCA does have standing as a protestant. Is anyone here from ANC 2B?

MS. ROGGENSACK: Yes, Ms. Fletcher. Meg Roggensack M-E-G R-O-G-G-E-N-S-A-C-K.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. ANC 2B does have standing as a protestant. We have a group of 74. Is anyone present on behalf of the group?

MR. MELCHER: Good morning, Ms. Fletcher. My name is Douglas Melcher. I'm counsel for the group of five or more. My name is spelled D-O-U-G-L-A-S M-E-L-C-H-E-R. I have at least nine members of our group present today.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, if those members would state their names and spell them for the record, please.

MR. GUAGENTI: Nolan Guagenti N-O-L-AN G-U-A-G-E-N-T-I.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.

MR. GUAGENTI: Thank you.
MR. CONRAD: Kraig Conrad K-R-A-I-G C-O-N-R-A-D.

MS. FLETCHER: Conrad.
MR. PROHASKA: Kevin Prohaska K-E --
MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry, I missed that. Did you say Kevin? Okay, I got it.

MR. PROHASKA: Yeah my last name is Prohaska so Kevin is K-E-V-I-N Prohaska is P-R-O-H-A-S-K-A.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Next person.

MR. CARNEAL: Jeffrey Carneal
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. REGARD: Elizabeth, oh.
MR. JOHNSON: William Johnson. W-I-L-L-I-A-M J-O-H-N-S-O-N.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. The next person.

MS. REGARD: Elizabeth Regard E-L-I-Z-A-B-E-T-H R-E-G-A-R-D.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Next person.

MS. WAHL: Barbara Wahl B-A-R-B-A-R-A Wahl W-A-H-L.

MS. FLETCHER: W-A?
MS. WAHL: H-L.
MS. FLETCHER: H-L?
MS. WAHL: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, I see it now.
Thank you. And the next person.
MR. CARNEAL: Jeffrey Carneal J-E-F-F-
R-E-Y Carneal C-A-R-N like Nancy-E-A-L.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Carneal. Next person. Anyone else?

MR. MELCHER: This is Doug Melcher speaking. I believe we're waiting for Kevin Conrad.

MR. CONRAD: I think you may have completed as Kraig Conrad and Kevin Prohaska both present.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Mr. Conrad, would you spell your name for the court reporter, please?

MR. CONRAD: Certainly Kraig K-R-A-I-G Conrad C-O-N-R-A-D.

MS. FLETCHER: And did you name another person, who is also present?

MR. CONRAD: No, I was just explaining that the two names together sound like mine and

Kevin Prohaska together.
MS. FLETCHER: Oh.
MR. CONRAD: We both are here and accounted for.

MR. PROHASKA: And Kevin Prohaska is here. I previously gave my name and spelling.

MS. FLETCHER: Yes, I have it. Thank you.

MR. MELCHER: Sorry for the confusion.
MS. FLETCHER: No problem at all. I count eight individuals present, which means that your group of 74 is granted full standing as a protestant. We need to set a date for a status hearing, protest hearing and for mediation.

MS. YOHANNES: I'm sorry, Ms.
Fletcher. I just want to be clear. I count seven and maybe $I$ missed one, but $I$ think that there are seven that just (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. FLETCHER: Well let me recount what $I$ have here. So, I count, unless I wrote somebody's name twice, Mr. Conrad.

MR. CONRAD: Here.
MS. FLETCHER: I have you down here twice. Is your first name spelled with a K or a

C?
MR. CONRAD: First name is spelled with a K, K-R-A-I-G.

MS. FLETCHER: The total changes to seven, Ms. Yohannes, which means that the group is still granted full standing, but seven people are present instead of eight.

MS. YOHANNES: Thank you.
MR. MELCHER: Ms. Fletcher? This is Douglas Melcher. I just want to clarify during your introduction you indicated that the group is protesting on the grounds of the appropriateness standards. Their letter to the Board also indicated that they are protesting on the grounds that the licensee has failed to comply with the statutes and regulations applicable to alcoholic beverage licensees.

MS. FLETCHER: Yeah, that's not a basis upon which to file a protest, but that is taken into consideration. What $I$ have written down as the bases are peace, order and quiet, real property values, residential parking and vehicular and pedestrian safety. Mr. Melcher, what you just said, $I$ read that. What $I$ am stating are the bases that we actually cover, but
what you said is also taken into consideration, but we have that in the protest letter.

MR. MELCHER: Very good. Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome. The status hearing is scheduled for February 15, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. that's for the status hearing. The protest hearing is set for March 15 at 1:30.

I will give you the next available day for mediation. January 10 is available any time between 10:00 and 1:30 if that's good for everyone.

MS. YOHANNES: The Applicant's available after 12:00 p.m. on January 10th.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Volman, what about you?

MS. VOLMAN: Yeah, I should be available any time on January 10th.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Roggensack?
MS. ROGGENSACK: Yes, thank you, it looks clear right now.

MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Melcher?
MR. MELCHER: I'm also available if we can start at noon, which I believe the Applicant's counsel indicated is doable, that would be preferable.

MS. FLETCHER: We can start at noon. Let's see, is noon okay for you, Ms. Volman and Ms. Roggensack as well?

MS. VOLMAN: Yeah, it's fine with me.
MS. ROGGENSACK: Yes, thank you very much.

MS. FLETCHER: Mediation is set for Tuesday, January 10 at noon. Unless there are any questions, thank you for coming and I will see you then. Of course, I'll be sending out the Webex invitations for the mediation.

MR. MELCHER: Thank you, Ms. Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
MR. CARNEAL: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. The roll call hearing in this matter is concluded.
