MS. FLETCHER: The next case on the calendar is DC Food Market, Case Number 23-PRO00096, DC Market, Inc., 2200 16th Street Southeast, license number ABRA-106932. The is a Retailer Class B Grocery. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher, conducting the roll call hearing as the Board's agent. Is anyone present on behalf of DC Food Market?

MR. MPRAS: Emanuel Mpras, representing DC Food Market.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Mpras. Could you spell that for the record, please?

MR. MPRAS: E-M-A-N-U-E-L, last name is M-P-R-A-S.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Mpras. Is anyone else present from the establishment?

MR. MPRAS: No, ma'am. The Licensee is out of the country. I contacted him this morning, he's having technical issues.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So, I lost a little bit of what you said, Mr. Mpras. The

Licensee is not present today?
MR. MPRAS: No, the Licensee is out of the country --

MS. FLETCHER: He's out of the country? Okay.

MR. MPRAS: Contacted him this morning, he's having technical issues.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. We have a group of five or more, is anyone present on behalf of the group?

MR. O'KEEFE: Yes. Good morning, Ms. Fletcher. This is Patrick O'Keefe, spelled P-A-T-R-I-C-K, last name 0-K-E-E-F-E, representing the group of five. Thank you.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Mr. O'Keefe, are there any other individuals present from your group today?

MR. O'KEEFE: Yes. I am joined by four other residents and our Commissioner, representing the ANC.

MS. FLETCHER: Would each person state their name and spell it for the record, please?

MR. NGUYEN: Andrew Nguyen, A-N-D-R-EW, N-G-U-Y-E-N.

MS. FLETCHER: N-G-U?

MR. NGUYEN: N-G-U-Y-E-N.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MS. NGUYEN: Angela Nguyen, A-N-G-E-LA, N-G-U-Y-E-N.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. The next person?

MS. MCGEE: My name is Emily McGee, E-M-I-L-Y, M-C --

MS. FLETCHER: Excuse me. I'm sorry, one minute. You said E-what?

MS. MCGEE: Emily McGee, E-M-I-L-Y, M-C-G-E-E.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. And the next person?

MR. MCGEE: And this is Daniel McGee, D-A-N-I-E-L, M-C-G-E-E.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. And you each signed the protest letter?

MS. NGUYEN: Yes.
MR. NGUYEN: Yes.
MS. MCGEE: Yes, that's correct.
MS. FLETCHER: I'm just verifying signatures. One second, please. Okay, I verified your signatures.

There are a group of seven being
granted standing in this case. Mr. O'Keefe, there are other names on your protest letter, but there are no signatures for all --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MR. O'KEEFE: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So you're aware of that already, okay.

MR. O'KEEFE: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. So we have a group of seven that are being granted standing. There are at least five of you present today, which is required in order to be granted full standing.

MR. MPRAS: Ms. Fletcher, if I may?
MS. FLETCHER: Yes, Mr. Mpras?
MR. MPRAS: Rather than just -- we went through this last week. I'm just going to state that this is a mirror image protest of the King (phonetic) convenience store. And just for the record, I reserve the right to challenge the standing before the Board.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. And I'll just note for the record, the difference between this case and the one that you referred to, Mr. Mpras is that, in this case there are actually
signatures that were signed. In the previous case --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MR. MPRAS: Ms. Fletcher, I have a copy of the protest that's sent to me, and I don't have any -- the signatures are all automated, no actual signatures.

MS. FLETCHER: So, Mr. Mpras, I'll make sure this gets sent to you today. There are names on this list, Mr. Mpras where there are no signatures at all and there's some where there are.

MR. MPRAS: There is some where they are. The issue on the last one is the same as this one, they're not actual handwritten signatures. Nor are they electronic signatures, as required by the DC Code. That's all.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. The signatures appear to be handwritten, and they appear to be acceptable as electronic signatures, Mr. Mpras. But, I know that you're going to file your motion, I'm just noting that for the record

MR. MPRAS: Yeah. We'll need a copy of that plea, because I was never provided with a
copy. The only thing I have is a -- and I just want to make sure that that copy was submitted within the protest period.

MS. FLETCHER: I'll make sure you get that, I'm going to make a note of that right now. Just one second.

MR. MPRAS: Great.
MS. FLETCHER: So, Mr. O'Keefe?
MR. O'KEEFE: Yes, Ms. Fletcher?
MS. FLETCHER: If Mr. Mpras files a motion to dismiss your protest, you'll receive a copy of the motion and you will have an opportunity to respond.

MR. O'KEEFE: Understood. Thank you, Ms. Fletcher.

MS. FLETCHER: Very welcome. I'm going to give you the date for a status hearing, protest hearing, and a mediation. I'm going to give you the status hearing first, which is February 7, 2024 at 10:30 a.m. The protest hearing is scheduled for March 6, 2024 at 1:30 p.m.

I will give you the next available date for mediation, Mr. Mpras allowing time for you to file your motion. Let's see. What about

Wednesday, January 31st, for a mediation? But, let me say this first. Mr. Mpras, are you aware, at this point, of whether or not you have any hearings before the Board on the 31st? That is a Wednesday, would you prefer --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MR. MPRAS: -- Wednesday. I'm
checking my calendar and as of now I do not.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. We can do
Monday, January 29 at 1:30 in the afternoon.
MR. MPRAS: That's fine for me, if it's fine with everybody else.

MS. FLETCHER: Is that fine for you, Mr. O'Keefe?

MR. O'KEEFE: Yes, thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Welcome. I am
scheduling mediation for Monday, January 29 at 1:30 in the afternoon, and I'll send you the WebEx invitation to attend. Okay, any questions at all?

So unless the Board dismisses the protest as a result of Mr. Mpras's motion, then I will see you then.

MR. O'KEEFE: Thank you.
MR. MPRAS: Ms. Fletcher, when will I
be receiving a copy of the protest that you have?
MS. FLETCHER: I'm going to send it to you today.

MR. MPRAS: Great.
MS. FLETCHER: When I get back to my desk.

MR. MPRAS: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. Well thank you for coming this matter is concluded.
(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 10:39 a.m.)
