
ORDER

Therefore, on this 13th day of March 2019, the Board **APPROVES** the OIC presented by the parties. The terms of the OIC are as follows:


1. The license holder admits to the primary tier violation described by Charge I. The Respondent shall pay a \$1,500 fine within 60 days. The failure to pay the fine shall result in an immediate suspension of the license until all money owed is paid.
2. Charge II is dismissed.

The ABRA shall deliver copies of this Order to the Government and the Respondent.







Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, Reeves Center, 2000 14th Street, NW, 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202-879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
