ORDER ON COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT


The official records of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) reflect that Spirit Cruises, LLC (Licensee), and ANC 6D entered into a Cooperative Agreement (Agreement), dated May 13, 2019, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-446 (2001).

The Agreement has been reduced to writing and has been properly executed and filed with the Board. The Licensee and Commissioner Gail Fast and Dr. Coralie Farlee, on behalf of ANC 6D, are signatories to the Agreement.

Accordingly, it is this 15th day of May, 2019, **ORDERED** that:

1. The above-referenced Cooperative Agreement submitted by the parties to govern the operations of the Licensee's establishment is **APPROVED** and **INCORPORATED** as part of this Order;
2. This Cooperative Agreement replaces and supersedes previous Cooperative Agreements between the parties; and
3. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Licensee and ANC 6D.



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

This COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT replaces and supersedes the Cooperative Agreement between Potomac Riverboat Company, LLC (“”) made on the 11th day of September 2017 by and between Potomac Riverboat Company, LLC t/a Mathew Hayes (#1), Commander Jacques (#2), Miss Christin (#3), Potomac Taxi I (#4), Potomac Taxi II (#5), Potomac Taxi III (#6), and Potomac Taxi IV (#7) (“Licensee”) and Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6D (“ANC”), (collectively, the “Parties”). This agreement is for Class DX License #098753 to include the seven marine vessels listed above. Vessels #1, #2, and #3-dock at Alexandria, VA, 22314 and unload and load at the Diamond Teague Park, 100 Potomac Avenue, SE, Washington, DC 20003. Vessels #4, #5, #6, and #7 dock at the Wharf in SW Washington DC, 20024 and provide water taxi services with stops including: Alexandria, VA; The Wharf in SW DC; National Harbor in Maryland; and Georgetown waterfront in NW DC.

This COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT also replaces and supersedes Amendment #1 to the COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT referenced above made on March 11, 2019, and finalized by Board Order 2019-135 dated March 13, 2019. In Amendment #1, an 8th vessel (Lady Josephine, #089753-8) was added to the license. These vessels berth at The Wharf In Southwest DC and National Harbor, MD. and carry approximately 200 passengers with water taxi service between The Wharf in Southwest DC and Georgetown Waterfront with seasonal routes offering stops at Nationals Stadium and Audi Field for about 2,100 trips per year, with a duration of 30 to 45 minutes per trip.

This COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT is made on this 13th day of May 2019 by and between Spirit Cruises LLC, which is now the holder of the subject ABC license previously held by Potomac Riverboat Company, LLC ABRA # 098753 with the 8 vessels listed above.

W I T N E S E T H

WHEREAS, Licensee has License Class DX #098753 for eight (8) marine vessels (listed above) with offices located at 211 N. Union Street, #250, Alexandria, VA 22314. The three “ferry” vessels are: Mathew Hayes (#1), total

occupancy load of 149; Commander Jacques (#2), total occupancy load of 122; and Miss Christin (#3), total occupancy load of 173; and the following "taxi" vessels: Potomac Taxi I (#4), Potomac Taxi II (#5), Potomac Taxi III (#6), Potomac Taxi IV (#7), and Lady Josephine, Taxi V (#8). Each of the taxi vessels has a total occupancy load not to exceed 200 per vessel. These eight marine vessels are included in the Retailer's Class DX ABC license (#098753).

WHEREAS, the Parties have agreed to enter into this Agreement and request that the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board ("ABC Board") approve this revised Cooperative Agreement for Class DX ABC license (#098753) conditioned upon the Licensee's compliance with the terms of this written Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are desirous of entering into a Cooperative Agreement pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-446 for the operation and maintenance of the Licensee's business in such a manner as to minimize the effect on the peace, order and quiet of the neighborhood, and to eliminate the need for a Protest Hearing regarding the license renewal.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals set forth above and the mutual covenants and conditions set forth below, the Parties agree as follows:

1. **Recitals Incorporated.** The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein by reference.
2. **Nature of the Business.** The Licensee will manage and operate three marine "ferry" vessels (#1, #2, #3) which offer approximately a total of 200 ferry trips annually from Alexandria, Virginia to the Diamond Teague Park, 100 Potomac Avenue, SE, depending on the number of events occurring at Nationals Park or Audi Field. These vessels maintain Entertainment Endorsements. The usual duration of each trip is approximately ½ hour each way.

The Licensee will also manage and operate five additional "taxi" vessels (#4, #5, #6, #7, #8) which offer approximately 3,000 trips in total annually. The Licensee's additional five vessels will provide water taxi services with stops including: Alexandria, VA; The Wharf in SW DC; National Harbor in Maryland; and Georgetown waterfront in NW DC. Additional stops may be added in the future. The usual duration of each trip is between 25 and 40 minutes.

Alcohol service is available during each trip. No passenger is permitted to disembark with alcoholic beverages. Gambling is not allowed but game nights with no monetary prizes are allowed.

3. ***Hours of Operation.***

The Licensee's hours of operation and sales, service, and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall not exceed:

Sunday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m.

The hours of Entertainment for Boats #s 1, 2, and 3 shall not exceed:

Sunday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m.

4. ***Floors Utilized and Occupancy.*** The Licensee manages and operates eight marine vessels on its DX license: Mathew Hayes (#1), Commander Jacques (#2), Miss Christin (#3), Potomac Taxi I (#4), Potomac Taxi II (#5), Potomac Taxi III (#6), Potomac Taxi IV (#7), and Lady Josephine Taxi V (#8).

In total, the eight marine vessels' total occupancy will not exceed 1,450 (all seated) patrons.

5. ***Sidewalk Café/Summer Garden.*** There is no sidewalk café or summer garden; no food or alcohol service shall be available in the pre-boarding or waiting areas.
6. ***Noise and Privacy.*** Licensee will strictly comply with all D.C. statutes and regulations governing generation of noise. Music piped to any exterior area of the vessels shall be limited to ambient background levels. Music on the vessels may need to be reduced while in the Washington Channel to ensure these requirements are met.

Licensee shall endeavor to minimize operation of the vessels' engines while docked. However, the parties acknowledge that engines must be operated in order to power cooking on the vessels and that cooking often is undertaken prior to departure of cruises and upon return to dock (in preparation for the next cruise).

Licensee agrees further that at the end of each cruise after 9:00 p.m. it shall request passengers exit the vessels quietly in deference to neighborhood residents.

Licensee shall receive all deliveries of food, beverages, and supplies during hours between 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

7. ***Parking/Valet and Bus Arrangements.*** It is a principal concern of the ANC that the Licensee's operation of the Establishment does not create or exacerbate parking problems within the ANC boundaries. To resolve these problems, the licensee agrees to provide information to potential patrons, on a website or other means, that there is very limited parking available in the area and that public transportation by several means of transportation -- including Metrorail, Metrobus, and shuttles -- is very convenient.
8. ***Public Space and Trash.*** Licensee shall deposit or discard any litter, bottles, trash and other debris from the vessels only at the interior trash room designated by The Wharf management.
9. ***Compliance with Law: Emissions, Wakes.*** The Licensee shall comply with:
 - a. All requirements of District of Columbia statutes or regulations regarding emissions controls applicable to passenger-carrying marine vessels engaged in interstate commerce.
 - b. All United States Coast Guard regulations or requirements regarding generation or control of wakes in the Washington Channel.
10. ***Security Cooperation in Stemming Illegal Drugs and Public Drinking.*** The ANC is concerned that the nature of the business of the Licensee will not pose security and crime issues. Licensee agrees that it shall take all necessary steps to minimize such problems, including, without limitation, designating a sufficient number of employees to assure adequate security and to control unruly patrons, whether inside or in the immediate outside area; monitoring for and prohibiting sales or use of illegal drugs within or about any the licensed vessel, maintaining contact and cooperating with the Harbor Patrol and/or Metropolitan Police Department, ABRA, and other enforcement officials when known or suspected drug activities occur.

Licensee shall check IDs of patrons who appear to be under the age of 25.

Licensee shall maintain a log on the marine vessels to record any security incidents and include in the log: the nature of the incident, who was involved, and how it was resolved (e.g., cruise terminated, MPD/Harbor Patrol contacted). These logs shall be made available to representatives of the MPD or ABRA on request. Licensee shall to the full extent permissible by law discourage loitering near the marine vessels and docks. While the

ANC does not at this time envision any requirement for security officers at the time of the cruises, as indicated above, the Licensee shall ensure that there is no post-cruise activity continuing the docks and any persons who are congregating in that manner shall be asked to move along.

Licensee shall post signs at the exit of the marine vessels to inform patrons that no alcoholic beverages can be removed from the licensed vessels. Licensee shall ensure that no containers, cups, bottles/cans, etc. regardless of content, shall be permitted to exit the marine vessel with a patron, and shall ensure that no alcoholic beverages are carried out of the marine vessel so that they can be consumed on public space or in a vehicle.

11. ***License Ownership and Compliance with ABRA Regulations.*** Licensee promises that it shall abide by all Alcoholic Beverage Regulations Administration (ABRA) regulations regarding the ownership of the license and all other provisions applicable to liquor licensees, and agrees that the ANC shall have standing to ask the ABC Board to enforce any violations of the agreement.
12. ***Participation in the Community.*** Licensee agrees to seek to maintain open communication with the community for which the ANC acts.
13. ***Notice and Opportunity to Cure.*** In the event that any of the parties is in breach of this Agreement, it shall be entitled to reasonable notice and opportunity to cure, as a condition precedent to seeking enforcement of the Agreement. Unless the breach is of an emergency nature or is a repetition of a prior breach, reasonable notice and opportunity shall provide for a cure within 30 days of the date of such notice. If Licensee fails to cure within the 30-day period (or, with respect to a breach which reasonably requires more than 30-days to cure, fails to commence cure of such breach which reasonably requires more than 30 days to cure) failure shall constitute a cause for the ANC to file a complaint with the ABC Board pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-446(2) in order to enforce the provisions of the Agreement. Unless otherwise noted above, any notices required to be made under this Agreement shall be in writing and mailed via certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or hand-delivered, to the other parties to this Agreement at the following addresses. Notice shall be deemed given as of the time of receipt or refusal of receipt:




12. **Protest.** Upon execution of this Agreement by the Parties and its acceptance by the ABC Board, ANC6D shall not protest the renewal of the license.


