ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO DISMISS PROTEST

Liff's Market, LLC, t/a Liff's Market, (Applicant) filed a motion to dismiss the protest against its renewal application, which was filed by Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 8C. The Applicant argues that the basis of the dismissal is the failure of the protest to state in the protest letter valid grounds to maintain the protest. The Board notes that the ANC's protest letter did not state any appropriateness grounds listed in D.C. Official Code § 25-313(b), which includes such factors such as real property values, peace, order, and quiet, residential parking

needs, etc. Instead, it cites factors listed in D.C. Official Code § 25-314, which only apply when a new license or transfer application is under consideration. D.C. Code § 25-314(a).

Because the present application is for the renewal of the license, § 25-314 is not applicable or under consideration. Therefore, ANC 8C has failed to raise a valid objection to the application, which requires the dismissal of the protest.

ORDER

Therefore, on this 14th day of January 2021, the Board **GRANTS** the Applicant's motion to dismiss. The ABRA shall deliver copies of this Order to the Government and the Applicant.

Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thilty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Coult of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
