CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case on our calendar is Case No. 19-CMP-00050, BIN-1301, License No. 91682. This hearing has been continued to December 4, 2019, at 11:00 a.m. The Board will, therefore -- we will be in recess

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sir, you wanted to address the Board. What's your name?

MR. SMITH: I do, Robert C. Smith.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir.

What's the nature of --

until our 11:00 hearing.

MR. SMITH: My company is Nightclub Security Consultants. I've been back in D.C. for about 15 years. Last time I spoke with you, Mr. Chairman, was about a year ago, sir, I was here a couple of times the year before that. Our company was the first one back in D.C., back when the late Skip Coburn was around. He invited me back with the Restaurant Association. We offered to come out and show them kind of a dog and pony

what we did way back when. They liked it. Our first client was Marc Barnes, then Tony & Joe's. We've grown out here in the D.C. region, got 25 active clients.

We provide the host security training program, some of your applicants may have talked about training with our company. That's what we do. Tomorrow, we're here on the behest of the mayor to provide our active shooter training. We did it a month ago with about 200 people at Penn Social, down below, their basement.

It's a free training that we offer to the city. The Mayor's Office of Night Life and Culture, Mr. Townsend invited me back after he saw what we did down in Miami with similar training. Tomorrow, we're doing a shorter version, about 90 minutes.

I sent Ms. Jenkins an email, an invitation to all of you. There is no cost. The mayor's office is footing the bill. There wouldn't be any Board conflict. A board before you, maybe three boards before you, attended our training session when we held it at -- that was in Georgetown, I can't remember, some 10-15 years ago. Ms. Jenkins attended probably eight years

ago. I just wanted to introduce myself, let you know that we're here in town probably every two months. We keep abreast of the events that you put out on your calendar.

We watch if our clients are involved, and we reach out to them proactively to say look, if this is what you're going to do. You've seen me talking to a couple of the attorneys in the back, some of the licensees that walked out.

That's what my business is, to guide them in the right direction, not to offer one size fits all solutions, but solutions just for them. I wanted to offer my card to each of you, just so you can look at what we do, how we do it, and we're a resource.

I've offered my services many times to ABRA, through Fred and other people. I'm a former police officer. I retired after 20 years at San Diego PD eight years ago, running this company full time. Any time I'm dealing with an agency, regulatory agency, our training is no cost. You all are more than welcome to attend any of our sessions we have just to see what is being done nationally regarding the training of in-house guards. Finally, California was the

first state, nine years ago, to mandate this training. It's now law for any in-house guard to have a 16-hour training program, besides the background check, NCIC and FBI background check, and a registration with the state.

We have License No. 1 because I wrote the program. We helped Philadelphia. We're helping Miami. We helped the State of Texas write a similar program. It's not about, so much, business, because I can't handle that business, but about 8 percent of our business is greater good stuff.

anyone else on your Board to attend our training for free, so you can be abreast and a little bit more knowledgeable when it comes to -- when you have an investigator talking about an incident, you kind of know what the industry standards are regarding use of force, civil liability, use of handcuffs or not or IDs or confiscation. These are some unique laws that don't really get out there. With that, I'll end my hello, and I'd like to leave you cards, if I can.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Just a quick question. Where's the training tomorrow?

1	MR. SMITH: It's at Penn Social,
2	second level Penn Social, starts at 1:00. It's
3	only going to be about 90 minutes. The fire
4	department will speak, the police department will
5	speak. I think there's another group that will
6	speak.
7	I'll do about a 90-minute unique
8	training regarding the most common type of active
9	shooter within the bar world. D.C.'s had a few
10	of them within the bars and clubs, and that's
11	what we train on. We don't do a lot of long gun
12	elevated shooter stuff. I've been training since
13	1999, after Columbine, with active shooter
14	training.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,
16	thank you.
17	MR. SMITH: Thank you.
18	MEMBER SHORT: I'd say one question,
19	if I could, Mr. Chair.
20	MR. SMITH: Yes, sir.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr.
22	Short.
23	MR. SMITH: Thank you.
24	MEMBER SHORT: After the Las Vegas
25	debacle, we already know, here in Washington,

D.C., it's not if, it's when, is there any training or any offering to our hospitality community regarding that long gun shooting over there in Las Vegas?

MR. SMITH: No, sir.

MEMBER SHORT: Thank you. That's all I have.

MR. SMITH: If I can now add, there probably won't be any training like that. It's a very difficult item to train on. That type of incident that went on was planned for weeks, if not months. They still don't know the reason. The settlement just occurred last month with all the families and victims of that issue.

The MGM and their company is still going forward with a federal lawsuit because they want to get the definition of terrorism changed because that didn't fit the definition. The only reason it didn't fit is because they do not know his motivation. We talked about it. We train on those incidents. Tomorrow, we'll talk about ten minutes based on the nationals and the World Series, pre and post, pre in Houston and post here.
