At the status hearing on October the 3rd, the 1 2 Government asked that the notice be amended in this case to read that "You failed to comply with 3 the terms of a restaurant license in violation of 4 DC Code 25-113 and 23 DCMR 2100 and 2101." 5 I just wanted to make sure that that 6 is clear and that that has been changed. 7 8 You will hear from ABRA Okay. 9 Investigator Felicia Dantzler today who will testify that on Saturday, May 5, 2018, she 10 11 visited Betty's Gojo and despite the ABC License 12 showing that the establishment is a restaurant, 13 she did not see evidence that they were ready, 14 willing and able to serve food to patrons. She said this was based on several 15 16 factors: Whether she could determine if their 17 18 kitchen was open. 19 Whether they had a menu. Whether they had sufficient food on-20 21 hand to serve patrons from the menu. 22 And whether proper staff was present

Investigator Dantzler's observations

led her to conclude that they were not operating

as a restaurant and therefore in violation of the

to prepare and serve the food.

The Government will prove its case by a preponderance of the evidence. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Do you wish to make an opening statement or do you wish to make an opening statement when you present your case? It's your option. You don't have to do one now.

MR. EMBAYE: Yes, but the kitchen was working, but was very slow.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on. You are not arguing the case right now.

MR. EMBAYE: Um-hum.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: They way this works is that the Government, they do an opening statement. They basically tell me what the charge is and what they are going to prove. And they are going to put on. So you -- so right

option is that you can wait until the Government has brought their witnesses, then they present their case, then you can present your case and then you can argue what your position is and what is it you want us to do. And if you have a witness who you want to testify, then you will do that.

All right. Because the reason why I said that is because, I mean, you were arguing and I'm saying at this part -- and nothing is wrong with arguing, but at this juncture, it's not an argument. It's just you give me an overview of what the case is about.

Do you understand, sir?

MR. EMBAYE: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So basically what would happen now, the Government is going to call its witness. She is going to -I'm going to swear the witness in. She will testify. Once she is done asking questions to the witness, then you will have an opportunity to ask her questions based on the testimony that she gave.

Then the Board will ask her some questions. Then I will come back to you and if you have questions, you can ask her questions based on the questions that the Board asked. And then the Government will ask some final questions. The Government will call its witnesses and then they will wrap up. And then you will have an opportunity to present your case. Okay?

And based on me asking the question, then that's when he said he needs an interpreter. And so with that, I am more -- I would not feel comfortable moving forward with this hearing if he is actually a licensee on -- if he is one of the licensees. That's my position.

And so I need to find -- the Agency needs to tell me is he on the license as a licensee? And if he is on the license, a licensee, because we have been dealing with them and he is saying this case is more complicated and he has -- and I recognize the fact that there is a language issue.
