3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The
4	next case on our calendar is Case No., we have a
5	Show Cause Hearing, 18-CMP-00021, Betty's Gojo,
6	License No. 102500.
7	Will the parties, please, approach and
8	identify themselves for the record, please?
9	MS. GEPHARDT: Good morning, Board
10	Members. Chrissy Gephardt here on behalf of the
11	Office of the Attorney General for the District
12	of Columbia.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
14	Ms. Gephardt. Yes, sir, introduce yourself for
15	the record, please.
16	MR. EMBAYE: Good morning. My name is
17	Kiraeeb Embaye.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your last name,
19	sir?
20	MR. EMBAYE: Embaye.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I did not hear
22	you. Mister, I didn't hear your last name.

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1	MR. EMBAYE: Okay. My last name my
2	name is Kiraeeb Embaye.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mister?
4	MR. EMBAYE: Embaye.
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Embaye?
6	MR. EMBAYE: Yes.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
8	There is a sign-in sheet, please, sign-in your
9	name on the sign-in sheet, please.
10	Yes, ma'am, your name?
11	MS. WELDEGEBREIL: My name is Abeba
12	Weldegebreil.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well
14	MS. WELDEGEBREIL: Weldegebreil.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: all right.
16	There is a sign-in sheet, please, sign-in for the
17	record, please.
18	All right. This is a Show Cause
19	Hearing. Are there any preliminary matters in
20	this case?
21	MS. GEPHARDT: Yes, there are,
22	Chairman. So in this case, the parties are

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1	stipulating to the facts of this case. The
2	licensee is not arguing with the charges and the
3	validity of the charges and the facts underlying
4	the charges.
5	The licensee, however, would like to
6	argue or make an argument about the penalty in
7	this case.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So just give me
9	a proffer, because what is what are the
10	underlying facts in this case that
11	MS. GEPHARDT: Okay.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: are
13	undisputed?
14	MS. GEPHARDT: Well, the proffer is
15	that an ABRA Investigator excuse me I
16	apologize. The proffer is that an Investigator
17	from ABRA on November 17, 2017 conducted a
18	regulatory inspection at Betty's Gojo and spoke
19	to Kiraeeb Johanes Embaye, who stated that he was
20	a 25 percent owner of the establishment.
21	Essentially, they were asked for
22	invoices for the past three years. In summation,

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1	the invoices were not produced for the last three
2	years, only a few were produced. So it was not
3	adequate and, therefore, they received the
4	violation for failure to keep and maintain books
5	and records for a period of three years.
6	There was a second charge for
7	purchasing alcoholic beverages from an off-
8	premises retailer. And in that case, the
9	licensee purchased alcohol on a weekday from a
10	retailer called District Liquors in violation of
11	the statute 25-113(a)(5)(A).
12	Therefore, these are the facts that
13	the licensee has stipulated to and does not argue
14	with.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what is it
16	that the as for Charge 1, what is it that the
17	Government is asking the Board to do?
18	MS. GEPHARDT: The Government is
19	asking for a \$4,250 fine on Charge 1. Excuse me,
20	I meant to say \$2,250. And then for Charge 2,
21	the same amount \$2,250.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All

1	right. So who is going to argue this case on
2	behalf of the establishment? Mister, what's your
3	last name?
4	MR. EMBAYE: Mr. Embaye.
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Who?
6	MR. EMBAYE: Mr. Embaye.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Embaye.
8	The reason why I'm looking is there is a
9	different name here, so that
10	MR. EMBAYE: Yeah, that is the old
11	owner right there.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So why is it
13	that so how long have you owned this
14	establishment? How long have you owned this
15	establishment?
16	MR. EMBAYE: Almost 9 months.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: How many?
18	MR. EMBAYE: 9 months.
19	MS. WELDEGEBREIL: 9 months.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 9 Months.
21	MR. EMBAYE: Yes.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you have

1	owned this establishment 9 months.
2	MR. EMBAYE: Even the invoices 2016.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
4	MR. EMBAYE: So we didn't know that
5	when the Investigator was came at that time, I
6	was new at the business, almost a week or two, I
7	don't know exactly he was asking me and I show
8	him. I don't know even how to operate the
9	business, at that time. I was new.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You are I
11	mean, you are telling me your position. Okay?
12	I'm not questioning you.
13	MR. EMBAYE: Yeah.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you are
15	saying to me the you were charged with not
16	having invoices for three years.
17	MR. EMBAYE: Right.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Government
19	is saying that we should impose a fine of \$2,250.
20	So your job is to convince the Board why is it
21	that and you have agreed that you did not have
22	it.

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1	MR. EMBAYE: Yes.
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So just you are
3	trying to convince us why is it that we shouldn't
4	fine you this amount of money. So that's all I'm
5	so it's your chance to convince the Board why
6	is it that we shouldn't fine you.
7	So you are saying that you were new,
8	so why did you not so why didn't the other
9	owner not provide, give you the invoices?
10	MR. EMBAYE: Because she didn't tell
11	us.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry,
13	what?
14	MR. EMBAYE: Because, at that time,
15	she didn't tell me what is going on the business.
16	As I say, I was new. And when the Investigators
17	came, he asked me
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
19	MR. EMBAYE: and I show him all the
20	papers.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
22	MR. EMBAYE: Even after one month,

after that she left the lady. 1 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. MR. EMBAYE: Or the owner varied. 3 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 5 MR. EMBAYE: So the fine is came now, so we can not afford -- I cannot afford. 6 After that I have everything, but now I don't know what 7 8 I can do. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, what about the second charge about -- the second charge 10 regarding your purchasing alcoholic from an off-11 12 premise retailer, the second charge? 13 So who did that? Who was responsible 14 for that one? MR. EMBAYE: The old owner. 15 Because 16 that, the invoice is 2016. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry? 18 MR. EMBAYE: The invoice is retained, 19 that one in 2016. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. 21 MR. EMBAYE: Yeah, so I'm not 22 responsible for that one.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, let me
2	ask you a question. Did you come down to the ABC
3	Board and we and the license was transferred
4	to you?
5	MR. EMBAYE: No, it was transferred.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, you
7	said what?
8	MR. EMBAYE: I didn't come. The
9	lawyer knew it was finish.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So who was the
11	lawyer? I mean, how did how do you own the
12	business?
13	MR. EMBAYE: Well
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Did the ABC,
15	did we grant you a license?
16	MR. EMBAYE: Yes.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: When did we,
18	the ABC Board, grant you a license?
19	MR. EMBAYE: February 2018.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: February when?
21	MR. EMBAYE: 2018.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So February in

1 2018 you came down to the ABC Board and the ABC 2 Board granted you a license to say that you are now the new owner of this establishment? 3 4 MR. EMBAYE: Yes. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Give us your name again, sir. 6 7 MR. EMBAYE: My name is Kiraeeb Embaye. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. 9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Kiraeeb Embaye. 10 Okay. So why are --11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So hold on. 12 Mr. Alberti. 13 MEMBER ALBERTI: So I'm sorry. So our 14 records show that there was a stock transfer to 15 you and to --16 MR. EMBAYE: Abeba. 17 MS. WELDEGEBREIL: Abeba. 18 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- Abeba, yes. It's 19 a long last name. I'm not going to try it. 20 Thank you. 21 MR. EMBAYE: Abeba. 22 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. So now I

1	understand what you are saying. It was a stock
2	transfer, but not a new license. Not a transfer
3	of the license, but a stock transfer. Okay. I
4	understand that.
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So
6	MEMBER ALBERTI: So you
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: go ahead,
8	Mr. Alberti.
9	MEMBER ALBERTI: I will just say that
10	in my eyes, that makes you responsible for you
11	should have maybe you didn't understand it
12	when the stock transfer happened, but you are
13	responsible for everything that preceded the
14	stock transfer to you.
15	Had you transferred the license to
16	you, things might have been different. But I
17	mean if there was a transfer to a new owner, but
18	the stock transfer to you makes you responsible
19	for everything that preceded your involvement.
20	MR. EMBAYE: Which is very unfair, we
21	didn't know that.
22	MEMBER ALBERTI: I'll just say if I

1	was you, I would be not pleased with my lawyer	
2	for not telling me that. I'll just leave it at	
3	that. I mean, I understand where you what you	
4	are saying, but anyways, I'll leave it at that.	
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So	
6	what is it that so what is it that you are	
7	asking the Board to do today then? What is it	
8	you want us to do?	
9	MR. EMBAYE: So let me ask here, let	
10	me do a rescheduled case.	
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, you	
12	said what?	
13	MR. EMBAYE: Let me if you don't	
14	mind, let me reschedule the case and we	
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You can't	
16	reschedule, sir. This is	
17	MR. EMBAYE: we ask him	
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: actually the	
19	hearing. I mean, this is the hearing that we	
20	have today, so it can't be rescheduled. We have	
21	to move forward, unless the Government the	
22	Government has already stipulated, so you can't	

reschedule today. I guess the long and short of it is that there is a violation and so because of -- I need -- I don't quite understand the ownership status, because I've not looked at the paperwork.

So from what we are saying is that 6 7 there is a stock transfer, so I need to figure 8 out -- I mean, we will discuss that, exactly what 9 that means, but so we have to move forward. So the long and short of it is that you are saying 10 11 that you are new in this business and so the 12 violations that occurred, id did not occur once 13 you took over, once this stock was transferred to 14 That's basically what you are saying. you. Is 15 that correct? 16 MR. EMBAYE: Um-hum. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right? 18 MR. EMBAYE: Um-hum. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 20 Anything that you want to say? Any questions? 21 Are there any questions that any Board Members want to make, want to ask any additional 22

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questions? 1 2 Do you -- any closing statements that you want to make, Ms. Gephardt? 3 4 MS. GEPHARDT: No, no closing 5 statements. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any closing, 6 7 anything final you want to say? 8 MR. EMBAYE: No. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No? Do the parties wish to make -- wish to file proposed 10 11 findings of law -- well, that's irrelevant 12 because both parties have agreed that -- all 13 right. The Board will issue a decision within 14 15 90 davs. Hold on. 16 As Chairperson of the Alcoholic 17 Beverage Control Board for the District of 18 Columbia and in accordance with DC Official Code 19 Section 2-574(b) of the Open Meetings Act, I move that the ABC Board hold a closed meeting for the 20 21 purpose of seeking legal advice from our counsel 22 on Case No. 18-CMP-00021, Betty's Gojo, pursuant

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1 to DC Official Code Section 2-574(b)(4) of the 2 Open Meetings Act and deliberating upon Case No. 18-CMP-00021, Betty's Gojo, for the reasons cited 3 in DC Official Code Section 2-574(b)(13) of the 4 5 Open Meetings Act. Is there a second? 6 7 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Second. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Silverstein 9 has seconded the motion. I will now take a roll call vote on the motion before us now that it has 10 11 been seconded. 12 Mr. Silverstein? 13 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I agree. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Alberti? 15 MEMBER ALBERTI: I agree. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato? 16 17 MEMBER CATO: I agree. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Isaac? 19 MEMBER ISAAC: I agree. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson? 21 I agree. 22 As it appears that the motion has

1	passed, I hereby give notice that the ABC Board	
2	will recess these proceedings to hold a closed	
3	meeting in the ABC Board conference room pursuant	
4	to Section 2-574(b) of the Open Meetings Act.	
5	We will issue a decision within 90	
6	days. We will consider in our discussion, I	
7	will look at this stock transfer to see what that	
8	means and we will make a decision.	
9	I am sympathetic to your cause, I'll	
10	just say that, but I don't know from a legal	
11	perspective, me being the Board being	
12	sympathetic what our what we can or can't do.	
13	But one of the things that I will ask	
14	that you do, sir, since you are saying you are a	
15	new owner, I would hope that there is a books and	
16	records training. I think it is scheduled for	
17	this week here at the Agency. So if you have not	
18	been to any books and records training, I would	
19	ask that you do that, so you will know the	
20	responsibilities that you have as an owner and	
21	what you need to do.	
22	So if you have not had any training,	

I know that -- I believe on the 21st or either 1 2 the 21st or the 22nd, I think tomorrow. I think on the 21st I think there is a books and records 3 4 training that the Agency offers, so you will know 5 as an owner of an establishment what documents you need to keep, how long you need to keep it 6 and so I would ask that you make -- you do that. 7 8 But we will -- I heard what you said. 9 The Board heard what you said and we will make a decision based on the representation that was 10 11 made today. Okay. Thank you. 12 MR. EMBAYE: Thank you. 13 MS. WELDEGEBREIL: Thank you. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yeah, the training is tomorrow. 15 16 MR. EMBAYE: Tomorrow what time? 17 MS. WELDEGEBREIL: Okay. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Just check at the front desk before you leave. 19 20 MR. EMBAYE: Okay. Okay. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But the --22 yeah, check at the front desk. The training on

1 this particular -- what you were cited for, we 2 have one tomorrow morning. MR. EMBAYE: 3 Okay. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So I would just 5 ask at the front desk. Have -- ask them for a 6 flyer and if you are available to come, you come. 7 If you can't because tomorrow if you are not 8 available, ask them when the next one is 9 scheduled for or you could ask for -- you could ask to sit with someone for them to talk to you 10 11 to let you know what is it that you need to do 12 and your responsibility. Okay? 13 MR. EMBAYE: Okay. Thank you. 14 MS. WELDEGEBREIL: All right. Thank 15 you. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank 17 you. Thank you. 18 MS. GEPHARDT: Thank you. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board then 20 is in recess until our 11:00 hearing. Thank you. 21 (Whereupon, the Status Hearing was 22 concluded at 10:39 a.m.)
