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The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street N.W., Washington, D.C., Ms. LaVerne Fletcher, Agent, presiding.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Excuse me, we are ready to begin. Would the parties in the matter of Bluefin Sushi To Go, please, come forward? This is Case No. 18-PRO-00008, Bluefin Sushi To Go, LLC t/a Bluefin Sushi To Go, 3073 Canal Street, N.W., License No. ABRA-108308.

Excuse me, the court reporter can only hear one person speaking at a time.

This is a Retailer Class CR License application, request to transfer license to a new location.

The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order and quiet; residential parking and vehicular and pedestrian safety; and real property values.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher. I'm conducting the Roll Call Hearing as the Board's Agent.

> Is there anyone present on behalf of

ANC - 2E?

MS. PALMER: Yes, good morning. Lisa Palmer.

AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Palmer, would you spell your name for the record, please?

MS. PALMER: Sure. L-I-S-A last name is Palmer, $P-A-L-M-E-R$.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. And there is also a Group of Five. Is Arlette Coppock present?

MS. PALMER: You just say present.
MS. COPPOCK: I'm just --
MS. PALMER: Just say present.
MS. COPPOCK: Present?
MS. PALMER: Say I'm present.
MS. COPPOCK: Present.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Would you, please, state your name and spell it for the record? If you could just state your name and spell it for the record?

MS. COPPOCK: Okay. Arlette CahenCoppock.

MS. PALMER: Could you spell it?

MS. COPPOCK: Cahen, C as in Charlie, A as in apple, $H$ as in hotel, $E$ as in echo, $N$ as in north pole dash Coppock, $C$ as in Charlie, 0 as in Oscar, two times $P$ as in papa, 0 as in Oscar, C as in Charlie, $K$ as in kilo.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
MS. COPPOCK: It's Arlette not
Arnette. It's Arlette, $A$ as in apple, $R$ as in romeo, L as in lima, E as in echo, two times $T$ as in tango, E as in echo.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much. And you are representing a Group of Seven. Is there anyone else present from your group today?

MS. COPPOCK: Present. Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Hi. If you would just state your name and spell it for the record, please?

MS. SAGALYN: Louise.
AGENT FLETCHER: And you can stand right behind Ms. --

MS. PALMER: You are a different group.

MS. COPPOCK: You are not in my group.
MS. SAGALYN: Oh, I'm sorry.
AGENT FLETCHER: That's okay. Hi. Your name, sir?

MR. GALDO: Hi. I am Carlos Ramos Galdo.

AGENT FLETCHER: The microphone is --
MR. GALDO: There is a microphone?
MS. PALMER: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: If you could state your name and spell it one more time?

MR. GALDO: Yes. My name is Carlos Ramos Galdo. C-A-R-L-O-S R-A-M-O-S G-A-L-D-O.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. That's good. Thank you very much.

MR. MINITE: Hi. My name is Al
Minite. That's A-L and then M-I-N-I-T-E.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. MINITE: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Anyone else with Ms.
Coppock's group?
MS. NEWMAN: My name is Judy Newman,

N-E-W-M-A-N.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. MOULTON: Good morning.
AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning.
MR. MOULTON: I'm Elliott J. Moulton, M-O-U-L-T-O-N at 1061 Thomas Jefferson Street.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. MOULTON: Thank you very much.
AGENT FLETCHER: And, Elliott, your
first name is E-L-L-I-O-T?
MR. MOULTON: Two Ts.
AGENT FLETCHER: Two Ts.
MR. MOULTON: We can leave one off if you want.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. MOULTON: Okay?
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Anyone else with Ms. Coppock? Okay. Well, then, Ms. Coppock, if you would just remain seated at the table, Ms. Coppock? Just Ms. Coppock as the designated representative.

MS. COPPOCK: Okay. Oh, it's my first
time.
AGENT FLETCHER: Anyone else with Ms. Coppock?

MS. COPPOCK: Yes. No, no, no. I have -- I am looking. I don't --

MS. PALMER: Nobody else.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. That's fine.
MS. PALMER: That's five then, right?
AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Coppock, it's
fine.
MS. PALMER: Anybody else is present?
MS. COPPOCK: No.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. That's good. Thank you very much.

MS. COPPOCK: Thank you. I'm done?
MS. PALMER: No, you stay.
AGENT FLETCHER: And -- no, you can just stay right there. And is Robert Uhar present? Hi, Mr. Uhar, would you, please, state your name for the record, please?

MR. UHAR: Yes. Good morning. First name is Roger, R-0-G-E-R, and last name is Uhar,

U-H-A-R.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much. And, Mr. Uhar, you will need a chair at the table.

MR. UHAR: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: And is Louise Sagalyn present?

MS. SAGALYN: My name is Louise
Sagalyn, S-A-G-A-L-Y-N.
AGENT FLETCHER: And, Ms. Sagalyn, you
will need a seat at the table as well. Anyone else that hasn't signed in on the Protestant side? Did someone say $I$ can't hear? Who can't hear? Okay. Is this better?

MS. SAGALYN: Yeah.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
MS. SAGALYN: Sorry.
AGENT FLETCHER: No problem at all. And let's see, so who is present on behalf of the Applicant?

MS. YOHANNES: Sidon Yohannes on behalf of the Applicant. S-I-D-O-N Y-O-H-A-N-N-

E-S.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms.
Yohannes. And may $I$ get your name again, please? Your name, yes, ma'am.

MS. SAGALYN: What?
MS. YOHANNES: Say your name right into the microphone.

MS. SAGALYN: Louise Sagalyn.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
So, Ms. Sagalyn, so you can hear me standing?
You can hear me? Can you hear me okay?
MS. SAGALYN: Not really, but I'm
trying.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Well, we are almost done.

MS. SAGALYN: Yeah, okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: ANC-2E has standing as a Protestant. Mr. Uhar, you filed as an abutting property owner and your address is 3075 Canal? Your address is 7 -- 3075?

MR. UHAR: That's correct.
AGENT FLETCHER: The address of

Bluefin Sushi To Go is 3073. So based on your address, the properties appear to abut. The Government's Geographic Information System is down this morning, so $I$ couldn't confirm what I'm saying right now, but based on your address, it appears that your properties touch.

MR. UHAR: That's correct.
AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Yohannes, do you have any knowledge of it?

MS. YOHANNES: I believe that's correct for 3073.

AGENT FLETCHER: I'll confirm it once the system is up, but $I$ just wanted to state that for the record. So I am granting standing to you as a Protestant.

Ms. Sagalyn, you filed a protest as an abutting property owner also.

MS. SAGALYN: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Your address is 3071.
MS. SAGALYN: That's correct.
AGENT FLETCHER: So I can't tell from your address if your properties actually abut,
but do they touch?
MS. SAGALYN: Yes, they do touch.
AGENT FLETCHER: They do touch.
MS. SAGALYN: We share a wall.
AGENT FLETCHER: You share a wall.
MS. YOHANNES: I have no knowledge as to that.

AGENT FLETCHER: I'm going to grant you standing today as a Protestant. I'll verify your locations once the Geographic Information System is up.

MS. SAGALYN: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: If that turns out not to be the case, I'll get back to you.

MS. SAGALYN: Fine.
AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Sagalyn, I'm going to sit now, because that's all 1 have to say to you today, but you can stay right there.

MS. SAGALYN: Yes, ma'am. What?
MS. PALMER: Just stay where you are. You're fine.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah. Ms. Coppock,
am I pronouncing that correctly?
MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: In your case, you
have -- you are representing a Group of Seven people. Your Protest Letter says -- states that only you are filing the protest, but was the intention of the other people here with you today to also file a protest?

MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: You are present. You can say yes if you intended to file a protest.

MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: I mean the individuals present with you today. Mr. Galdo, Mr. Moulton, Ms. Newman and Mr. Minite, did you intend to file a protest as well?

MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: No, you need to tell
me.
MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
MS. PALMER: She is asking them.
AGENT FLETCHER: The people whose
names I just called.
MS. COPPOCK: Sorry?
MS. PALMER: She is asking if the other people intended to file a protest, not you. She knows you filed a protest.

MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
MS. PALMER: The question was about everybody else.

MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So, Mr. Galdo, you intended to file a protest?

MR. GALDO: Yeah, yeah, I did.
AGENT FLETCHER: And, Mr. Moulton, you intended to file a protest?

MR. MOULTON: Yes, I did, yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Did you intend to file a protest?

MR. MOULTON: Yes, I did.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
Ms. Newman, did you intend to file a protest?
MS. NEWMAN: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: And what about -- so

I know, Ms. Coppock, you intended to file a protest, because you filed one. I'm only raising this issue, because throughout your Protest Letter, every -- all the pronouns were, it was I, me, me, me. There was no reference to the other individuals except at the end you said I'm representing them.

MS. COPPOCK: Oh, okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: And so I needed to make sure since they are here --

MS. COPPOCK: Oh.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- that they can
attest to the fact that they intended to file a protest.

MS. COPPOCK: I understand.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So I will --
MS. COPPOCK: I'm sorry about that.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- accept that.
MS. COPPOCK: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
MS. COPPOCK: I appreciate it.
AGENT FLETCHER: You're welcome.

There are five individuals present from your group today, Ms. Coppock, which means that your group is granted standing as a Protestant.

MS. COPPOCK: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: There are four protestants in this matter: ANC-2E; the Group of Seven represented by Ms. Coppock; Roger --

MS. YOhANNES: Ms. Fletcher, just for the record --

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes?
MS. YOHANNES: -- I want to state my objection to the Group of Five or more. Only one Protest Letter was filed, like you said.

AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.
MS. YOHANNES: It said I. There were signatures on the end, but for the record, I'm going to state my objection. I think that the Group of Five or more should be dismissed.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. And so, Ms. Yohannes, are you going to be motioning the Board to dismiss that group?

MS. YOHANNES: I may.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. And so, Ms. Coppock, the Applicant is opposed to your group being granted standing for the reasons that I just stated, that in your Protest Letter, you only indicate that you are filing a protest. There is no indication in your Protest Letter that anyone but you is filing a protest.

And then you have the signatures of seven people, but there was no place in the Protest Letter that said that they are filing a protest, that's the reason that I -- since some of them were present, that is the reason that $I$ asked if they intended to file a protest.

MS. COPPOCK: Yeah, they did.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, that -- so I'm just explaining, that's all. And Ms. Yohannes, she may be opposed to that as well and if she is, then she will file a motion with the ABC Board to dismiss your group. If she does that, you will be informed.

MS. PALMER: It's a procedural issue.
MS. SAGALYN: It's procedure that they
put their names down.
MS. PALMER: The letter wasn't -- can
I explain?
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. PALMER: I think the issue is that the letter wasn't written in the way --

MS. COPPOCK: Properly?
MS. PALMER: -- yeah, that they typically see. So the question is whether or not the Board and the establishment will protest --

MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
MS. PALMER: -- your standing as a Group of Five or more because the letter wasn't written in the way that ABRA likes to see the letter written.

MS. COPPOCK: Um-hum.
MS. PALMER: She will -- they will let you know.

MS. COPPOCK: Okay. Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: And the reason that your group can be granted standing today is because the individuals, at least some of the
individuals, were present today themselves. Otherwise, I could not have done it, because I would not know --

MS. COPPOCK: I understand.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- if they intended to file a protest. And so that's the reason --

MS. COPPOCK: Yes. Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- that the group was granted standing today.

And, Mr. Uhar and Ms. Sagalyn, you are granted standing as an abutting property owner. Once the D.C. Geographic Information System is up, I can look and see where you live and if it turns out that your properties are not abutting, then I will contact you and let you know.

MS. SAGALYN: It does.
AGENT FLETCHER: We need to set a date for a mediation, a Status Hearing and a Protest Hearing. The day for the Status Hearing is March the 21st. March --

MS. PALMER: Can I just confirm that the -- for the Status Hearing, could you just
share, since we have some new people, who needs to be present --

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. PALMER: -- at the Status Hearing?
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, thank you. Ms.
Coppock, you are the only person that will need to be present for the Status Hearing, because at least five of you were present today.

MS. COPPOCK: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: So your group was granted full standing, which means that only you need to appear at the Status Hearing.

We are going to set a date for mediation. Only you need to appear for the mediation, but if any of the other individuals would like to attend, they can, but we accept you as the designated representative.

MS. PALMER: For the Group of Five.
AGENT FLETCHER: For the Group of Five or more.

MS. COPPOCK: Thank you. I appreciate it.

AGENT FLETCHER: But at the Status Hearing, no one else needs to come to the Status Hearing.

MS. COPPOCK: Good. Thank you so much.

AGENT FLETCHER: You're welcome. And of course, Mr. Uhar and Ms. Sagalyn, you will need to appear for the Status Hearing, because you are representing yourselves.

MS. SAGALYN: Ourselves.

AGENT FLETCHER: If you needed to not come or for some reason you couldn't come, because you are here today, you could designate someone else to come --

MS. SAGALYN: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- for the Status
Hearing.
MS. PALMER: And how do you designate that person, just so everybody knows?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. You designate that person in writing. You just give them a statement saying $I$ designate Ms. Shook to
represent me during the Status Hearing.
MS. SAGALYN: Bring a letter?
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, you would give it to the person you designated.

MS. SAGALYN: All right.
AGENT FLETCHER:
MS. PALMER: So the Status Hearing is March 21st?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, the Status Hearing is March the 21st at 9:30.

MS. SAGALYN: March 21st? That's tomorrow.

MS. PALMER: No, that's --
MS. SAGALYN: Oh, March.
MS. PALMER: You've got a month.
MS. SAGALYN: Okay. I'm out of it.
AGENT FLETCHER: The Status Hearing is March 21st at 9:30 a.m.

The Protest Hearing is April the 25th at 1:30 p.m.

We need to set a date for mediation. I'll give you the next available day. The next
available day for mediation is Thursday, March the 1st, that's Thursday, March the 1st at 9:00, 10:00, 10:30, 11:00 or 11:30.

MS. YOHANNES: I can do 11:00 on that day.

AGENT FLETCHER: Would that work for you, Ms. Palmer?

MS. PALMER: You can't do it any earlier?

MS. YOHANNES: 10:30?
MS. PALMER: How does that work for everybody else?

MS. SAGALYN: That's fine.
MS. PALMER: 10:30?
AGENT FLETCHER: At what time?
MS. PALMER: 10:30.
AGENT FLETCHER: 10:30. Is that good for you, Ms. Yohannes?

MS. YOHANNES: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So mediation is set for 10:30 on March the 1st.

MS. PALMER: And could you also, just
for all the new folks, share --
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. PALMER: -- who should be present
on March 1st at 10:30?
MS. SAGALYN: You have to give that to them.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. PALMER: Or who needs to be present, at least.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. For the mediation on Thursday, March the 1st, that's the date of the mediation. The -- Mr. Uhar and Ms. Sagalyn, you need to be present for the mediation. Ms. Coppock?

MS. COPPOCK: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: You need to be present for the mediation on March the 1st at 10:30.

MS. COPPOCK: Yes, I will be there.
MS. SAGALYN: And Roger.
AGENT FLETCHER: And Roger. And Ms.
Palmer, well, she will be here.

Did I cover everybody? I think that's everyone, yes. Did everybody on this side put their contact information on that sign-in sheet on the table? There was a sign-in sheet. Is it still there? Ms. Sagalyn, did you put your contact information on that sheet?

MS. SAGALYN: Yes, yeah.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. And I actually want to apologize for disrupting you today with the gavel. I have never used it, but I needed to get your attention, because we needed to get started. It was very loud, but we got started.

MS. YOHANNES: Can I state briefly, I just want to say, to be clear, if the parties discuss the issues and come to an agreement before the mediation, then you can submit that agreement and don't have to come to mediation.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. YOHANNES: I just wanted to make sure that all, everyone here --

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. YOHANNES: -- understands that.

AGENT FLETCHER: That is correct. If the parties are able to resolve their concerns with the applicant, with Ms. Yohannes and the applicant, prior to the mediation, you would not need to appear for that, because sometimes that happens. The mediation is there in the event that it's necessary.

MS. YOHANNES: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Sagalyn, did you get that part?

MS. SAGALYN: Yeah.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Okay. Any other questions? Okay. Well, thank you for coming. The Roll Call Hearing is concluded.

MS. YOHANNES: Thank you.
MS. PALMER: Thank you.
(Whereupon, the Roll Call Hearing was concluded at 10:26 a.m.)
