The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
4	We're back on the record. We now move to Case
5	No. 18-CC-00008, Booeymonger Restaurant, License
6	No. 102904.
7	Will the parties, please, approach and
8	identify themselves for the record, please?
9	MS. GUNZEL: Good morning. I'm
10	Jessica Gunzel, Assistant Attorney General, for
11	the District of Columbia with my co-counsel,
12	Walter Adams.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
14	Ms. Gonzales and good morning, Mr. Adams.
15	MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Ravindra Abeynayake
16	representing Booeymonger.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Abeynayake?
18	MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Abeynayake.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Abeynayake?
20	MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Yes. I can spell it.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead.
22	MR. ABEYNAYAKE: A-B-E-Y-N-A-Y-A-K-E.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
2	sir. There is a sign-in sheet, please, sign-in
3	your name on the sheet there. Yes, sir?
4	MR. FERNANDO: My name is Bimbila
5	Fernando. I'm representing Booeymonger.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. So there
7	is a sign-in sheet. Also, please sign-in.
8	MR. FERNANDO: Okay.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Gun?
10	MS. GUNZEL: Gunzel, G-U-N-Z-E-L.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Gunzel. I
12	apologize. Are there any preliminary matters in
13	this case?
14	MS. GUNZEL: Yes. The parties have an
15	Offer in Compromise to present to the Board
16	today.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is
18	that?
19	MS. GUNZEL: For Charge 1 or my
20	apologies. The parties agreed that the
21	establishment will pay a fine of \$2,000 within 60
22	days. And if the fine isn't paid within 60 days,

1 then the license will be suspended until the fine 2 is paid. The parties have also agreed that 3 4 there will be a 5 day suspension with 1 day 5 served and 4 days stayed for the period of one 6 year. 7 And at this time, the parties are 8 suggesting that the 1 days served would be 9 Monday, July 30, 2018. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, you can't 11 be suggesting. You need to be telling me that. 12 I'm not negotiating with you. You are telling me 13 what you have agreed to, so --14 MS. GUNZEL: Understood. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- you tell me 16 what you have agreed to. 17 MS. GUNZEL: The parties have agreed 18 to the 1 day served being Monday, July 30, 2018. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. And I'm 20 not trying to be hard on you. I'm just -- it's--21 the Board doesn't negotiate these terms. 22 MS. GUNZEL: Um-hum.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 1 So you are 2 telling me what the terms are and we either take it or leave it, so we don't -- there is no back 3 The back and forth is between the 4 and forth. 5 parties, not the Board. MS. GUNZEL: Understood. 6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 7 And 8 I am sorry, your name again, sir? 9 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Yes, Abeynayake. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Abeynayake, 11 I apologize. I'm bad with names, but I try to do 12 my best. All right. Mr. Abeynayake, it's my understanding there is an Offer in Compromise and 13 14 the Offer in Compromise is that there is a fine 15 of \$2,000 payable in 60 days. There is also a 5 16 day suspension and 4 days will be stayed for one 17 year and 1 day served. And the 1 day to be 18 served is July 30, 2018. 19 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: That's correct. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is this your 21 understanding of the Offer in Compromise?

Yes.

MR. ABEYNAYAKE:

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 1 Are you aware 2 that by accepting an Offer in Compromise, that you are giving up your right to a hearing? 3 4 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Yes. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 5 Are you also aware that by accepting an Offer in Compromise, 6 7 that you are giving up your right to appeal this 8 matter? 9 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: I'm sorry, can you 10 repeat that? 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you also 12 aware that by accepting an Offer in Compromise, 13 that you cannot appeal this? 14 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Yes. All right. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 16 right. With that said, are there any questions 17 by any Board Members on this Offer in Compromise? 18 Hearing none, with that said, I make 19 a motion that the Offer in Compromise of a fine 20 of \$2,000 payable in 60 days be accepted, that 21 there is a 5 day suspension, 4 days will be stayed for one year and 1 day will be served and 22

1	the date to be served will be July 30, 2018.
2	Is there a second?
3	MEMBER SHORT: Second.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
5	seconded the motion.
6	All those in favor say aye.
7	ALL: Aye.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed?
9	The matter passes 6-0-0.
10	The Board will be issuing a Board
11	Order on this matter.
12	I want to thank the parties for coming
13	and having this Offer in Compromise and we will
14	issue a Board Order, so you will have 60 days
15	from the Board Order to pay the fine.
16	And just briefly, I'm not going to
17	lecture you, just to remind you that if another
18	violation occurs within a year, you are going to
19	have to serve those 4 days suspension, sir, just
20	wanted you to know that.
21	MR. ABEYNAYAKE: I do have a question
22	though.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The matter is 1 2 over, so, yes, sir, you can have a question. What's the question, sir? 3 4 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: I mean, the -- this 5 is the second time that they catch somebody who had used a fake ID --6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir. 7 8 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: -- to purchase 9 alcohol. And each time the -- that person was let go, I mean, by the officers who check the 10 And I mean, it's they keep coming back or 11 12 they will go to another establishment and do the 13 same thing. And there is no discouragement for 14 them not to use -- do that. So I mean it's always the burden is on 15 16 us and so has the Board taken any action or is 17 there anything, they are doing anything with that 18 to --19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, the only 20 thing I can say, sir, the only person the Board 21 can take action against is you. And you have to

do whatever you need to do to find out whatever

technology and I think you are on Prospect
Street. So which is in the middle of Georgetown.

MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Um-hum.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And so unfortunately for you, sir, you are -- how long have you been in business?

MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Like 30, 35 years.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 30, 35 years. You know that young people unfortunately in this country, they like to drink. And they are going to do whatever they need to do to get a drink.

MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Um-hum.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you, because the burden is on you and it's your license, have to make sure that everyone who comes in your establishment, let all your servers know that they need to check IDs. And they -- you need to -- the Board has different training on fake ID and so therefore, you need to make sure that, because of your location, you are on top of it to know that these young kids, that they are going to, if they are not 21, come up with fake IDs.

And so you have to be on top of your game. I mean, there is nothing we can do. We don't have -- we can't arrest young people. We can't do that, but you have to use your best effort knowing that you are in an area where there is a lot of young people who want to drink and they are going to try you.

So and what else -- yeah? What I'll say is that we have training on fake ID, so whenever the Board offers the next one, you need to -- you and your staff needs to come to these trainings to make sure that you are on top of the latest technology to see -- to figure out how is it you can find out whether or not -- if it's a DC License, I would hope that you know what a DC License looks like.

You know that if they are 21, it looks one direction. If they are younger than 21, they look a different direction. You are not -- off the top of your head, I don't expect you to know what every license looks like all over the country, but you though have to take it upon

yourself to come to the training that we offer, 1 2 so you and your staff can recognize what to look for in a phony ID. 3 4 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: We are coming to --5 there is a class coming this Friday. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 6 Yes. 7 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: So we are coming to 8 We have registered for that class. that. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I'm glad 10 that you do that, because -- and I appreciate 11 that you are doing that. And I appreciate the 12 fact that you are -- and that you are doing what 13 you can. But unfortunately, there is nothing we 14 can do to these young people who are doing it. And I'm going to address it. 15 16 Yeah, there is nothing we can do to 17 these young people who are doing that. We just 18 have to impress upon you that -- because you are 19 going to be suspended. 20 MR. ABEYNAYAKE: It's getting harder 21 and harder for us to recognize.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON:

22

Yes, sir?

MR. ABEYNAYAKE: It's getting harder and harder for us to recognize those fake IDs and there is -- they are getting better and better and so --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You are getting better and better. And as the Agency, we are trying through the training to help you recognize what is it that -- what you need to look for to know that this is probably a fake ID. Yes, sir? Identify yourself for the record, please.

INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Investigator
Mark Brashears with ABRA.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Brashears.

INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: I just wanted to point something out to the establishment owner. We actually do have a couple of programs in place. One of those when we identify minors using fake IDs, if they go to any of the universities in the area, that information is provided to the university through one of our programs and action is then taken by the

university against the student.

Another thing we do on this particular occasion, it was myself, a lone ABRA

Investigator, we do periodically work with the Metropolitan Police Department. And if the Metropolitan Police Department observes a minor consuming alcohol with a fake ID or utilizing a fake ID to enter an ABRA establishment, they will in fact effect an arrest on the individual, which we found sends a very strong message when that happens.

So there are a couple of things in play that you were not aware of, sir.

MR. ABEYNAYAKE: All right. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what I would say is that maybe you need to talk to -- go over to Georgetown, because you are closer -- are you close to Georgetown, Georgetown University?

MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Very close.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Then I would try to talk to the administration over at

Georgetown to say, you know what, I just got fined from ABRA based on some of your students, what can yo do to help us for these students? I mean, so that's something you -- I would ask you to do is to talk to George and approach them to say, you know, we have -- I was fined by Georgetown -- I was fined by ABRA and I have to close my business, my restaurant. I mean, and if you are a bar, it's a little bit different, but since you -- you are a restaurant, right?

MR. ABEYNAYAKE: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And to say what can you do to help us with your kids coming here and using fake IDs. Okay? So I appreciate the fact that an OIC was signed. It's -- I don't know what went in your negotiation. The Board tries -- we are not involved with that, but I appreciate the fact that you are trying. And I appreciate the fact that you will come to the hearing.

I'm sorry, you will come to the training to find out what it is that I need to be

looking for to recognize the fact that these are 1 2 fake IDs. And I think one of the things that -yeah, that's all I can say. 3 4 And I thank you, Mr. Brashears for 5 informing him what is it that -- so at least the 6 licensee doesn't think that okay, I get fined and 7 nothing happens to the students, so therefore he 8 or she can just continue doing that and scott 9 free. So thank you for coming today. 10 Okay. 11 And thank you for at least trying, expressing to 12 us that you are trying to stay ahead of the 13 technology to make sure that you recognize fake 14 Okay. Thank you for that. And thank you, IDs. 15 Ms. Gunzel. 16 **INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS:** Yes, sir. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr. Adams. 18 MS. GUNZEL: Thank you. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The Board is in recess then until our -- let me look 20 21 at our schedule. Mr. Chairman, is the order 22 MR. ADAMS:

1	going to come out today?
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's a Board
3	Order, so maybe. I don't know how fast the legal
