3 MR. ANDERSON: The next case on our
4 calendar is Case No. 19-251-00106, Caf Citron,
5 License No. 60138. Will the parties please
6 approach and identify themselves for the record,
7 please? We'll start with the licensee, and
8 there's also a sign-in sheet, so I would like
9 everyone to sign in their name. So we'll start
10 with the licensee to introduce yourself for the
11 record, please.

12 MS. BERINDOAGUE: I am Clelin
13 Berindoague.

14 MR. ANDERSON: I didn't hear your last
15 name, ma'am.

16 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Berindoague.

17 MR. ANDERSON: How do you spell that,
18 please?

19 MS. BERINDOAGUE: B as in boy, E-R-I-
20 N-D-O-A-G-U-E.

21 MR. ANDERSON: Good morning. Help me
22 pronounce it phonetically.

23 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Berindoague.

24 MR. ANDERSON: Berindoague.

25 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Perfect.

1 MR. ANDERSON: All right, thank you.

2 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Thank you.

3 MR. ANDERSON: Thank you. Have a
4 seat. You don't have to get up; just tell me who
5 everyone is. Who else is with you?

6 MS. COURBOIS: My name is Jacqueline
7 Courbois. I'm one of the general managers --

8 MR. ANDERSON: Your last name, ma'am?

9 MS. COURBOIS: Courbois; C-O-U-R; B as
10 in boy, O-I, S as in Sam.

11 MR. ANDERSON: C-O-U-R-B --

12 MS. COURBOIS: O-I, S as in Sam.

13 MR. ANDERSON: Okay. You're the
14 general manager? Who else do we have?

15 MR. SALINAS: Victor Salinas.

16 MR. ANDERSON: Mr. Salinas, how do you
17 spell your last name, please?

18 MR. SALINAS: S-A-L-I-N-A-S. I'm a
19 manager.

20 MR. ANDERSON: You're a manager? Who
21 else do we have?

22 MR. FLOREZ: Edgar Florez.

23 MR. ANDERSON: Mr. Florez.

24 MR. FLOREZ: Yes, sir.

25 MR. ANDERSON: What's your role there,

1 sir?

2 MR. FLOREZ: Sir?

3 MR. ANDERSON: What's your role? What
4 do you do? You're the manager. Investigator?

5 MS. MURRAY: Investigator Shannell
6 Murray.

7 MR. ANDERSON: Can't hear you, ma'am.

8 MS. MURRAY: Shannell Murray.

9 MR. ANDERSON: Good morning, Ms.
10 Murray.

11 MS. DANTZLER: Good morning, ABRA
12 Investigator Felicia Dantzler.

13 MR. ANDERSON: Good morning, Ms.
14 Dantzler. All right. This is a fact finding
15 hearing because an incident occurred at your
16 establishment in July. A simple assault occurred
17 at your establishment, and clearly, you're aware
18 that an investigation was done, and the Board
19 thought that it was egregious enough for us to
20 bring you in to freely explain your response to
21 the incident that occurred.

22 My position has always been, you open
23 your business; you have customers come in, and
24 they might act inappropriately. But I'm more so
25 concerned, how is it that you responded to the

1 action of the customer? Folks usually get in
2 trouble not because something happens in their
3 establishment, but with your response.

4 I know you have a security agreement;
5 I know you have camera system. So what we're
6 trying to find out is, whether or not your
7 response was appropriate to the incident that
8 occurred, and whether or not you did sufficient
9 to prevent the incident from occurring.

10 The Board has not made a decision
11 whether or not we're going to submit this over to
12 the Office of Attorney General for further
13 investigation. All that we're doing today is
14 gathering the facts.

15 So the Board cannot legally order you
16 to do anything at a fact finding hearing. We can
17 ask you to do certain things, and we can suggest
18 to you, and you can voluntarily agree to do it,
19 or you might say, I don't believe I want to do
20 that, and the Board is -- I'm not going to take
21 them anyway, because by law, we can't order you
22 to do anything here because all that we're doing
23 is gathering information. So what we're going to
24 do is, we're going to have the investigator
25 provide us with a report. Do you have a copy of

1 the report?

2 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Yes.

3 MR. ANDERSON: Yes. So we'll have the
4 investigator tell us what happened and what she
5 was able to ascertain as a result of her
6 investigation. Then you can provide a response,
7 and we'll make a determination on whether or not
8 we're going to -- what our next step is, whether
9 we're going to refer this over or we'll say -- as
10 I see that you guys were right here in front of
11 me, in September of last year, and we had said no
12 further action, so -- but so that's basically
13 what we'll do. Once we get the information, then
14 we'll make a determination on whether or not
15 we'll take refer that. Okay?

16 All right. So, Ms. Murray, can you
17 tell us what you were able to find out as a
18 result of your investigation?

19 MS. MURRAY: Good morning.

20 MR. ANDERSON: You have to speak up,
21 ma'am.

22 MS. MURRAY: Good morning. On July
23 the 9th, 2019, at 12:39 a.m. it was reported that
24 a white Caucasian male was struck in the face by
25 an African American male at 1343 Connecticut

1 Avenue Northwest, Caf Citron.

2 Upon my investigation it was
3 determined that a physical assault did occur on
4 the night in question; however, it was two
5 different events that occurred. It's cc in 664,
6 and cc in 680.

7 Okay. No. 664 is a simple assault,
8 and 680 is a sexual assault.

9 MR. ANDERSON: Okay.

10 MS. MURRAY: For 664, physical
11 assault, the male patron, the witness was also
12 the individual who was sexually assaulted, the
13 female individual who was sexually assaulted. It
14 is to be believed that they are boyfriend and
15 girlfriend.

16 Upon my investigation it was
17 determined that the physical assault did occur,
18 but the sexual assault was not shown in video.
19 On Wednesday, July 31st, I visited the
20 establishment and conducted a regulatory
21 inspection where I talked to Mr. Salinas.

22 He advised me that he was not the ABC
23 manager on shift; however, it was Mr. Florez, but
24 he was not present at the time. During that
25 regulatory inspection no other violations were

1 found; however, he did provide me with the
2 logbook notes of the simple assault of the male
3 being punched in the face.

4 On August the 1st I reached out to
5 contact the victim who was Ms. Emily Bricker for
6 the sexual assault, 680. I reached out to her
7 three times; she did not contact me back; both
8 via text message and phone call. On August the
9 4th I reached out to Mr. Scofield, who was the
10 male victim for the simple assault. He did not
11 reach back out to me as well.

12 On Monday, August the 12th, I
13 revisited Caf Citron. At that time I spoke with
14 the manager, Mr. Edgar Florez. He was identified
15 by his Virginia driver's license, and he advised
16 me that he was the ABC manager on July the 9th
17 that actually saw the simple assault happen.

18 He stated that the African American
19 male punched a Caucasian male in the face with
20 his fist. He stated security immediately
21 separated the males and contacted MPD.

22 Mr. Florez stated a male victim had
23 minor injuries from the assault but declined
24 medical attention. I also was able to review the
25 video footage at that time where I did see the

1 simple assault happen; however, there was no
2 video footage of the female victim being
3 assaulted in establishment.

4 I also, on that same day, August the
5 12th, I reached out to the reporting MPD officer,
6 Mr. Shawn Sparks. He was on vacation at the
7 time, so he's going to reach back out to me on
8 August the 17th. I reached back out to him
9 again. He said that he was going to give me
10 summary via email of the incident that occurred.
11 He never responded back out to me.

12 So upon reviewing the ABRA records,
13 the establishment did have a security plan; they
14 did not have a settlement agreement. No
15 violations were found. The establishment did do
16 everything they were supposed to do.

17 MR. ANDERSON: And you said you had
18 asked for video, and they turned it over to you
19 immediately?

20 MS. MURRAY: Yes, they did.

21 MR. ANDERSON: And so you believe
22 that, at least their response to the incident was
23 appropriate?

24 MS. MURRAY: Yes, sir.

25 MR. ANDERSON: Sir, are you here for

1 this case? Are you with this establishment?

2 OFFICER KING: No. I'm MPD Officer
3 King. Can you please come up and identify
4 yourself for the record, sir? I think Mr. Short
5 is a first responder, and I think he can always
6 spot one of his colleagues in the audience. I
7 thought I said everyone should identify
8 themselves, so can you please identify yourself
9 for the record?

10 OFFICER KING: I'm MPD Officer
11 Nicholas King.

12 MR. ANDERSON: Good morning, Mr. King.
13 You were not wearing your uniform, and you were
14 sitting, I thought you were with the parties.
15 Okay. Are you familiar with the incident at Caf
16 Citron?

17 OFFICER KING: Yes.

18 MR. ANDERSON: Can you explain, from
19 your position, what occurred, sir?

20 OFFICER KING: Okay. I responded over
21 there for a simple assault. We got over there,
22 and --

23 MR. SHORT: Put the mic closer to him,
24 please. Thank you.

25 OFFICER KING: The African-American

1 male was already outside of the establishment. I
2 went inside and talked to -- I'm not sure who I
3 talked to. I talked to one of the employees at
4 the bar, and they showed me video footage of the
5 incident. Once I identified who assaulted who, I
6 went over and put handcuffs on the African-
7 American male. I'm sorry, I don't really
8 remember their names.

9 I spoke to the witness, who then
10 disclosed to me that the same African-American
11 male sexually assaulted her as well. Then
12 Officer Sparks ended up taking the arrest of the
13 African-American male for simple assault, and
14 then I called SAU down to talk to the female
15 about the sexual assault.

16 The detective was taking a little
17 while to get down there, so they ended up leaving
18 before the detective got there, so we didn't
19 really get to interview her face to face.

20 MR. ANDERSON: Now, what was the
21 response that you received from the
22 establishment?

23 OFFICER KING: They had both of them
24 separated. The African-American male was
25 actually leaving the location when I got there.

1 They pointed him out to me and told me who it
2 was, and I went and stopped him right then and
3 there and told the other MPD officers to stand by
4 with him until I figure out exactly what was
5 going on.

6 MR. ANDERSON: So you thought that the
7 establishment acted appropriately in light of the
8 situation?

9 OFFICER KING: Yes.

10 MR. ANDERSON: And they were
11 cooperative to you in light of the situation?

12 OFFICER KING: Yes.

13 MR. ANDERSON: All right. Thank you.
14 All right, Ms. --

15 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Clelin?

16 MR. ANDERSON: No, I try to address
17 everyone by their last name.

18 MS. BERINDOAGUE: I'll have to change
19 my name.

20 MR. ANDERSON: No, no, no. I need to
21 do a better job in trying to pronounce all the
22 names of all the licensees that come in front of
23 me. So, Ms. --

24 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Berindoague.

25 MR. ANDERSON: Berindoague. Okay.

1 What can you provide to the Board, based on what
2 you heard and based on the incident, what do you
3 know of the incident, and how can you respond?

4 MS. BERINDOAGUE: Well, I think we did
5 what we are supposed to do. As always, as usual,
6 we promptly called the police and, in this case,
7 the staff had separated the people involved in
8 this argument or whatever they had. We are
9 compliant with the law the best way we can.

10 MR. ANDERSON: All right. Any
11 questions by any Board members? Yes, Mr. Short.

12 MR. SHORT: First of all, I'd like to
13 thank the investigator for an excellent report,
14 and I'd like to thank Officer King. It sounds
15 like you really got on top of it right away. I'd
16 also like to thank the licensee. It seems like
17 you worked everything out.

18 As a Board member, we rarely have
19 cases where people would do everything they're
20 supposed to do; you should be commended on that.
21 And to have officers to come forward on their
22 time off and come to the Board today and the
23 investigate to do the report; I'd just like to
24 thank everybody involved. That's all I have to
25 share.

1 MR. ANDERSON: Any further questions
2 by the Board members? Any final comments by the
3 officer?

4 OFFICER KING: No.

5 MR. ANDERSON: Ms. Murray?

6 MS. MURRAY: No, sir.

7 MR. ANDERSON: Ms. Dantzler?

8 MS. DANTZLER: No, sir.

9 MR. ANDERSON: The licensee?

10 MS. BERINDOAGUE: No.

11 MR. ANDERSON: All right. As I stated
12 before, our job is to, when something happens, to
13 investigate. It has always been that it's not
14 that an incident occurred at your establishment;
15 it's how is it that you respond?

16 Licensees get into trouble because
17 they do not respond appropriately, not because --
18 because in certain incidents you cannot prevent
19 them from occurring. But it's how you respond to
20 what it is, and it appears that you have
21 responded appropriately. So I want to thank you
22 for that.

23 Both the officer and the investigator
24 stated that you cooperated, provided videos; you
25 called the police, and so you have done your

1 part. I want to thank you for that, and I want
2 to thank you for being here today. Well, I want
3 to thank you for being here yesterday. I'll
4 acknowledge that to you.

5 I say that because we've had
6 incidents, and we've asked licensees to show up,
7 and they don't show up. I see that you're here
8 today with your managers and the staff to
9 represent yourself, and I appreciate that fact
10 that you're here today, and you brought
11 sufficient staff to support your position. So
12 thank you for that.

13 With that, I will make a motion that
14 we no further action in this matter. Is there a
15 second?

16 MR. CATO: Second.

17 MR. ANDERSON: Mr. Cato seconded the
18 motion. All those in favor, say aye.

19 (Chorus of aye.)

20 MR. ANDERSON: Opposed, and I've got
21 3-0-0. The ABC Board will take no further action
22 in this matter. Thank you very much for being
23 here. Thank you, Officer King, Ms. Murray, and
24 Ms. Dantzler. Thank you very much; have a
25 Georgetown day.
