Information Form and a copy of the Exhibit Form. If you do not have these documents, please, contact Assistant General Counsel April Randall following this hearing.

5 It is imperative that you review the rules closely and adhere to them before and 6 7 during the Protest Hearing. You are also 8 required to complete and submit the Protest 9 Information Form (PIF) and the Exhibit Form seven days before the date of the hearing. 10 These two 11 forms and accompanying documents need to be 12 submitted to ABRA's Legal Division and to all 13 opposing parties in this matter.

14 If we do not receive a copy of your 15 PIF, your application or your protest, whichever 16 side you are representing, may be subject to dismissal. Likewise, if we do not receive a copy 17 18 of the Exhibit Form and the exhibits themselves, 19 your exhibits may be excluded from the record 20 upon a finding that the opposing party has been 21 prejudiced or no good cause for failure to submit has been shown. 22

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Likewise witnesses other than a party 1 2 may also be subject to exclusion if not identified in the PIF. 3 Accordingly, these forms are very 4 5 important as they greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the 6 7 process and keeping the parties on point during 8 the hearing. They likewise provide notice to 9 opposing parties enabling them to better prepare for the hearing. 10 11 We thank you for your cooperation. If 12 you have any questions today or at any time 13 leading up to the hearing, please, do not 14 hesitate to contact AGC Randall at (202) 442-15 4353. 16 I'll always say if you are working 17 towards a settlement agreement, that's good. Ι 18 prefer settlement agreements because at least you 19 can determine the operating of the facility in your neighborhood. If not, the Board will make a 20 21 decision. So if I don't see you on January 30th, I won't take it personal. But if I see you on 22

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1	January 30th, we will make the decision for you.
2	So good luck in your negotiations. If not, we
3	will see you January 30th at 4:30. Okay.
