ORDER TO CEASE AND DESIST

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Cana Brazil Corp., t/a Cana (Respondent), has failed to pay the second year license fees for License No. ABRA-115507, a Wholesaler A License. Specifically, despite written notice, the Respondent failed to pay the license fees for the period of 2022 to 2023 by March 31, 2022, the deadline for all Wholesaler A licenses. Therefore, the Respondent's license has been **SUSPENDED** until the Respondent pays the license fees and the \$50.00 per day fine imposed by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for late payment.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829, the Respondent is therefore **ORDERED** by the Board on this 20th day of April 2022, to **STOP selling alcoholic beverages to establishments** until payment of the license fees and any associated fines are received by ABRA. The Respondent may not allow sale alcoholic beverages to establishments until the ABC License is reinstated by the Board.

A copy of this Order is being forwarded to the Metropolitan Police Department to ensure compliance. Failure to comply with this Order will subject the Respondent to the maximum civil penalties provided by the law.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thi1ty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Coult of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
