The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
4	We're back on the record. Our next case is Case
5	No. 18-251-00117, Canopy Washington DC/The Wharf,
6	License No. 106083.
7	Will the parties, please, approach and
8	identify themselves for the record, please?
9	MS. GUNZEL: Good morning. Jessica
10	Gunzel, Assistant Attorney General, representing
11	the District of Columbia.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
13	Ms. Gunzel.
14	MS. GUNZEL: Good morning.
15	MR. O'BRIEN: Stephen O'Brien for the
16	licensee. I'm accompanied by Michael Anderson.
17	He is the licensee's general manager.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
19	Mr. O'Brien, and good morning, Mr. Anderson. I
20	won't have a problem remembering that name. Good
21	morning.
22	Ms. Gunzel, are there any preliminary

matters in this case? 1 2 MS. GUNZEL: Yes. The parties have an OIC to present to the Board this morning. 3 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is 5 that, ma'am? For Charge 1, a fine of 6 MS. GUNZEL: 7 \$1,250. For Charge 2, a fine of \$350. 8 Charge 3, the charge is dismissed. For Charge 4, 9 a fine of \$1,250. And for Charge 5, a fine of \$1,250 making a total fine of \$4,100 to be paid 10 11 within 30 days or the license shall be suspended 12 indefinitely until the fine is paid. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 13 Mr. 14 O'Brien, it's my understanding that there is an 15 Offer in Compromise and the Offer in Compromise 16 is that for Charge 1 there is a fine of \$1,250; 17 for Charge 2 there is a fine of \$350; Charge 3 18 will be dismissed; Charge 4 there is a fine of \$1,250. 19 20 Was there a Charge 5? 21 MS. GUNZEL: Yes. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And for Charge

5 there is a fine of \$1,250. And that all the
fines will be payable in 30 days. If the fine is
not payable in 30 days, the license will be
suspended until the fine has been paid.
Is this your understanding, sir, of
the Offer in Compromise?
MR. O'BRIEN: No. The fine will be
paid today.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The
fine will be paid today.
All right. Is your client aware that
by accepting an Offer in Compromise, that he is
giving up his right to a hearing?
MR. O'BRIEN: Yes and he waives the
right to appeal.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
MR. O'BRIEN: Thank you very much.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: With that said,
I then make a motion that
MR. O'BRIEN: Mr. Chairman?
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes?
MR. O'BRIEN: May I make one

1 statement?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.

MR. O'BRIEN: Our entry into this particular form of disposition is predicated on the understanding that we have with the prosecution that because the three primary tier violations, which are disposed of today, all arise from the same incident that they shall be treated as one primary tier violation in the event, in the unfortunate and the unlikely event that there is any further matters.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is that the understanding, Ms. Gunzel?

MS. GUNZEL: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Since I was

MS. GUNZEL: That's our understanding.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. So the record will reflect that the parties agree that the charges within this case, at least for counting process, is -- will be recorded as one primary tier violation, rather than separate

-	primary crer violacions.
2	MEMBER ALBERTI: May I make a comment?
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr.
4	Alberti.
5	MEMBER ALBERTI: That is, just for the
6	record, what is part of our regulations. That is
7	what is stipulated as part of our regulations in
8	the counting. I forget what the section is now,
9	but the section on counting prior violations that
10	is what is stated in that section. So it's in
11	our regs already.
12	MR. O'BRIEN: We just wanted
13	MEMBER ALBERTI: Just FYI.
14	MR. O'BRIEN: to get that clear on
15	the record.
16	MEMBER ALBERTI: I know you wanted it
17	on the record, but I just, for the record and
18	everyone's understanding, wanted to put that out
19	there.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
21	MR. O'BRIEN: And the only other thing
22	I would add, Mr. Chair thank you, Mr. Alberti.

The only other thing I would add, Mr. Chair, is that this episode occurred back in January and the personnel that managed and operated the staff for the facility have all been changed --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.

MR. O'BRIEN: -- since then.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you for that representation, Mr. O'Brien.

All right. All right. With that said, are there any -- before I make any motion on whether or not this matter should be accepted or not, do we have any comments by any Board Members?

All right. Hearing none, I make a motion that the Offer in Compromise of a fine of \$1,250 for Charge 1, a fine of \$350 for Charge 2, for Charge 3, that will be dismissed, Charge 4, a fine of \$1,250, and for Charge 5, there is a fine of \$1,250 and that the Offer in Compromise will be accepted. The fine will be paid today. If the fine is not paid today, the license will be suspended until the fine has been paid that and

1	that is agreed that these matters will be treated
2	as, one, a first primary tier violation for this
3	establishment. Is there a second?
4	MEMBER SHORT: Second.
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
6	seconded the motion
7	All those in favor say aye.
8	ALL: Aye.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed?
10	The matter passes 5-0-0.
11	Thank you very much.
12	MR. O'BRIEN: Thank you.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I thank the
14	parties for this.
15	MS. GUNZEL: Thank you.
