CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Case Number 18-CMP-00186, Capitol Fine Wine and Spirits License Number 82981. Will the parties please approach and identify themselves for the record please?

MS. PHILLIPS: Louise Phillips, Assistant Attorney General for the District of Columbia.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon, Ms. Phillips.

MR. WOLDEMICHAEL: Yohannes Woldemichael.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, Mr. Woldemichael. All right, are there any preliminary matters in this case?

MS. PHILLIPS: Yes, Mr. Chair, there are. The parties have an offer-in-compromise to present to the Board. It was a \$2,000 fine to be paid within 90 days on the license.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, how many days?

MS. PHILLIPS: What?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I didn't hear how

1 many days.

2 MS. PHILLIPS: Ninety.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.

4 MS. PHILLIPS: Nine-zero. Or the license  
5 will be suspended indefinitely until the fine is paid.

6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Mr.  
7 Woldemichael.

8 MR. WOLDEMICHAEL: Yes, sir.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. It's my  
10 understanding that there offer-in-compromise, and the  
11 offer-in-compromise is that there is a fine of \$2,000  
12 paid within 90 days. If the fine is not paid within  
13 90 days the license will be suspended until the fine  
14 has been made.

15 Is this your understanding, sir, of the  
16 offer-in-compromise?

17 MR. WOLDEMICHAEL: Yes.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you aware that  
19 by accepting an offer-in-compromise that you give up  
20 your right to a hearing?

21 MR. WOLDEMICHAEL: Yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And that you're

1 giving up your right to appeal this matter?

2 MR. WOLDEMICHAEAL: Yes.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. We'll assess  
4 that I then make a motion that the offer-in-compromise  
5 offer a fine of \$2,000 payable in 90 days be accepted.  
6 If the fine is not paid within 90 days, the offer  
7 will, I'm sorry, the license will be suspended until  
8 the fine has been paid. Is there a second?

9 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has  
11 seconded the motion. All those in favor say aye?

12 (Chorus of ayes)

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed?  
14 Amendment pass. How many of us? Oh, 6-0-0.

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, so I'll have  
17 you sign off on some paperwork, sir. But, if you hang
