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**ORDER GRANTING PETITIONER'S MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION  
AND REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE**

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On May 9, 2018, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) cancelled the Retailer Class A License ABRA-060423 held by J.S. & W.C. Incorporated, t/a Capitol City Wine & Spirits, because J.S. & W.C. Incorporated failed to renew its license by March 31, 2018. *See* Board Order No. 2018-325.

On July 16, 2018, Bernard C. Dietz, Esq., on behalf of J.S. & W.C. Incorporated (Petitioner), sought reinstatement of the Retailer's Class A License ABRA-060423. In support of his Motion for Reconsideration, Mr. Dietz stated that the Petitioner was unable to renew its license due to outstanding issues with the Office of Tax and Revenue which have now been resolved.

The Board finds that the reinstatement of the license is proper conditioned upon the requirement that the Petitioner pays the required fees.

Accordingly, it is this 18th day of July, 2018, **ORDERED** that the **ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE** issued against J.S. & W.C. Incorporated, t/a Capitol City Wine & Spirits, by the Board on May 9, 2018, be and hereby is **VACATED**.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Retailer Class A License ABRA-060423 be **REINSTATED**.


**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Petitioner pay the required fees within two (2) weeks from the date of this Order.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
