ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

INTRODUCTION


In Board Order No. 2018-263, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) found that Gebtri, Inc., t/a Cedar Hill Bar & Grill/Uniontown, (hereinafter "Respondent" or "Uniontown") failed to follow numerous safety measures imposed by an Order of the Board and its security plan and interfered in an investigation when a manager and secret owner attempted to bribe an ABRA investigator. *In re Gebtri, Inc., t/a Cedar Hill Bar & Grill/Uniontown*, Case No. 17-

CMP-00029, Board Order No. 2018-263, 1-2 (D.C.A.B.C.B. May 9, 2018). Based on these violations, the Board revoked Uniontown's license. *Id.* at 16. Subsequently, Uniontown filed an untimely motion for reconsideration asking the Board to grant it an additional 90 days of operation in order to accommodate its employees. *Letter from Melake Gebre to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board*, 1 (May 23, 2018). In light of the serious nature of the violations in this case, the Board is not persuaded that Uniontown merits more time to conduct business.

ORDER

Therefore, the Board, on this 6th day of June 2018, hereby **DENIES** the motion for reconsideration. The ABRA shall deliver copies of this Order to the Government and the Respondent.



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, Reeves Center, 2000 14th Street, NW, 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202-879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
