ORDER SETTING STATUS AND PROTEST HEARING

The Application filed by 476 K, LLC, t/a Cloakroom to renew its Retailer's Class "CN" License, having been protested by a Group of Five or More Individuals (Group), came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) on July 23, 2018, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001) for a Roll Call Hearing.

At the Roll Call Hearing, Gisele Roget, the Protestant's Designated Representative, was the only member to appear on behalf of the Group. As a result, the Board's Agent granted conditional standing to the Group pursuant to § 1605.1. The


Applicant orally moved to dismiss the Group and requested that the Board's Agent refrain from setting dates for the Protest Status Hearing and the Protest Hearing until the issue of the Protestant's standing could be addressed by the Board.

By letter dated July 25, 2018, the Applicant withdrew its motion. Having no other legal impediments before it at this time, the Board, on this 1st day of August, 2018, hereby notifies the parties that the Protest Status Hearing is scheduled for September 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m., and the Protest Hearing is October 24, 2018 at 1:30 p.m.

The Board advises the Protestant that four (4) additional members of the Group must appear at the Protest Status Hearing in order to be granted standing as a Group of Five or More Individuals.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
