The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street N.W., Washington, D.C., Ms. LaVerne Fletcher, Agent, presiding.

AGENT FLETCHER: Would the parties in the matter of Colony Liquors please come forward, the parties in the matter of Colony Liquors.

This is Case Number 18-PRO-00034, Hard Oak, Inc., 4901 Georgia Avenue, NW, License Number ABRA-098972. This is a Retailer Class A license renewal.

The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, residential parking, and vehicular and pedestrian safety, and real property values.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher. I'm conducting the roll call hearing as the Board's agent. Introductions beginning with the Applicant, please.

I'm sorry. Oh, I'm sorry, you're the interpreter.

MR. KIM: Yes, I am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Can you please state your name?

MR. KIM: My name's Davi Kim, spelled D-A-V-I, last name is Kim, K-I-M.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Kim. One second. Thank you very much. And Korean language?

MR. KIM: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So now if you could state your name and spell it for the record.

MR. LEE: My name is Jae Hyuk Lee.
AGENT FLETCHER: And how do you spell it?

MR. LEE: J-A-E -
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. LEE: H-Y-U-K -
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. LEE: L-E-E.
MR. KIM: Would you like the
interpreter to repeat that?
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KIM: My name is Jae Hyuk Lee, spelled J-A-E H-Y-U-K L-E-E.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much. And present on behalf of ANC 4D?

MR. ELSENER: My name is Ben Elsener.
B-E-N, last name, E-L-S-E-N-E-R.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr.
Elsener. We did receive a copy of the letter from ANC 4D designating you as their representative today.

Are there any other individuals present today in this matter, any other protestants?
(No audible response)
AGENT FLETCHER: ANC 4D does have standing as a protestant. I just want to state that first. It seems that the gentleman standing, did you have a -

MR. BOYD: Yes, ma'am. Good morning.
AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning. And you can just come up and state your name for the record. Right, just stand right behind that microphone. Are you here for this for Colony Liquors?

MR. BOYD: Yes, ma'am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. And could you state your name and spell it for the record, please?

MR. BOYD: My name is Rufus, R-U-F-US, Boyd, B-O-Y-D.

AGENT FLETCHER: And what's the first name, Mr. Boyd?

MR. BOYD: Rufus.
AGENT FLETCHER: R-U-F-U-S?
MR. BOYD: Yes, ma'am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Rufus Boyd. And, Mr.
Boyd, you signed the protest letter?
MR. BOYD: No, ma'am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So what that means, Mr. Boyd, there'll be a record that you came today, but you can't be recognized as a protestant without signing the protest letter. But I've made a note, and it's on the record that you were here today. You're not required to stay unless you choose to. Thank you.

Mr. Elsener, ANC 4D has standing as a
protestant. There was also a group of eight individuals that signed the protest letter. You were one of their designated representatives as well?

MR. ELSENER: That's correct. I'm listed in the last paragraph of that letter.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. And so we do have a protest letter indicating that you represent that group of eight.

MR. ELSENER: But I was in with the ANC standing, is what

AGENT FLETCHER: I'm sorry, what was that, Mr. Elsener?

MR. ELSENER: Okay, I think it'll be clearer if I just

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, ha, ha, ha. ANC 4D does have standing as a protestant. The group of eight that you represent has conditional standing.

MR. ELSENER: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: They're not granted full standing today, because at least five of
them are not present today.
What that means is at the upcoming status hearing, at least four of them need to appear that were not here today.

MR. ELSENER: So even if I could make it, another four could -

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. ELSENER: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: You were here today, so you count as one. We need to see four more. But there would still have to be a designated representative. If you have a list of designated representatives, one of them should be the designated representative.

MR. ELSENER: Okay. I think Jamie Barden from 4D, his plan is to carry this.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, Jamie Barden, his name is spelled J-A-M-I-E, for the record. His last name is Barden, B-A-R-D-E-N. And yes, Mr. Barden is also a designated representative.

If at least four individuals that are not present today do not appear at the upcoming
status hearing, the ABC Board will dismiss the group of eight.

We need to set a date for a mediation, a status hearing, and a protest hearing.

MR. LEE: Is it possible to do either Monday or Tuesday? Because Saturday we are busy.

AGENT FLETCHER: For the hearings?
MR. LEE: Yes, as far as the dates go.
AGENT FLETCHER: We can schedule the mediation on a Monday or a Tuesday, but the ABC Board, the full Board meets only on Wednesdays.

MR. LEE: Mediation is Monday or Tuesday, but the full Board is only on Wednesdays?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. We are flexible with the mediation dates, but the status hearing and the protest hearing have to be set on a Wednesday.

MR. LEE: That's fine.
AGENT FLETCHER: I will give you the dates for the status hearing and protest hearing first. The date for the status hearing is June

27 at 9:30 a.m. The protest hearing is set for July 25, 2018, at 4:30.

I'll give you the next available days for mediation. And for mediation, we need a Monday or a Tuesday?

MR. LEE: Either is fine.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. The next available day for mediation is Monday, June 4, at 11:30.

MR. LEE: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: So would that work for

MR. ELSENER: I don't know if that works for Jamie.

AGENT FLETCHER: Would you be attending the mediation, Mr. Elsener?

MR. ELSENER: I'd be happy to, but June 4th doesn't work for me.

AGENT FLETCHER: So here's what I'm going to do. I'm going to set a date that works for you.

MR. ELSENER: Okay.

AGENT FLETCHER: What about -
MR. ELSENER: The following Monday I believe

AGENT FLETCHER: We can do June the 11th at 11:30 a.m.

MR. ELSENER: Yes.
MR. KIM: This is the interpreter speaking, you said $11: 30$ as well for June 11th?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. Or it can be 1:00 p.m., 11:30 or 1:00 on June 11th.

MR. LEE: The earlier the better. Do you have any availability for 9:00 a.m., possibly?

AGENT FLETCHER: Well, no. Because hearings are held every Monday morning like today, at 10:00, so mornings are not good. On a Tuesday we could do it earlier.

MR. LEE: Yes, then Tuesday, please, if possible.

AGENT FLETCHER: So on Tuesday, June the 12th, we could do 9:00, 9:30.

MR. LEE: Okay.

AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Elsener, do you have any availability on Tuesday morning?

MR. ELSENER: May I have one second, please?

AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, yes.
MR. ELSENER: Let's try Tuesday at 9:00 a.m. if that works better for Colony. I will reach out to Jamie and try to confirm that he can attend as well.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Mediation is set for 9:00 o'clock a.m. on Tuesday, June 12th.

MR. KIM: The interpreter would like to clarify. For the protest hearing, did you say July 25th or 29th?

AGENT FLETCHER: I said - I'll tell you in one second - for the protest hearing, July 25.

MR. KIM: At 4:30 p.m.?
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KIM: Mediation you said is June 12th at 9:00 a.m.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.

MR. ELSENER: I actually just heard from Jamie, so that time on June 12th works.

AGENT FLETCHER: That's good. Okay. Any questions at all?
(No audible response)
AGENT FLETCHER: One second. Mr. Kim, we will check with the interpreting service to see if you're available on all the dates that we just mentioned, in case you happen to be available, since you were here from the beginning. Is that okay with you, Mr. Lee?

MR. LEE: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay, thank you.
MR. LEE: So in other words, you will be finding out as to who the interpreter will be?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. So we have to make a request for an interpreter through the company that we use, which is how we wound up with Mr. Kim today. And so we'll make the request for Mr . Kim for all the other proceedings.

MR. LEE: So we don't' have to bring
our own interpreter?
AGENT FLETCHER: Only if you choose to.

MR. LEE: No, no.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Yes, we provide them. But some people - and I just want to note that this dialogue is off the record for the court reporter, the dialogue between Mr. Kim and the lady sitting in the back. That's all off the record. That was off the record, yes.

MR. LEE: So we would just like to clarify, so we will be bringing our own lawyer, but our understanding is that you will be providing an interpreter for us.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. We're going to be requesting an interpreter for Mr. Lee. We're going to be asking for you. And if you're not available, then we'll request you.

Any other questions, Mr. Kim, or Mr. Lee, any questions?

MR. LEE: No, I do not.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Then we'll see
you on June the 12th for mediation.
MR. LEE: All right. Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, just check in up front. Okay, thank you. The roll call hearing is concluded.
