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**ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF ANC 1B'S PROTEST**

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The Application filed by M & A Hospitality, LLC, t/a Cork Wine Bar & Market, for a Substantial Change to add a Summer Garden to its Retailer's Class CR License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on February 5, 2018, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001).

On February 5, 2018, the Board dismissed the Protest of ANC 1B, because ANC 1B failed to appear at the Roll Call Hearing. ANC 1B may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

## **ORDER**

The Board advises the parties that the protest of the Group of Five or More Individuals remains, and the Protest Status Hearing is set for March 21, 2018, at 9:30 a.m. and the Protest Hearing for April 25, 2018, at 1:30 p.m.

Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
