3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
4	everyone. I would like to welcome you to the
5	regularly scheduled meeting of the District of
6	Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.
7	Please know that today's hearings will be
8	conducted in accordance with DC Official Code
9	Section 2-574 of the Open Meetings Act.
10	Today is October 24, 2018. I would
11	like to introduce Members of the Board with us
12	today. To my far right is Mr. Donald Isaac, Sr.,
13	to his left is Mr. Bobby Cato. To my immediate
14	right is Mr. Nick Alberti. To my far left is Ms.
15	Rema Wahabzadah. To her right is Mr. Mike
16	Silverstein and to my immediate left is Mr. James
17	Short. My name is Donovan Anderson. I'm
18	Chairman of the Board. We do have a quorum
19	today. We do have all seven Members with us
20	today.
21	I would like to mention two things
22	before we get started. First of all, if you have

1 any electronic devices, pagers, cell phones or 2 such, please, make certain that they are turned off to avoid any interruption of the proceedings. 3 Secondly, there is a piece of paper on 4 5 each table. When you come forward as your case is called, please, take a seat at the table and, 6 7 please, sign-in. This is to ensure the correct spelling of your name for the record. 8 9 Additionally, when you introduce yourself for the record, please, spell your name 10 11 aloud for the court reporter. 12 I will note that the approximate time 13 is 9:46 a.m. 14 I apologize that we were not here at I know that you were here, so I do 15 9:30. 16 apologize that we were not here at 9:30. 17 The first case on our calendar is a 18 Protest Hearing (Status) case, Case No. 18-PRO-19 00066, Costello Restaurant and Lounge, License No. 100259. 20 21 Would the parties, please, approach 22 and identify themselves for the record, please?

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1	MR. HUNTER: Good morning. I'm Dean			
2	Hunter.			
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,			
4	Mr. Hunter.			
5	MS. ABBOTT: Good morning. Karen			
6	Abbott, resident of 929 Hamilton Street, N.W.			
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,			
8	Ms. Abbott.			
9	MR. BARDEN: Jamie Barden, ANC-4D04.			
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your last name			
11	again, sir, again?			
12	MR. BARDEN: Barden, B-A-R-D-E-N.			
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. You			
14	can have a seat.			
15	So are you the this establishment			
16	is being protested by the ANC? Who is			
17	protesting?			
18	MR. BARDEN: No, it is protested			
19	because we did not have our monthly meeting that			
20	month, so it is being protested by it's a			
21	we had a letter of residence and I was one of the			
22	representatives.			

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So 2 it is being represented by -- it is being protested by a group? 3 4 MS. ABBOTT: Yes. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: A group of five? 6 7 MS. ABBOTT: More than five. 8 MR. BARDEN: Yes. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: How many people were at the Roll Call Hearing? 10 11 MR. BARDEN: So we were one shy at the 12 Roll Call Hearing. We were told that if we had 13 one additional person that would come here, we 14 would have standing. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So who --16 MS. ABBOTT: I was --17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, 18 ma'am. 19 MS. ABBOTT: Pardon me. I was here, 20 but by the time I got inside, everybody was gone. 21 I was not counted. MR. BARDEN: She was not counted on 22

1 the last --2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So she was not counted? 3 4 MS. ABBOTT: Two of us were not 5 counted --CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 6 So --7 MS. ABBOTT: -- because I brought 8 another of the protestants. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, 10 ma'am? 11 MR. BARDEN: We only need one more. 12 MS. ABBOTT: Okay. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what I'm --13 14 okay. So there were four people at the Roll Call 15 Is that correct? Hearing. 16 MR. BARDEN: There were --17 MS. ABBOTT: There were five, except 18 one was a husband and wife and they weren't 19 allowed --20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's true. MS. ABBOTT: -- one of the --21 22 MR. BARDEN: For the purposes here,

1 there were four that were signers of the letter 2 and Ms. Abbott is the fifth. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So and she was 3 4 not at --5 She was not, that's MR. BARDEN: right. 6 7 MS. ABBOTT: I was here, but I wasn't 8 counted. 9 MR. BARDEN: Right. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The reason I'm asking this question is it doesn't --11 I thought it was the ANC. It doesn't say a 12 13 group. It just says ANC-4D. 14 MR. BARDEN: Oh. 15 It's a group of five or MS. ABBOTT: 16 more. 17 MR. BARDEN: I'm sorry. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, I'm just --19 I guess from my own edification, I was trying to 20 make sure that I know who the protesters are. So 21 I'm looking at -- the reason I was asking, I was looking at the calendar, at least the public 22

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1	calendar, and it said it was being protested by			
2	ANC-4C. So I didn't see, at least when I looked			
3	at the calendar, it didn't say that it was being			
4	protested by the group of five or more.			
5	And all right. So there are no issues			
6	in the sense that this so the group of five or			
7	more does have standing, since it was not an			
8	issue.			
9	Are there any other preliminary			
10	matters in this case?			
11	MR. BARDEN: So just to clarify, at			
12	this point, we do have standing?			
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.			
14	MS. ABBOTT: Yes.			
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, you do			
16	have standing, because Ms. Abbott, right?			
17	MR. BARDEN: Right.			
18	MS. ABBOTT: Yes.			
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That Ms. Abbott			
20	is here today and she was not one of the group.			
21	She was not part of the four who was at the Roll			
22	Call Hearing.			

1	MR. BARDEN: All right. Thank you.
2	MS. ABBOTT: Yes.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So standing is
4	provided to the group of five or more.
5	And who is the designated are you
6	the designated representative?
7	MR. BARDEN: I am one of the
8	representatives, um-hum.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. All
10	right. All right. Yes, Mr. Hunter?
11	MR. HUNTER: Yes, Mr. Chairman. The
12	other preliminary issue, I believe, is the Pro Se
13	Motion filed by the licensee. Apparently, he was
14	late for the hearing. Tried to call and when the
15	hurricane hit the city and on his way here he
16	discovered flooding in his basement.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yeah, the Board
18	is based on the Board Order 2018-574 that was
19	issued on October 3, 2018, the Board did excuse
20	his dismissal and so therefore there is no issue.
21	MR. HUNTER: Thank you.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: There is no

issue with the fact that the owner was not at the 1 2 Show Cause Hearing. So we have -- so there -the -- this license is properly before us to move 3 4 forward for a Protest Hearing. So there are no other preliminary 5 matters? 6 7 MR. BARDEN: I had a quick question --8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir. 9 MR. BARDEN: -- for clarification that the residents raised. 10 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir. 12 MR. BARDEN: There is a usual two year 13 cycle, as you know, in front of the Board in 14 terms of when these licenses come up. We have --15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's every 16 three years. 17 MR. BARDEN: -- three years. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. 19 MR. BARDEN: We have an existing 20 settlement agreement based on, you know, some of the -- what is in front of the Board. We were 21 curious how it is that this came up before the 22

three year time limit? How is it that a business can apply for extended hours with the same owner in that short -- within the three years? So it's shorter than the three years.

5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: He has applied for a substantial change to change his hours and 6 7 that's his right. The Board decided that that was a substantial change that he is asking for 8 9 and it was placarded and that's one of the reasons why based on the fact that it was 10 placarded, that's why you have the right to move 11 12 forward with this Protest Hearing.

So it's not -- so he is just asking for some changes during -- I don't know what the hours are in his settlement agreement if there were hours specified in --

MS. ABBOTT: Hours were specified. I just attended his licensee hearing here, training last year and it was my understanding that if there is a settlement agreement, that this should -- this case would never even be going forward right now.

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1	MR. HUNTER: Mr. Chairman?			
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes?			
3	MR. HUNTER: I think these are issues			
4	that are beyond the scope of			
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I think he was			
6	just asking for clarification. I mean, I'm not			
7	addressing the issue. I think he had I think			
8	what the way it was taken is that I thought			
9	that licenses were being renewed every three			
10	years. This is every two years, so I was just			
11	providing clarification that licenses were being			
12	provided, that it's a three year cycle.			
13	And within the cycle, he filed an			
14	application to change his hours and the Board			
15	when he came to the Board, the Board decided that			
16	it was a substantial change, that the neighbors			
17	need to be aware of it and so that's why you are			
18	exercising your right to challenge this.			
19	And so that's why we are moving			
20	forward with this Protest Hearing.			
21	MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Chairman, so			
22	there is no			

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr.			
2	Alberti?			
3	MEMBER ALBERTI: I think what you are			
4	alluding to here is that the settlement agreement			
5	limits their hours. Is that true?			
6	MR. BARDEN: Yes.			
7	MS. ABBOTT: Yes.			
8	MEMBER ALBERTI: The hours of			
9	operation and hours of sales?			
10	MR. BARDEN: Yes.			
11	MS. ABBOTT: Yes.			
12	MEMBER ALBERTI: It has been the			
13	Board's policy that that would govern. I'll have			
14	to take a look. I will be taking a look later			
15	today to see what the situation is, but I believe			
16	the law is that settlement agreement governs and			
17	so if the request is for something outside of			
18	those hours, the settlement agreement governs.			
19	So but you can I would ask I would suggest			
20	that you talk to our general counsel to get more			
21	insight into this, because			
22	MR. BARDEN: Yes, yes.			

1	MEMBER ALBERTI: she can speak to			
2	what the law says about this.			
3	MR. BARDEN: Okay.			
4	MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm not alluding to			
5	any decision on this case, but we are governed by			
6	the regulations, statutes and regulations.			
7	MR. BARDEN: And our assumption was			
8	that that had been looked into even prior to			
9	deciding that this could be placarded and so			
10	forth.			
11	MEMBER ALBERTI: You know, I don't			
12	know what the situation is.			
13	MR. BARDEN: Yeah, I understand.			
14	MEMBER ALBERTI: I don't know whether			
15	a mistake was made.			
16	MR. BARDEN: Oh, obviously, that's why			
17	we came into it.			
18	MEMBER ALBERTI: Whether it is			
19	legitimate.			
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sir!			
21	MEMBER ALBERTI: Sir, no, he is not			
22	it's okay. I'm just saying			

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold		
2	on, hold on. All right. Okay.		
3	MEMBER ALBERTI: May I finish?		
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on.		
5	MEMBER ALBERTI: I will be looking at		
6	it and I'll be talking to our general counsel and		
7	you should talk to our general counsel also.		
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.		
9	MR. BARDEN: Appreciate it.		
10	MS. ABBOTT: Thank you.		
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This is where		
12	we are, okay? An application was filed for a		
13	substantial change. We are moving through a		
14	Protest Hearing. It went to Roll Call. The		
15	Board determined that it was a substantial change		
16	that will be that there would be a substantial		
17	change that is of benefit to the that is of		
18	interest to the community.		
19	It went to Roll Call. We are here at		
20	the Protest. The folks can continue speaking and		
21	this is basically where we are today. There is		
22	going to be no other decision made until the		

Board makes a decision about whether or not this 1 2 matter that was -- the parties can talk, attempt to sign another settlement agreement. It will 3 come to the Board and the Board will make a 4 5 decision whether or not we are going to approve whatever changes that are being requested. 6 7 So that's a Board decision. All seven 8 of us will vote and make a decision what is going 9 to move forward with it. That's basically where 10 we are today. Okay, sir? So that's the position That is how this is going to 11 of the Board. 12 operate. Okay? All right. 13 MR. BARDEN: Yes, sir. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This matter is scheduled for -- are there any other preliminary 15 16 -- sir, could you take your hat off and can you 17 also introduce yourself for the record, please, 18 sir? 19 MR. BAH: My name is Amadou Bah. I'm 20 the owner. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I did not hear 21 your last name, sir. 22

1	MR. BAH: Okay. My name is Amadou			
2	Bah. I am the owner.			
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You said			
4	Amarouba?			
5	MR. BARDEN: Amadou.			
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Amadou.			
7	MR. BAH: Amadou Bah.			
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This is why			
9	most people when they are here, they start off hi			
10	and by the time they get to the end of a name,			
11	they trail off so I can't hear. But there is a			
12	sign-in sheet, too, sir, can you, please, sign-in			
13	on the sign-in sheet?			
14	All right. Are there any other			
15	preliminary matters that need to be discussed			
16	today?			
17	Hearing none, this matter then is			
18	scheduled for a Protest Hearing on November 28th			
19	at 4:30 p.m.			
20	All right. Now that we have scheduled			
21	this matter for a Protest Hearing, there are a			
22	few things that I would like to instruct the			

applicant and the protestant about, so that the
Protest Hearing is focused and addresses only
those issues that are being protested.

The Board does not intend to hear 4 5 testimony on matters that are not relevant to this case. You should have received by 6 electronic or regular mail a letter explaining 7 8 the protest process, a copy of the Protest 9 Information Form and a copy of the Exhibit Form. 10 If you do not have these documents, please, 11 contact Assistant General Counsel April Randall 12 following this hearing.

13 It is imperative that you review these 14 rules closely and follow them before and during 15 the Protest Hearing. You are also required to 16 complete and submit the Protest Information Form 17 (PIF) and the Exhibit Form seven days before the 18 date of the hearing. These two forms and 19 accompanying documents need to be submitted to 20 ABRA's Legal Division and to all opposing parties 21 in this matter.

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If we do not receive a copy of your

PIF, your application or your protest, whichever 1 2 side you are representing, may be subject to dismissal. Likewise, if we do not receive a copy 3 of the Exhibit Form and the exhibits themselves, 4 5 your exhibits may be excluded from the record upon a finding that the opposing party has been 6 prejudiced or no good cause for failure to submit 7 8 has been shown. 9 Likewise witnesses other than a party may also be subject to exclusion if not 10 identified in the PIF. 11 12 Accordingly, these forms are very 13 important as they greatly assist the Board in 14 narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during 15 16 the hearing. They likewise provide notice to 17 opposing parties enabling them to better prepare 18 for the hearing. 19 We thank you greatly for your 20 cooperation.
