The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, everyone. I would like to welcome you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Please know that today's hearings will be conducted in accordance with D.C. Official Code Section 2-574 of the Open Meetings Act.

Today is September 19, 2018. I would like to introduce Members of the Board with us today. To my far right is Mr. Donald Isaac, Sr., to his left is Mr. Bobby Cato. To my immediate right is Mr. Nick Alberti. To my far left is Mr. Mike Silverstein. My name is Donovan Anderson. I'm Chairman of the Board. We do have five Members in attendance today and we do have a quorum.

I would like to mention two things before we get started. First of all, if you have any electronic devices, pagers, cell phones or such, please, make certain that they are turned
off to avoid any interruption of the proceedings.
Secondly, there is a piece of paper on
each table. When you come forward as your case is called, please, take a seat at the table and, please, sign-in. This is to ensure the correct spelling of your name for the record.

Additionally, when you introduce yourself for the record, please, spell your name aloud for the court reporter.

I will note that the approximate time is 9:46. I do apologize that we were not here promptly at 9:30. I know that you were here promptly at 9:30, so I do apologize for the delay.

All right. Our first order of business today, we have a Protest Hearing (Status) on Cube \& Bale, License No. 110062. Would all the parties who are here today for Cube \& Bale, please, approach. You can, please, sit. You can pull up some more chairs and, please, sit. And I need everyone to identify themselves once you have been seated.

Okay. We will start with the licensee, please. Do I -- for them to introduce themselves, the applicant.

MS. MBIMADONG: Hi, good morning. My name is Pricilla Mbimadong. I am president of Wyoming Cube \& Bale and here to represent the applicant.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Good morning. I'm sorry, your last name again?

MS. MBIMADONG: Mbimadong. Would you --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: How do you spell that, please?

MS. MBIMADONG: M as in Mary, B as in boy, $I$ as in Indigo, $M$ as in Mary, $A$ as in apple, $D$ as in dog, $O$ as in orange, $N$ as in Nancy, $G$ as in George.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And good morning. And there is a sign-in sheet, please, sign- in, too, please. And you, sir?

MR. ENGEL: Bradley Engel.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who are
you?
MR. ENGEL: A protestant, the Dower Group.

MS. : We're with the Dower Group.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So I need you to introduce yourself and let me know what group you belong to, because it appears that there are several groups. So I need to make

MR. ENGEL: With the Dower Group.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The who?
MR. ENGEL: Dower Group.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you are the group of which? So you are one of the -- hold on. All right. I'm sorry, your name is?

MR. ENGEL: Bradley Engel.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Engel. All
right. Who else is here from the Dower Group? Introduce yourself, ma'am.

MS. CURRENT: Leslie Current, C-U-R-R-E-N-T.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who else is here from the Dower Group? Your name.

MR. EDGAR: Kevin Edgar, E-D-G-A-R. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All right. Let me -- who else is here? Introduce yourself and tell me what group you belong to, please.

MS. TAMMANY CRUSE: Karen Tammany. I represent the Citizens Association of Georgetown and ANC-2E.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But are you here for the ANC or for the Citizens Association of Georgetown?

MS. TAMMANY CRUSE: I'm representing both today.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Yes, ma'am?

MS. ELIZABETH EMES: I'm Betsy Emes. I'm representing a Group of Seven, abutting seven neighbors, also abutting property owner.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
MS. ELIZABETH EMES: Elizabeth Emes, I think you have it down as.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You are? I'm
sorry, $I$ didn't hear. Yes, ma'am.
MS. ELIZABETH EMES: Elizabeth Emes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
Yes, sir?
MS. ELIZABETH EMES: Good morning.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir?
MS. ELIZABETH EMES: Ed.

MR. EMES: Edward Emes.
MS. ELIZABETH EMES: Abutting property owner.

MR. EMES: Abutting property owner for the past 53 years.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir?
MS. VIRGINIA EMES: My name is
Virginia Emes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry. I
was talking to --
MR. ENGEL: I have already introduced myself.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, so you are from The Dower Group?

MR. ENGEL: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am?
MS. VIRGINIA EMES: Virginia Emes, I'm an abutting neighbor at 3230 N Street.

MS. ELIZABETH EMES: You're owner.
MS. VIRGINIA EMES: No, owner, excuse me.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Ames?
MS. VIRGINIA EMES: Emes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Emes.
MS. VIRGINIA EMES: E-M-E-S.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So we have the ANC is here. We have the Citizens Association of Georgetown, the abutting property owners, we have Mr. Emes, Ms. Emes and V. Radley -- well, okay, V. Radley Emes.

All right. So Elizabeth Emes, you are also -- who is Elizabeth Emes again? I'm sorry. So you are an abutting property owner and you are also representing the Group of Five or More. Is that correct?

MS. ELIZABETH EMES: That's correct.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Now, Mr. -- who represents -- who is the designated representative for The Dower Group?

MS. CURRENT: He is not here, the representative isn't, because he was at the Roll Call Hearing.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, who is
that? Who was that?
MS. CURRENT: Benjamin Dower.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Benjamin. So he was at the Roll Call Hearing?

MS. CURRENT: Yeah, he has been at all of the other hearings.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And so we have -- and then we have three Members. All right. So one more time again. Who is here again from The Dower Group? There is three people here from The Dower Group.

Now, The Dower Group, you need five members.

MS. CURRENT: Right. And the other member, Phillippe Reines, he also was at some of the other hearings.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Was he at -this is my understanding. What I'm told, I needed four people here today who was not at the Roll Call Hearing and I only have three.

MS. CURRENT: We were told that as long as we were -- some of the people showed up at other hearings, only the people who hadn't showed up at any hearings had to be here today. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. All right. We have two hearings for five people to show up, meaning that between the Roll Call hearing and this hearing, I need to see five people.

So what I'm being told is one person was at the Roll Call Hearing and there is only three people here today.

MS. CURRENT: The Roll Call Hearing was the very first one?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.
MS. CURRENT: There were two.
MR. ENGEL: There were two.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who was there?

MS. CURRENT: Ben and Phillippe. And then there - -

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ben who?

MS. CURRENT: Ben Dower.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who is Phillippe?

MS. CURRENT: Pardon me?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who is Phillippe? Phillippe who?

MS. CURRENT: Well, he is the fifth person on our --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No.

MS. CURRENT: Reines, R-E-I-N-E-S.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The information I'm told is that at this hearing, I needed to see four people, that's what my notes tell me, so unless -- because when you are granted conditional standing at that hearing, from what I was told, that there was only one. There was only one person at that hearing from your group and that was Benjamin Dower.

So unless you can -- and I'm not sure,
do we have information like who was at the Roll Call from The Dower Group? No one else was there?

MS. MBIMADONG: That's what was noted from the majority --

MS. CURRENT: Does it matter at the last hearing that there was more than one?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What last hearing was that? This is the first hearing.

MS. TAMMANY CRUSE: Only two. The other was mediation.

MS. CURRENT: Oh, the mediation.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So all right. So because there -- because five members are not here today, then I'm going to dismiss The Dower Group. You can -- you are welcome to join another group, but the recommendation I'm making to the Board is that we are going to dismiss you because you did not have five or more members to be granted your -- to be granted standing.

MS. TAMMANY CRUSE: Mr. Anderson, may I ask you a question?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am. MS. TAMMANY CRUSE: Say something? CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am. MS. TAMMANY CRUSE: Right off the bat, Mr. Dower made a comment and a request that this hearing is on Yom Kippur and some of the protestants from The Dower Group were Jewish. And he asked to have this hearing put off either for next week or have it last week. All the protestants agreed to that.

Mr. Elliott did not, but $I$ don't know Phillippe Reines, but if he is one of the Jewish members, it makes sense that he would not be here.

## CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But I don't

 know, someone had to tell us that. I'm not -- as I said before, I'm not aware of that. All I'm being told is that, and $I$ have not seen anything in writing, and the motion that I'm making today for the Board to dismiss that group, the designated representative will have 10 days to appeal our decision and so if they can provide --and each side would have, if they can provide reasonable basis why is it that four members are not here today, then the Board will reconsider its decision and grant them standing.

But even if standing is not granted, they can be a part of any other group and still participate, it's just that they do not have their own standing.

So do you have anything to say, ma'am? No? So with that said, I then make a motion to deny standing to The Dower Group because they did not -- we do not have a proper constituted Group of Five or More to be granted standing.

Is there a second?
MEMBER ALBERTI: Second.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Alberti has seconded the motion.

All those in favor say aye.
ALL: Aye.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed?
The matter passes 5-0-0.
MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Abstain.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, the matter passed 4 -- I apologize, Mr. Silverstein. That Mr. Silverstein abstains.

So it's 4-0-1 with Mr. Silverstein in abstention.

The Board will issue a decision. The group will have 10 days to appeal the decision to provide reasonable cause why is it that between the Roll Call Hearing and this hearing that five members are -- did not appear. And the Board will -- once if that is done within the 10 days from the decision, then we will reconsider to make a determination where we go.

All right. So all the other groups were granted standing at the Roll Call, so we are fine. Are there any other -- any preliminary issues that needs to be addressed today by any side?

This matter then is scheduled for a Protest Hearing on October 3rd at 1:30 p.m. All right.

MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Mr. Chairman?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Silverstein?

MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I would just beg your indulgence to say that the inability of someone to attend a hearing today for religious reasons on Yom Kippur is to me both compelling and acceptable as a reason, but that individual must have that as the reason. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And thank you.
But my position is that $I$ do not know if something was done in writing. I don't think it's acceptable after the fact to say the reason why I wasn't here was because of a religious holiday. But if, as you stated, something was put in writing to the Agency prior to today's hearing to say that -- I'm not aware of that, but if that's in our records --

MS. TAMMANY CRUSE: There was much communication back and forth emails.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So if that's fine, then $I$ don't have a problem with it, but I do not want the person to say today, it's not --
we all know that today was our Jewish holiday, so but I don't want someone to say well, the reason why I didn't show up is because of the Jewish holiday, because I'll be presupposing that you were celebrating this holiday, which -- without knowing.

So if that representative had informed us that this was an issue for them, then, of course, the Board will look at that and make a decision once a motion comes in to ask for reinstatement of that group.

All right. Stating -- now that this hearing is scheduled for October 3, 2018 at 1:30, now that we have scheduled this matter for a Protest Hearing, there are a few things that I would like to instruct the applicant and the protestant about, so that the Protest Hearing is focused and addresses only those issues that are being protested.

The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to this case. You should have received by
electronic or regular mail a letter explaining the protest process, a copy of the Protest Information Form and a copy of the Exhibit Form. If you do not have these documents, please, contact Assistant General Counsel April Randall following this hearing.

It is imperative that you review these rules closely and that you follow them before and during the Protest Hearing. You are also required to complete and submit a Protest Information Form (PIF) and the Exhibit Form seven days before the date of the hearing. These two forms and accompanying documents need to be submitted to ABRA's Legal Division and to all opposing parties in this matter.

If we do not receive a copy of your PIF, your application or your protest, whichever side you are representing, may be subject to dismissal. Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of the Exhibit Form and the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded from the record upon a finding that the opposing party has been
prejudiced or no good cause for failure to submit has been shown.

Likewise witnesses other than a party may be subject to exclusion if not identified on the PIF.

Accordingly, these forms are very important as they greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. They likewise provide notice to opposing parties enabling them to better prepare for the hearing.

Just one thing I just want to make clear to the parties, so the parties I would hope that, there are several parties available, you will continue to have discussions to have a settlement agreement.

For the groups, I just want to let the groups know if there is a settlement agreement by the ANC, then the Group of Five or More falls, even if there is a settlement agreement by the ANC, a citizen association still will move forward, can still move forward with its protest and each individual abutting property owner can still move forward with a protest.

The only party who will -- would fall if there is a settlement agreement by an ANC, would be the Group of Five or More.

I do hope that because it appears there are several interested, I do hope that you are able to settle this matter. I prefer when matters are settled, because this is your neighborhood. You know what goes on in your neighborhood and you know what works for your neighborhood, rather than come to the Board for-I'm not sure if any of us live in the neighborhood, so therefore we would be making decisions about the operation of your community. And I prefer when the parties negotiate and come
up to an agreement.
But if not, 1 will see you then on October 3rd at 1:30. And have a good day. Thank you very much.

MS. CURRENT: Thank you very much.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. And remember, The Dower Group, you have 10 days from once we issue the written decision today to provide reason why the five, the fifth person was not here today. Okay. Thank you.
