18	Now that we have scheduled this matter
19	for a Protest Hearing, there are a few things I
20	would like to instruct the applicant and the
21	protestants about so that the protest hearing is
22	focused and addresses only those issues that are

1 being protested.

2	The Board does not intend to hear
3	testimony on matters that are not relevant to
4	this case. You should have received by
5	electronic or regular mail a letter explaining
6	the protest process, a copy of the Protest
7	Information Form and a copy of the Exhibit Form.
8	If you do not have these documents, please,
9	contact Assistant General Counsel Ms. April
10	Randall following this hearing.
11	It is imperative that you review the
12	rules closely and adhere to them before and
13	during the Protest Hearing. You are also
14	required to complete and submit the Protest
15	Information Form (PIF) and the Exhibit Form seven
16	days before the date of the hearing. These two
17	forms and accompanying documents need to be
18	submitted to ABRA's Legal Division and to all
19	opposing parties in this matter.
20	If we do not receive a copy of your
21	PIF, your application or your protest, whichever
22	side you are representing, may be subject to

1 dismissal. Likewise, if we do not receive a copy 2 of the Exhibit Form and the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded from the record 3 4 upon a finding that the opposing party has been 5 prejudiced or no good cause for the failure to submit has been shown. 6 7 Likewise witnesses other than a party 8 may also be subject to exclusion if not identified in the PIF. 9 Accordingly, these forms are very 10 11 important as they greatly assist the Board in 12 narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during 13 14 the hearing. They likewise provide notice to the opposing parties enabling them to better prepare 15 16 for the hearing. 17 We thank you greatly for your 18 cooperation. 20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, that's
21	very good. And I have always told folks if you
22	do not show up on April 25th, I will not take it

1	personally. Okay? All right.

14	And if it looks like you guys are			
15	going are making progress. If you can			
16	don't look at the 25th as your deadline, because			
17	if you do, we will have to clear the schedule and			
18	do all this work.			
19	If you can do it and get it done a			
20	week or two ahead, we can give someone else that			
21	slot. Our investigators don't have to do all			
22	that work and it will make things better not just

1 for you folks, but also someone else will have 2 that opportunity to come before us earlier. We are not delayed and we are not doing unnecessary 3 4 work. So if you can do that, it would be 5 much appreciated by all of us. Thank you. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. 8 I again thank the parties and as I Silverstein. 9 said before, I do hear what Mr. Silverstein states, but again, sometimes the fate of coming 10 here are some people, they come here and they 11 12 settle the matter right here and we can memorialize it. 13 14 As Mr. Silverstein said, the earlier you can, but I'm not going to hold it against you 15 16 if it's done here at the table, because I want 17 people to feel comfortable and that they are 18 making decisions that are in the -- that they 19 think is going to represent the community. 20 Okay.
