§1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).

### OFFER IN COMPROMISE FOR BOARD APPROVAL

The District of Columbia, jointly with the licensee (respondent) submits this Offer in Compromise (OIC) to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board), as authorized by 23 DCMR § 1611.5, for approval by the Board.

The Parties understand that if the Board approves the OIC, appeal and judicial review are waived under 23 DCMR § 1611.6, scheduled hearings will be vacated, and the case will conclude. Respondent will be obligated to abide by the OIC terms shown below. If the Board does not approve the OIC, the matter will be continued to a Show Cause Hearing on May 5, 2021.

The respondent has been advised that there is no obligation to accept the OIC.

Respondent has been advised, through service of the Notice of Status Hearing and

Show Cause Hearing that at a Show Cause Hearing, respondent may: be represented

by legal counsel, have subpoenas issued to require the production of witnesses and

evidence, produce witnesses and evidence, cross-examine witnesses, and apply to the Board for a qualified interpreter.

The OIC terms are as follows.

<u>Charge I</u>: Failure to follow a Board Order by allowing the sale, service or consumption of alcohol on the premises while the establishment's license was suspended.

Statutory Authority: D.C. Code § 25-823(a)(6)

(1) <u>Fine</u>: n/a

(2) Suspension: n/a

(3) Other term: Surrender license for safekeeping. Following the Board's approval of this OIC, Respondent shall immediately cease all sale and service of alcohol and ensure that all alcoholic beverages are secure and not accessible to the public for sale, service, or consumption. Respondent shall surrender the license for safekeeping and all alcohol will be removed from respondent's premises by 12:00 p.m. on Friday, May 7, 2021. Respondent shall file an application for the transfer of respondent's ABC License within 30 days of the Board's Order accepting this OIC. Respondent's owners, including David Rountree, will have no ownership interest in the new license holder, who shall be a bona fide purchaser. If a transfer application cannot be filed in 30 days, then within the same period, respondent must file a report with the Board detailing efforts to secure a purchaser or the license shall be canceled. Respondent may not withdraw a transfer application if the Board disapproves the transfer but may file a new transfer application within 30 days of disapproval. If the license is not transferred to a new owner by November 3, 2021, the license shall be deemed cancelled by the Board, provided that any request for an extension for reasonable cause may be made to the Board and granted or denied at its discretion.

(3) Other term: See Charge I, Other term.
