3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Our
4 next case is Case No. 18-CMP-00105, District
5 Taco, License No. 92791.

6 Would the parties, please, approach
7 and identify themselves for the record, please?

8 Well, are we expecting somebody, Ms.
9 Gephardt?

10 MS. GEPHARDT: It was my understanding
11 that, yes, they would be here.

12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This matter was
13 scheduled for 9:30. Well, all right, there are
14 two cases. Cases No. 18-CMP-00105, District
15 Taco, License No. 92791, and Case No. 18-CMP-
16 00158, District Taco.

17 Would the parties approach and
18 identify themselves for the record?

19 Do you want me to move on and recall
20 this case?

21 MS. GEPHARDT: Yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

1 MS. GEPHARDT: I can call and see what
2 is going on.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

4 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
5 went off the record at 10:21 a.m. and resumed at
6 1:43 p.m.)

7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. We
8 are back on the record. Let me call -- this is
9 from this morning's calendar.

10 We have a Show Cause Hearing (Status).
11 It was scheduled for 9:30. I called the case,
12 but the licensee was not here this morning. So
13 let me call the case again.

14 Case No. 18-CMP-00105, District Taco,
15 License No. 92791 and Case No. 18-CMP-00158,
16 District Taco.

17 Would the parties, please, approach
18 and identify themselves for the record, please?

19 MS. GEPHARDT: Good afternoon.
20 Chrissy Gephardt here on behalf of the Office of
21 the Attorney General.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,

1 Ms. Gephardt.

2 MS. GEPHARDT: Good morning.

3 MEMBER SHORT: Good afternoon.

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry. As
5 I said this matter was scheduled for this morning
6 at 9:30, so go ahead, Ms. -- go ahead, sir.

7 MR. MEDHURST: Yes, I apologize for
8 not being here. My name is Chris Medhurst. I
9 have the District Taco.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is
11 your role at the establishment, sir?

12 MR. MEDHURST: I'm the vice president
13 of finance and operations division.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I guess
15 what I'm -- do we have an authorization letter,
16 Ms. Gephardt? I don't know if his name is on the
17 license.

18 MS. GEPHARDT: Did you --

19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Chris, what's
20 your last name?

21 MR. MEDHURST: Medhurst.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, yeah, he is

1 here.

2 MS. GEPHARDT: Okay.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your name is
4 here. Go ahead. All right. All right. Are
5 there any preliminary matters on this case?

6 MS. GEPHARDT: Yes, yes, there is a
7 preliminary matter, actually on both cases. For
8 18-CMP-00105, the licensee has agreed to an Offer
9 in Compromise to consist of a \$2,000 fine to be
10 paid within 30 days. If the fine is not paid
11 within 30 days, the license would be suspended
12 indefinitely until the fine is paid.

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Mr.
14 Medhurst, it's my understanding that there is an
15 Offer in Compromise and the Offer in Compromise
16 is that there is a fine of \$2,000 payable in 30
17 days. If the fine is not payable in 30 days, the
18 license will be suspended until the fine has been
19 paid.

20 Is this your understanding of the
21 Offer in Compromise, sir?

22 MR. MEDHURST: Yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

2 MR. MEDHURST: We have sent two checks
3 this morning.

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you have
5 paid it already?

6 MR. MEDHURST: They should be in the
7 mail.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
9 Well, are you aware that by accepting an Offer in
10 Compromise, that you are giving up your right to
11 a hearing?

12 MR. MEDHURST: Yes.

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And also by
14 accepting an Offer in Compromise, that you are
15 giving up your right to appeal this matter?

16 MR. MEDHURST: Yes.

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
18 With that said, I make a motion that the Offer in
19 Compromise of a fine of \$2,000 payable in 30 days
20 be accepted. If the fine is not payable in 30
21 days, the license will be suspended until the
22 fine has been paid. Is there a second?
