3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The
4	next case on our calendar is Case No. 18-CMP-
5	00211, District Taco, License No. 92791.
6	Will the parties, please, approach and
7	identify themselves for the record, please?
8	MR. SOUSA: Christopher Sousa for the
9	District of Columbia.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning
11	again, Mr. Sousa.
12	MR. MEDHERST: Chris Medherst. C-H-R-
13	I-S M-E-D-H-E-R-S-T.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
15	Mr. Medherst.
16	MR. MEDHERST: District Taco.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
18	MR. MEDHERST: Good morning.
19	MR. HERNANDEZ: Jose Hernandez,
20	Regional Manager.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
22	Mr. Hernandez.

1	Mr. Sousa, are there any preliminary
2	matters in this case?
3	MR. SOUSA: Yes. It's my
4	understanding that an Offer in Compromise has
5	been reached between the parties and is ready to
6	present to the Board.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is
8	that, sir?
9	MR. SOUSA: For the only charge, no
10	ABC manager, a sixth secondary tier violation
11	within four years. The Offer in Compromise is
12	\$2,000 to be paid within 30 days or the license
13	shall be suspended indefinitely until this fine
14	is paid.
15	And I understand that the licensed
16	establishment has already paid it.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It has been
18	paid?
19	MR. SOUSA: Yes, they sent the payment
20	already to us, to OAG, which was forwarded on to
21	ABRA.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. All

1	right. Mr. Medherst, it is my understanding,
2	sir, that there is an Offer in Compromise and the
3	Offer in Compromise is that there is a fine of
4	\$2,000 payable within 30 days. If the fine has
5	not been payable within 30 days, the license will
6	be suspended.
7	Is this your understanding, sir, of
8	the Offer in Compromise?
9	MR. MEDHERST: Yes.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you aware
11	that by accepting an Offer in Compromise, that
12	you are giving up your right to a hearing?
13	MR. MEDHERST: Yes.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you also
15	aware that by accepting an Offer in Compromise,
16	that you are giving up your right to appeal this
17	matter?
18	MR. MEDHERST: (No audible answer.)
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You have to say
20	it.
21	MR. MEDHERST: Yes.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Because it's

being recorded, so that's why. 1 2 MR. MEDHERST: Yes. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 3 Ι then make a motion that the Offer in Compromise 4 5 of a fine of \$2,000 payable within 30 days be If the fine is not payable in 30 days, 6 accepted. 7 the license will be suspended. Is there a second? 8 9 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Second. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Silverstein 11 has seconded the motion. 12 All those in favor say aye. 13 ALL: Aye. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed? 15 The matter passes 6-0-0. 16 Mr. Medherst, since you are the owner 17 of the establishment, this is your sixth 18 secondary tier violation of not having an ABC 19 manager. What's going on, sir? The case is 20 over, that's why I'm having this conversation 21 with you. And I'm not sure how big your business

is, but you like giving us money?

No, I don't at all. 1 MR. MEDHERST: 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So --3 MR. MEDHERST: And --4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- what can you 5 do to improve that, sir? MR. MEDHERST: -- we have changed 6 7 several things. I have told you guys the plan last time. I invited Alberto here who is the 8 9 regional manager to -- I think it is more 10 meaningful coming from him, hearing his plan and 11 how --12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But you are the 13 owner still, so I -- because I was about to ask 14 you normally when I call folks up, I ask them who 15 -- what role they play, but I didn't ask you, 16 because I looked down on my briefing and it said 17 that you are the owner. 18 So I know that you brought your 19 general manager, that's good. But it doesn't 20 really matter, because he is -- you are the one 21 that we are always going to hold accountable. 22 MR. MEDHERST: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you have to tell us. And this is just for you, sir, because it's not the Agency's position that you continue coming and to give you a fine and you pay the fine. I don't know how large your business is and I'm hoping that this is not considered just a business expense, but it's the sixth time you are doing it, sir.

MR. MEDHERST: No, I -- it's not acceptable as far as we plan on operating, the way that we plan on operating the business. We have set up a scheduling system and sort of tracking our ABRA managers and which personnel actually have the license, so that if we have a schedule that doesn't have an ABRA manager on it, it notifies us. And I think that has been very helpful in helping us avoid any of these problems since September.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, how large is this establishment? How many employees are we talking about here?

MR. MEDHERST: We have about 400

1	employees.
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You have 400
3	employees, sir? You could talk to the Agency to
4	find out how is it that what needs to be done,
5	because if you have 400 employees, that should be
6	an easy fix.
7	MR. MEDHERST: Okay. All right.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
9	MR. MEDHERST: I agree.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
11	MR. MEDHERST: Thanks.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. You
13	can sign-off on the paperwork, but I was told the
14	fee was that the fine was paid, but it's just
15	to make sure. It has to be paid in 30 days.
16	MR. MEDHERST: All right.
17	(Whereupon, the Show Cause (Status)
18	Hearing was concluded at 9:49 a.m.)
