The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The
4	next case on our calendar is Case Number 19-CC-
5	00115, Dolan Uyghur Restaurant, License Number
6	104335.
7	Would the parties please approach and
8	identify themselves for the record, please?
9	MR. LUI: Good morning, Mr.
10	Chairperson. John Lui, on behalf of the
11	Government.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
13	Mr. Lui.
14	MR. LUMUKANDA: Good morning, Chairman
15	Anderson. D'maz Lumukanda, on behalf of the
16	Licensee, Kroran Uyghur Restaurant, trading as
17	Dolan Uyghur.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, sir,
19	who's with you today, sir?
20	MR. LUMUKANDA: This is the owner of
21	the restaurant, Mr. Abdul Karim.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry,
23	what's the last name? I need to know, because
24	I'm going to address him after this is over.
25	What's the name?

1	MR. KARIM: Last name, Abdul Karim.		
2	Abdul Karim.		
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Abdul		
4	MR. KARIM: Karim.		
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Karim? Mr.		
6	Karim.		
7	MR. KARIM: Yes.		
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Are		
9	there any preliminary matters in this case?		
10	MR. LUI: Yes, Mr. Chairperson.		
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is		
12	that, sir?		
13	MR. LUI: There is an offer in		
14	compromise to present to the Board.		
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is		
16	that, please?		
17	MR. LUI: Charge 1, sale to a minor,		
18	the offer in compromise is a warning.		
19	And for Charge 2, failure to take		
20	reasonable steps necessary to ascertain legal		
21	drinking age, this charge was dismissed. The		
22	employee in fact checked the minor's ID.		
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All		
24	right. Mr. Lumukanda, it is my understanding		
25	that there is an offer in compromise.		

And the offer in compromise is that 1 2 for Charge 1, that there is a warning and for 3 Charge 2, the matter will be dismissed. Is this you and your client's 4 understanding of the offer in compromise? 5 MR. LUMUKANDA: Yes, sir. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your client 8 aware that by accepting the offer in compromise 9 that they are giving up their right to a hearing? 10 MR. LUMUKANDA: Yes, sir. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your client 12 also aware that by accepting an offer in 13 compromise that they're giving up their right to 14 appeal this matter? 15 MR. LUMUKANDA: Yes, sir. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: With that said, 16 17 I make a motion that the offer in compromise that 18 Charge 1, a warning will be issued, and for 19 Charge 2, the Charge 2 will be dismissed. 20 Is there a second? 21 MEMBER SHORT: Second. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has 23 seconded the motion. All those in favor, say 24 aye. 25 (Chorus of ayes.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed? 1 2 The matter passes 4-0-0. The Board will be 3 issuing a Board Order in this case. Mr. Karim, I'm glad that you are here 4 5 today, sir. And I don't understand this case, okay? 6 7 I really do not understand how a 15-8 year-old can come to your establishment and buy 9 alcohol. 10 And I do not understand how a 15-year-11 old, who looks like a 15-year-old, will provide 12 her identification to your employee and your 13 employee still sells her alcohol. Can you 14 explain that to me, sir? 15 I need -- Mr. Lumukanda, I know that 16 you are the representative, but the case is over. 17 So, I need him to address this, sir. I don't -- I need him to address this, 18 because this is just, this is beyond excusable, 19 20 that we send a 15-year-old to your establishment, 21 who looks like a 15-year-old and who -- it would 22 be a better case if your server said, or whoever 23 did the sale, to say, we were busy, we didn't 24 check the ID.

But they checked the ID.

The ID is

completely different, it's a different type of 1 2 So, how can we explain this? 3 MR. KARIM: I apologize. I apologize. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If your lawyer 4 5 wants to, if your representative --MR. LUMUKANDA: Sure. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- wants to --8 yes. 9 MR. LUMUKANDA: Sure. He definitely understands the seriousness of this matter and 10 11 I've explained it to him, that this is absolutely 12 unacceptable. When the individuals do these sorts of 13 14 stings, the ABC Board is in no position to try to 15 misrepresent them as an adult, you purposefully bring in individuals who look clearly like 16 17 they're younger, so as not to confuse the 18 Licensee, to make sure that they're compliant in 19 this matter. 20 He's spoken to and has -- I'm not sure 21 if the individual is still working with him, but 22 he definitely understands the importance of this 23 matter. 24 And he in fact is obtaining a

manager's license today, or having his bartender

come and obtain a manager's license, and also get 1 2 some additional training. 3 But he definitely apologizes, he understands the seriousness of this matter, this 4 is the first time this has occurred. 5 And I understand the Board does take 6 7 this absolutely seriously and he does as well. 8 And we're making every measure that 9 something like this does not happen in the future. 10 11 But we certainly understand your point 12 and your position, and presenting the ID is about 13 as clear as you possibly can get with showing 14 that you're 15, and the individual did do that. 15 So, he understands the seriousness and 16 the importance of that. And in the future, we 17 will work to make sure that this does not happen 18 again. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I hope so, sir. 20 MR. LUMUKANDA: Yes. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Normally, for a 22 first time violation, we don't bring you in. MR. LUMUKANDA: It's a fine. 23 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's 25 administratively, we issue a warning. But for

	every case that we send a 15-year-old to an	
2	establishment, who looks 15, she looks 15, so it	
3	can't be that and if she was 18 or 19, you	
4	wouldn't have been brought in today, but she	
5	looks 15.	
6	And she shows you an ID that says that	
7	she was born prior to 1999. I mean, but it says	
8	she was born like in 2004. I mean, anyone can	
9	calculate that if someone is born in 2004, that	
10	they're not 21.	
11	Thank you, sir. The matter is	
12	dismissed.	
13	MR. LUMUKANDA: Thank you, sir.	
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We'll issue a	
15	Board Order in this case.	
16	MR. LUMUKANDA: Thank you, sir.	
17	MR. KARIM: Thank you.	
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're welcome.	
19	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter	
20	went off the record at 9:57 a.m.)
