The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We are back on
4 the record. Our next case is a series of Fact-
5 Finding Hearings regarding Republic Restoratives
6 regarding a one-day substantial change
7 application for November 9th through November the
8 11th.

9 There is also an application for The
10 Emporiyum for the same period of time, November
11 9th through November 11th.

12 And also another application for The
13 Emporiyum for November 10th through November 11th.

14 And one of the reasons why -- good
15 afternoon. Can -- would the parties, please --
16 well, you are already here, but can you, please,
17 identify yourself for the record, please?

18 MR. HUDSON: Yes, I can start. My
19 name is Stuart Hudson with The Emporiyum Company,
20 LLC, the event organizer for the event --

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You said
22 Stuart. What's your last name, sir?

1 MR. HUDSON: Hudson.

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hudson?

3 MR. HUDSON: H-U-D-S-O-N.

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. I'm
5 sorry, you said you are -- who are you again?
6 Not your name.

7 MR. HUDSON: The owner of The
8 Emporiyum Companies, LLC, which is the event
9 organizer for the event in question.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.

11 MR. BALL: I'm Stephen Ball. I'm an
12 independent contractor who is handling all of The
13 Emporiyum's permitting.

14 MS. STOCKRAHM: I'm Kate Stockrahm,
15 from the Republic.

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your last name,
17 ma'am?

18 MS. STOCKRAHM: Stockrahm, S-T-O-C-K-
19 R-A-H-M, as in Mary.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who are
21 you?

22 MS. STOCKRAHM: I am from Republic

1 Restoratives. We are going to be a vendor at The
2 Emporium.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who are you at
4 that establishment? What's your --

5 MS. STOCKRAHM: Event Director for our
6 space.

7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And you, sir?

8 MR. BROWN: My name is Walker Brown.
9 I think probably for the record I'm Harry Walker
10 Brown. We are also a vendor at The Emporium,
11 the owner and founder of Lubanzi Wines, LLC DBA
12 Cape Venture.

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I
14 think -- so why don't you -- whoever wants to
15 start. When you speak, identify yourself for the
16 record, please. So just tell us about this event
17 and what it is that you are seeking from the
18 Board, please.

19 MR. HUDSON: Absolutely. My name is
20 Stuart Hudson, Emporium Companies, LLC. The
21 event is, in essence, a food and drink festival
22 that happens over the course of three days in the

1 Dock 5 space of Union Market. There will be a
2 collection of food and drink vendors. Two of the
3 drink vendors who are here, tickets will be sold
4 -- are being sold to the public for entry and
5 only ticketed folks will be able to enter. They
6 will have access to the roughly 90 food and drink
7 vendors who are present on-site and we are
8 requesting approval for the permit to sample
9 alcohol on-site.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So who is
11 requesting -- who has applied for a one -- so you
12 are from the --

13 MR. HUDSON: Event organizer, sir.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
15 This is part -- part of the concern that we have
16 had is that I believe that there are -- who is in
17 charge? Who is in charge of the event?

18 MR. HUDSON: I am.

19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So
20 you are the person. So you are Mr. Hudson. So
21 you are the one that -- so you are ultimately in
22 charge of this and that?

1 MR. HUDSON: Yes, sir.

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Because part of
3 the problem that we have, I think there are three
4 applications and they are -- one person, and I
5 don't have the name in front of me, but one
6 person applied for November 9th through the 11th
7 from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. And then we have,
8 let me see, well, the applicant -- you have
9 Republic Restoratives applied. Then you also
10 have Stuart Hudson applied. And you also have
11 Harry Brown applied.

12 And it is for different days and it's
13 different times and that's kind of confusing.
14 For under Republic Restoratives, you said 2,000
15 attendees, 30 security guards. For Stuart Hudson
16 it says 3,000 attendees, 30 security guards. And
17 for Harry Brown it's -- and his event or at least
18 his application was only for two days, which is
19 November 10th and November 11th. And he said 7,000
20 attendees, 30 security guards.

21 So what are we -- who is in charge?
22 What are the numbers? And that's why you are

1 here today.

2 MR. HUDSON: Okay.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And let us know
4 what the times and who is ultimately responsible
5 for this event.

6 MR. HUDSON: Yes, absolutely. I'm
7 Stuart Hudson, I'll be glad to clarify.

8 So the event is on November 9th, 10th
9 and 11th. On November 9th, ticket attendees will
10 only be able to attend from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.; on
11 the 10th to 11th it's 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The
12 estimated attendance, maximum attendance overall
13 for the three days is roughly 7,000. The per day
14 attendance on Friday estimated around 700;
15 Saturday estimated a little over 3,000 and Sunday
16 a little over 2,000, so that's the schedule and
17 the total estimated attendance, per day
18 attendance for the event.

19 Oh, and I'm sorry, attendees as well
20 are entered in at scheduled times, based on their
21 -- based on the tickets they hold. So there will
22 be a certain number of attendees that are allowed

1 in at 10:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., 12:30 and then 1:30
2 p.m. to ensure that there is a constant flow of
3 attendees that does not exceed 2,000 in the space
4 at any given time.

5 The estimates of security personnel,
6 which include hired security professionals, check
7 in and ticketing services as well as staff and
8 volunteers that receive training from the
9 security personnel prior to the event, total of
10 30 as you mentioned.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So why are they
12 -- and maybe you can also explain to me, it may
13 be simple. So why three applications? Why not
14 just one?

15 MR. HUDSON: All right. So the
16 primary application of The Emporium Companies,
17 LLC put in and Stephen couldn't -- I'm not sure
18 I'm using the correct terminology here. But it's
19 for on-premises consumptions, sampling. It
20 covers the entire event, that covers all alcohol
21 vendors at the event.

22 The two additional substantial change

1 permits that have been placed or that have been
2 submitted for your review are specific to the
3 vendors who wish to have -- sell for off-premises
4 consumption, sell bottles of their products for
5 folks to leave their premises and enjoy
6 elsewhere.

7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So Mr. Brown,
8 you are only going to be at the event for the 10th
9 and the 11th?

10 MR. BROWN: So I'll be in attendance
11 at the event for -- my company will be in
12 attendance at the event for all three days. It
13 was my intention only to sample products and not
14 sell product for off-premise consumption on that
15 evening of the 9th, Friday the 9th, November 9th,
16 but then for me to sample, sell for on-premise
17 consumption as well as sell for off-premise
18 consumption on the 10th and the 11th.

19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. And
20 who is -- hold on. Okay. So you are Mr. -- all
21 right. So who is Republic Restoratives?

22 MS. STOCKRAHM: I represent. Sarah is

1 out of town, so the person who actually submitted
2 her application is not the person who is
3 representing us today.

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Well, it
5 didn't give the name. It just says the applicant
6 is --

7 MS. STOCKRAHM: Okay.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- Republic
9 Restoratives.

10 MS. STOCKRAHM: Right.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

12 MS. STOCKRAHM: I'm not.

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. But you
14 are representing Republic Restoratives?

15 MS. STOCKRAHM: Yes.

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And so you plan
17 to be there all -- I mean, you are asking for a
18 substantial change to bring your license for all
19 three days?

20 MS. STOCKRAHM: Correct.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

22 MS. STOCKRAHM: It is our hope to be

1 able to sell bottles on Friday, November 9th, as
2 well.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Go
4 ahead, Mr. Short.

5 MEMBER SHORT: Again, you said you're
6 going to fill bottles where?

7 MS. STOCKRAHM: I'm sorry, can you
8 repeat that?

9 MEMBER SHORT: You are going to refill
10 the bottles. Where are you going to do that?

11 MS. STOCKRAHM: Our distillery is
12 located in D.C., so we already have our on-sales
13 -- our on-premise sales license. We are just
14 applying for a change of use, so that we can sell
15 bottles from that space. They will be filled at
16 our distillery. Nothing is happening on-site at
17 the event.

18 MEMBER SHORT: So a lot of this could
19 be off-premise --

20 MS. STOCKRAHM: Correct.

21 MEMBER SHORT: -- bottles?

22 MS. STOCKRAHM: Yes.

1 MEMBER SHORT: Have you ever done this
2 before?

3 MS. STOCKRAHM: We have done markets
4 before, yes. So last year -- the law has changed
5 recently that we were only allowed six permits
6 last time through, so we weren't able to
7 participate in events such as this. We did the
8 Dupont market and some of the fresh farm markets
9 before.

10 MEMBER SHORT: How many people were
11 involved with that?

12 MS. STOCKRAHM: The fresh farm
13 markets, goodness, we usually send at least two
14 representatives from our space, but the actual
15 vendors are -- the vendor count is a little bit
16 smaller. I want to say more like 15 to 20 per
17 market.

18 MR. HUDSON: He is asking attendance
19 for the --

20 MS. STOCKRAHM: Oh, attendance.

21 MR. HUDSON: -- people. You're asking
22 people that shop, right?

1 MEMBER SHORT: Yes.

2 MS. STOCKRAHM: That shop. That I
3 have no concept of unfortunately. I'm not
4 usually the person who organizes our markets.

5 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Have any of you
6 ever been before the Mayor's Task Force, an event
7 such as this, and got any approvals?

8 MR. HUDSON: Not from the Mayor's Task
9 Force, but we have been through the DCRA process
10 for all of our permitting. We have been through
11 Department of Health. We have been through --

12 MEMBER SHORT: Yeah, I saw the mapping
13 and the --

14 MR. HUDSON: We have been through MPD.
15 We have been through --

16 MEMBER SHORT: Yes, that's what I
17 wanted to hear.

18 MR. HUDSON: -- DC Fire. We have
19 received all of our approvals. The last piece of
20 that will take place Tuesday where we will get
21 our tent permit, but that's the only
22 outstanding --

1 MEMBER SHORT: That comes from the
2 Fire Marshal, right?

3 MR. HUDSON: -- for the tent permit,
4 sir, comes from DCRA, the Special Events Office
5 there. So they got -- I was supposed to pick
6 that up this morning, but they were a little
7 behind with some issues with the horse show, so
8 they asked me to come back Tuesday to pick that
9 up.

10 MEMBER SHORT: Which tent company are
11 you employing?

12 MR. BALL: Loane Bros.

13 MEMBER SHORT: And they have done
14 business in Washington here before?

15 MR. BALL: Yes, they have provided the
16 tent on-site for this event in multiple previous
17 years.

18 MEMBER SHORT: How much off-premises
19 alcohol will you be estimating to sell? How many
20 approximately cases, bottles? How are you
21 selling?

22 MR. HUDSON: Selling by bottles is the

1 intention.

2 MR. BROWN: Selling by bottle.

3 Obviously, sales depend on consumer interest.

4 Just to speak to this event specifically, we, me

5 as an individual, held this exact license for

6 this exact event last year. So I submitted

7 essentially almost identical applications last

8 year as I did this year. I would say we have --

9 MEMBER SHORT: How did everything go

10 last year?

11 MR. BROWN: It was -- the event was

12 excellent.

13 MEMBER SHORT: How many people?

14 MR. BROWN: I would say very much in

15 line with the projections for this year.

16 MR. BALL: The big difference between

17 this year and last year is that the event

18 organizer operated the on-premise as a -- under a

19 catering license as opposed to this year coming

20 before you guys and having his own license,

21 basically. That's really the only difference in

22 the event this year at all.

1 MEMBER SHORT: So ultimately, and I
2 think the Chair asked this question before, but
3 for each day is the same person going to be the
4 person that we are going to hold responsible for
5 the event?

6 MR. HUDSON: Yes, correct. Yes.

7 MEMBER SHORT: And that would be?

8 MR. HUDSON: Myself, Stuart Hudson.

9 MEMBER SHORT: You would be there all
10 three days?

11 MR. HUDSON: Correct.

12 MEMBER SHORT: Anything happens, the
13 Fire Investigators -- I mean, not the fire, but
14 the ABRA Investigators will come see you,
15 correct?

16 MR. HUDSON: Correct.

17 MEMBER SHORT: And you will be there
18 on-site?

19 MR. HUDSON: I will. Before, after,
20 throughout.

21 MEMBER SHORT: That's all I have, Mr.
22 Chair.

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So the question
2 was that normally when we have these Fact-Finding
3 Hearings, we have an Investigator who sits here
4 who asks questions that is more knowledgeable
5 about these things to ask you questions. So now
6 we have to depend on our own expertise and ask
7 the questions. So I'm not sure that we are
8 asking all the right questions that we should
9 have.

10 MEMBER SHORT: Wristbands?

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So tell us how
12 will you ensure that you don't have underage
13 drinking.

14 MR. HUDSON: Yes. Stuart Hudson.
15 I'll be glad to answer that. Underage --
16 drinking will be permitted in two places, at the
17 entrance of the event there will be both
18 ticketing and security staff, who are responsible
19 for checking IDs of every individual that enters.
20 There will be wristbands that are available, one
21 of different colors and one wristband is for
22 those who are above 21, one wristband for below.

1 IDs will be checked, confirmed there,
2 wristbands will be applied by the ticketing staff
3 and the security staff. In addition, every
4 vendor two of which are represented here, will be
5 required to confirm the IDs and the wristbands
6 for the individuals who are interested in
7 sampling the alcohol as well as purchasing for
8 off-site consumption.

9 But as far as on-site consumption,
10 since it is open to under 21 --

11 MR. HUDSON: Right.

12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- how would
13 you prevent a person who has the --

14 MEMBER SHORT: 21 year-old wristband.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You have
16 sampling. Tell me about the on-site consumption,
17 please. Not the sampling. I understand, I know
18 you can -- because to sample, you have to stay
19 there, so that is under control. Tell me about
20 the on-site consumption of alcohol.

21 MR. HUDSON: So the on-site
22 consumption of alcohol, the samples will be

1 provided and those who wish to purchase alcohol
2 for on-site consumption can do so only with the
3 appropriate wristband and ID check.

4 The additional scenario that I think
5 you may be suggesting, although let me know if I
6 am incorrect, is for those who could be ingesting
7 alcohol who do not have the wristband and were
8 not responsible for purchasing the alcohol.

9 Security staff and volunteers will all be trained
10 and ready to identify visually those individuals
11 who have -- who are consuming alcohol not wearing
12 the appropriate wristband indicating that they
13 are not of the appropriate age. And we will
14 notify security and then be escorted out if they
15 are indeed underage and consuming alcohol.

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now one of the
17 questions that the Investigators normally ask is
18 what type of containers will you use to serve
19 alcohol? Are they clear or are they colored or--

20 MR. HUDSON: They are clear.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: They are clear.

22 All right. I know that you also stated, you said

1 30 security guards, so is it 30 security guards
2 per day or is it 30 security guards for the
3 entire event? How -- tell me how --

4 MR. HUDSON: So on-site at any given
5 time whether it is Friday, Saturday or Sunday,
6 there will be security. There will be security
7 personnel who has either training themselves or
8 well beforehand, before the event each day, go
9 through a security plan with staff and check-in
10 staff, ticketing staff among that entire group,
11 whether it is security staff, volunteers the
12 check-in staff, those -- that the total number of
13 those staff will be 30.

14 Those 30 folks will be present at any
15 given time throughout the event. With the trade-
16 offs in some cases by day with different security
17 staff coming on different days.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

19 MEMBER SHORT: Will you be serving
20 water also?

21 MR. HUDSON: Yes, sir.

22 MEMBER SHORT: What other kinds of

1 refreshments are you going to offer?

2 MR. HUDSON: You're going to run me
3 through the gauntlet here, okay. So we have got
4 folks who -- we have three tea vendors. We have
5 folks who are going carbonated water. We have
6 folks who are doing carbonated sugar beverages.
7 We have a whole host of other vendors that are
8 doing beverages to be consumed that are non-
9 alcoholic, but flavored in nature.

10 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Because some
11 events we have, they will have a certain color
12 for anybody who has an alcoholic drink and
13 another color cup for non-alcoholic drinks.

14 MR. HUDSON: Understood.

15 MEMBER SHORT: Do you have anything
16 like that planned?

17 MR. HUDSON: If that is a
18 recommendation of the Council, we will be glad to
19 do that.

20 MEMBER SHORT: I take that as a great
21 recommendation, the reason being if I'm an
22 underage person and I'm beside somebody I know

1 pretty well that has had a drink and it's the
2 same color cup, I would just give it to the --
3 I'm not saying that that would happen at your
4 event.

5 MR. HUDSON: Of course,

6 MEMBER SHORT: But those are some of
7 the safeguards we try to put in place or help put
8 in place that would prevent that from happening.

9 MR. HUDSON: Understand.

10 MEMBER SHORT: We are pretty hard
11 about underage people drinking.

12 MR. HUDSON: Understood.

13 MEMBER SHORT: You can understand why.

14 MR. HUDSON: Absolutely, sir.

15 MEMBER SHORT: What will be the
16 general ages of the people that will be at your
17 event?

18 MR. HUDSON: Over -- based on current
19 ticket numbers, over 90 percent somewhere
20 hovering between 18, 25 will be above 25. So the
21 overwhelming majority of attendees are between 25
22 and 44 with the remaining being above 45 and only

1 generally about 5 percent being below 25
2 comprising everyone up to 21.

3 MEMBER SHORT: Are you going to have
4 any porta-johns beside the facilities toilets?

5 MR. HUDSON: Yes. So there will be
6 facilities toilets and there will be porta-johns
7 that are included. If you have a copy of the
8 map, you may notice on 6th Street on the east --
9 left side of the map or east side of the
10 complex --

11 MEMBER SHORT: We have.

12 MR. BALL: We have a bigger copy.

13 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. All right.

14 Thank you.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. I'm
16 not a map reader, but I'll give it to Mr. -- I'll
17 give it to Mr. Short, he likes maps.

18 MR. HUDSON: There are listed -- there
19 are six gray, unfortunately a lot of it is gray,
20 but squares that are marked as --

21 MEMBER SHORT: I see them.

22 MR. HUDSON: -- porta-potties that

1 will be there, accessed, cleaned out at the end
2 of each day for the attendees. And there are
3 also multiple restrooms located on-site on the
4 east side of the Dock 5 area, which is shaded in
5 a light gray.

6 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. I see you have
7 a generator, so do you have permission for the
8 generator or did you talk to the --

9 MR. BALL: We --

10 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Go ahead.

11 MR. BALL: -- have put in the -- in
12 our event applications, it has all the generator
13 specifics listed. I think DCRA was giving was --
14 was basing the size of the generator, deciding
15 whether or not we were going to have to have a
16 master electrician pull that permit or not and we
17 were supposed to find out on Tuesday, when we go
18 and run through the process there.

19 MEMBER SHORT: When is the event?

20 MR. HUDSON: The event is November 9
21 through 11.

22 MEMBER SHORT: So you're going to get

1 the -- I would think -- what size is the
2 generator and what kind of fuel are you using?

3 MR. BALL: It's diesel. And it is a
4 60 watt, 60 kw.

5 MEMBER SHORT: What size are the
6 propane bottles?

7 MR. BALL: 50 pound propane tanks for
8 -- are we talking about the cooking or for the --

9 MEMBER SHORT: Just give me all. What
10 size of propane tanks will you have on-site for
11 the event?

12 MR. HUDSON: There will be 50 pound
13 propane tanks for the on-site outdoor cooking
14 that is outside of the tent. I believe there
15 will be five of those for the five vendors who
16 have on-site outdoor cooking.

17 MR. BALL: And we have submitted
18 permits to the Fire Marshal's Office for those.

19 MEMBER SHORT: That's what I wanted to
20 hear. Okay.

21 MR. BALL: And we have copies of all
22 those submissions, if you would like.

1 MEMBER SHORT: Is the Fire Department
2 going to be involved at all? EMS?

3 MR. BALL: Go ahead.

4 MR. HUDSON: So in terms of emergency
5 medical services, AMR has been contracted to be
6 on-site where the vendor -- with a table in the
7 center of the event present at -- all days to
8 provide emergency medical services if necessary.

9 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. And it all
10 sounds good. And who will be manning the First
11 Aid Station? Is that ARS?

12 MR. HUDSON: AMR, correct, yes.

13 MEMBER SHORT: AMR. And I see you
14 have the green exits for the no alcohol beyond
15 this point. Will there be security there to make
16 sure?

17 MR. HUDSON: There will be two
18 security personnel that are posted at the
19 entrance, at a primary entrance and exit, at that
20 point you referenced, as well as ticketing staff
21 that they will be aware.

22 MEMBER SHORT: And again, the agencies

1 that you have been through, you said MPD?

2 MR. BALL: I have all the signature
3 pages here. So we have been through, let's see,
4 the Metropolitan Police, Department of
5 Transportation, Department of Health, Fire, EMS,
6 Office of the Fire Marshal and the Office of Tax
7 and Revenue and we will have the final special
8 events signature on Tuesday.

9 MEMBER SHORT: Could we get a copy of
10 that, please?

11 MS. STOCKRAHM: Certainly.

12 MEMBER SHORT: She is going to make a
13 copy.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm not sure if
15 you know that Mr. Short retired as the Deputy
16 Fire Chief.

17 MR. BALL: I can tell.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I think you
19 are checking off all the boxes that --

20 MEMBER SHORT: Yes.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- and I think
22 although --

1 MR. BALL: We try to be thorough.

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- the
3 Department -- I'm sorry, what was the last office
4 you mentioned?

5 MR. HUDSON: Department of Tax.

6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Tax and
7 Revenue. Although that's not part of his
8 purview, but he normally asks about are you going
9 to pay D.C. taxes? So I think you have checked--

10 MR. HUDSON: Checked the boxes.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- off the
12 boxes from the Fire Prevention and also taxes as
13 far as Mr. Short is concerned.

14 MR. BALL: I spent this morning with
15 Lieutenant Hazel.

16 MEMBER SHORT: That feels just real
17 good when a panel comes before us and they are
18 prepared with the right information. That means
19 most people that do that have 100 percent safety.

20 MR. BALL: We try.

21 MEMBER SHORT: Okay.

22 MR. BALL: We spent this morning with

1 Lieutenant Hazel.

2 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Okay. I know.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do we have any
4 other questions by any other Board Members?

5 MEMBER SHORT: No, I'm satisfied.

6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Do
7 you have any final comments you want to make?

8 MR. HUDSON: Thank you for your time
9 this afternoon.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. And
11 I said before, the problem that when we got the
12 application it's three applications and the
13 numbers were different. The times were different
14 and so therefore the Board was concerned who was
15 ultimately in charge of the event. And I think
16 that you -- Mr. Hudson has provided the Board
17 with some assurances.

18 So I don't have a problem. So I will
19 make a motion to this Board that we --

20 MEMBER SHORT: One last thing.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Short?

22 MEMBER SHORT: We will have a Fire

1 Investigator to monitor the event, correct?

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You will -- I
3 will ask the Agency to monitor it. I will ask.

4 MEMBER SHORT: We will have the ABRA
5 Investigator there, too.

6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right. Yes, so
7 I'll --

8 MEMBER SHORT: And more than likely,
9 they will request your name.

10 MR. HUDSON: Please.

11 MEMBER SHORT: Okay.

12 MR. BALL: So we will provide contact
13 information or any other information, that way
14 they can give them a call when they are on-site.

15 MEMBER SHORT: That's good to know.

16 MR. BALL: If that's easier?

17 MEMBER SHORT: Please, that would be
18 great.

19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's fine. So
20 I then make a motion that we approve the one-day
21 -- I'm sorry, we approve the one-day substantial
22 change for Republic Restoratives, the one-day

1 temporary license application for The Emporium,
2 LLC and the one-day temporary license application
3 filed by Harry W. Brown. Is there a second?

4 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
6 seconded the motion.

7 All those in favor say aye.

8 ALL: Aye.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All those
10 opposed? The matter passes 4-0-0.

11 So the Board will -- I need one other
12 signature and you can go and pick up your license
13 as soon as we give this to you.

14 MR. HUDSON: Thank you, sir.

15 MR. BALL: Thank you.

16 MS. STOCKRAHM: Thank you.

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

18 Thank you. Have a good day.

19 All right. It is now 3:15 p.m. and we
20 are adjourned for the day. Thank you.

21 (Whereupon, the Fact-Finding Hearing
22 was concluded at 3:14 p.m.)
