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**ORDER CORRECTING BOARD ORDER NO. 2024-097**

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The Application filed by Seven Lanes, LLC, t/a Firehouse DC (Applicant), for a New Medical Cannabis Retailer's License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board (Board) Agent for a Roll Call Hearing on March 4, 2024.

On March 6, 2024, the Board issued Board Order No. 2024-097 dismissing the Protest of Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 1B. The stated reason for the Board's dismissal was due to the ANC's failure to appear at the Roll Call hearing. However, review of the Board's official record indicates that ANC 1B was in attendance and that the Board's Agent dismissed the ANC because its protest letter was facially deficient. Specifically, the ANC's protest fails to comply with the requirements of 22 DCMR 5428.

Thus, the Board now seeks to amend Order No. 2024-097 to make clear that its records reflect ANC 1B's attendance at the Roll Call hearing on March 4, 2024. However, because the ANC failed to file a legally sufficient protest letter, the dismissal of its protest stands.

### **ORDER**

The Board does hereby, this 11th day of March 2024, **DISMISS** the Protest of ANC 1B. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Parties.

Pursuant to 23 DCMR §9723.1 (2003) any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879- 1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
