## ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF APPLICATION AND PROTESTS

The Application filed by GoBrands, Inc., t/a Go Puff – Rive (Applicant) for a Substantial Change for a transfer to a new location from 3401 Water Street, NW, to 1077 30th Street, NW, of its Retailer's Class IA License, having been protested by ANC 2E, CAG, a Group of Five or More Individuals, and three (3) Abutting Property Owners, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on January

28, 2019, and a Protest Status Hearing on February 27, 2019, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601.

On February 27, 2019, the Board dismissed the Application and the Protests of ANC 2E, CAG, the Group of Five or More Individuals, and the Abutting Property Owners, because the Applicant and the Protestants failed to appear at the Protest Status Hearing. The Applicant and the Protestants may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion.
