CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, everyone. I would like to welcome you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

We have five Members in attendance today and we do have a quorum.

13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.
14	MR. FARMER: OAG's office and on of
15	the matters that we are discussing is
16	basically how to consolidate these, rather than
17	make them separate matters or at least in terms
18	of the hearing dates.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.
20	MR. FARMER: As you can see, that is,
21	I mean, approximately once every two weeks for
22	the next three months.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I see.

MR. FARMER: And rather than address them separately at each time, it seems to be we should be able to resolve those rather quickly.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I mean, that

6 is --

MS. PHILLIPS: The District would prefer that this motion, this oral motion be reduced to writing so that the attorneys assigned to these cases can respond, based on each case, as he sees fit, so the Board will have the full record, rather than just going on an oral motion.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, I was not going to issue/order that, Ms. Phillips. What I was going to state was that if the parties agree and present it to the Board, then the Board will consider that.

So I know that it is not your case.

I know that you would not be in a position to respond to what is being stated. So I wouldn't have a problem if that's what the parties want, because from what I see, it's -- they are all

secondary tier violations.

I'm sorry, they are all second primary tier violations. So I wouldn't have a problem for economics of scale to have them on one date, if that is what the parties so desire. And as I have stated, you can contact Ms. Phillips, contact Mr. Adams and if there is a motion to the Board, the Board will consider it.

Okay. Thank you.

MR. FARMER: And at the same time, I don't anticipate any other motions would be made at the same time in terms of the RDO and it's maintenance.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Whatever motions that want to be filed, I'll consider. I know that you have made motions before. I'm open to considering any and all motions. I don't know where my other Board Members will be on that issue, but I am open to consider whatever motions are being filed. Okay.

MR. FARMER: Any questions for the hearings which may came from the defendant's side

would be -- could possibly be considered on the same calendar?

Yes. I would hope that it's the same attorney that will -- if there are other cases, if there are other pending cases, I would hope that they are assigned to the same attorney at the Attorney General's Office and so, therefore, one can look at all the matters and try to figure out how best to solve these problems.

MR. FARMER: And I say that noting I had also noted that on this afternoon's Investigative Agenda, there are two cases pending as well, which I assume --

Of your knowledge base and so, therefore, that's one of the reasons I didn't say anything, but since you have and the Board has not -- we have not discussed what is on the Investigative Agenda to make any recommendation, but if recommendations are made, the -- you can contact the Attorney General's Office to say that --

MR. FARMER: That I have --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- if these recommend -- if recommendations are made to prosecute these claims, that they be included within this.

MR. FARMER: Right. And that -- just so you are -- the Board is aware, those were in the scope of my discussions with Mr. Adams, so I just want to make sure that everyone is on the same page in terms of what we are doing.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You are ahead of us, Mr. Farmer, because the Board has not discussed those issues.

MR. FARMER: I understand.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board has not discussed and maybe who knows, maybe when the Board discusses those matters they might decide that nothing -- that it's not going to be prosecuted. I don't know, because the Board has not discussed those and at some point this afternoon, we will publish the results of the Investigative Agenda, but the Board has not

discussed those issues as yet, sir. Okay.

And I know that you are advocate -that you are an advocate on behalf of your client
and so I do appreciate your advocacy, sir. Okay.
Thank you.

MR. FARMER: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I am trying to see if his client wants to say something.

MR. FARMER: No.

think, unfortunately, your client has appeared in front of me several times and so I do understand that your predicament is representing your client, so I always make sure -- when I say predicament, I always make sure that whatever your client needs to express that, it's expressed through you and to give you an understanding -- an opportunity to talk to your clients before I make any final decisions, because sometimes I can see the facial expressions in front of me.
