ORDER MODIFYING BOARD ORDER NO. 2024-002

In Board Order No. 2024-002, the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis (Board) found that Heights, LLC, t/a Heights Liquor, (hereinafter “Respondent” or “Heights Liquor”) violated the sale to minor law and failed to check the identification of an underage patron. In addition to other penalties, the Respondent was ordered to serve a suspension day on January 27, 2024. The records of the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration (ABCA) show that the suspension was not served; therefore, the Board cancels the January suspension date and moves the suspension to be served on March 30, 2024.

ORDER

Therefore, the Board, on this 28th day of February 2024, **MODIFIES** Board Order No. 2024-002 to change the suspension date to March 30, 2024. All other terms and conditions of the order shall remain in effect. The ABCA shall deliver copies of this Order to the Government and the Respondent.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration, Reeves Center, 2000 14th Street, NW, 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202-879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
