3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case
4 in our calendar is Case Number 19-PRO-00166,
5 Highland Community Entertainment Hall, License
6 Number 115394. Will the parties please approach
7 and identify themselves for the record, please.

8 MR. KLINE: Good morning. Andrew
9 Kline, here on behalf of the Applicant.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
11 Mr. Kline.

12 MS. BROWN: Good morning. Tiffany
13 Brown, here on behalf of the ANC.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
15 Ms. Brown. Are there any preliminary matters in
16 this case?

17 MR. KLINE: No, not at this time.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
19 This matter, then, is scheduled for a show-cause
20 hearing on February the 26th at 1:30 p.m.

21 MR. KLINE: Protest hearing.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: A protest
23 hearing. I apologize. A protest hearing on
24 February 26th at 1:30 p.m. Ms. Brown, do you
25 understand -- I know Mr. Kline has, so do you

1 understand the protest process? I have some
2 instructions that I can read. Let me read the
3 instructions.

4 Now that we've scheduled this matter
5 for a protest hearing, there are a few things
6 that I would love -- that I would like to
7 instruct you about so that the protest hearing is
8 focused and addresses only those issues that are
9 being protested.

10 You either have already received or
11 will soon be receiving an email from Imani
12 Moreland (phonetic) that contains a copy of the
13 protest information form paperwork and a copy of
14 the exhibit form.

15 Both parties are required to complete
16 and submit the protest information form and the
17 exhibit form at least seven days before the date
18 of the hearing.

19 If we do not receive a copy of your
20 forms seven days before the hearing, your
21 application or your protest may be subjected to
22 dismissal.

23 These documents not only need to be
24 submitted to ABRA, but to the opposing parties as
25 well. Please note that these documents greatly

1 assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues,
2 facilitating the process, and keeping the parties
3 on point during the hearing.

4 Each side will have 90 minutes to
5 present their case. This includes all direct and
6 cross-examination of witnesses. The Board does
7 not intend to hear testimony on matters that are
8 not relevant to these issues that are being
9 protested, nor will the Board tolerate repetitive
10 testimony.

11 Are there any questions by anyone?

12 MS. BROWN: No.

13 MR. KLINE: No.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. We
15 thank you greatly for your cooperation. If you
16 have any questions at any time leading up to the
