ORDER DISMISSING PROTEST

The Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board (Board) previously received an order from the District of Columbia Court of Appeals vacating and remanding Board Order No. 2021-518 for additional proceedings. *Conrad v. Dist. of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Bd.*, 21-AA-748, 2023 WL 163964, at *9 (D.C. Jan. 12, 2023). In response to this court decision, the Board ordered the parties to appear at a second mediation in accordance with Board Order No. 2021-518, issued on February 1, 2023.

Nevertheless, the ANC was not able to attend a mediation session and did not appear at the required Protest Status Hearing on May 24, 2023. In light of the failure to attend mediation and failure to appear at the status hearing, the protest of the ANC merits dismissal pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-445(d) and 23 DCMR § 1604.3 (West Supp. 2023).

ORDER

Therefore, the Board, on this 24th day of May 2023, hereby **DISMISSES** the protest of ANC 8C.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that where there are no remaining protests in this case, the application shall be referred to ABCA's Licensing Division for processing as a non-protested Application in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-311(a).

The ABRA shall deliver a copy of this order to the Parties.

Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
