3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The second case
4	on our Protest Hearing (Status) Calendar is Case
5	No. 19-PRO-00033, Il Canale, License No. 83707.
6	Will the parties, please, approach and
7	identify themselves for the record, please? We
8	will start with the licensee.
9	MS. HIRAO: Risa Hirao, H-I-R-A-O,
10	counsel for applicant.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
12	Ms. Hirao.
13	MS. HIRAO: Good morning.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who else do we
15	have here?
16	MR. J. UHAR: Good morning, John Uhar,
17	protestant.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
19	Mr. Uhar.
20	MR. J. UHAR: U-H-A-R is the last
21	name.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.

1 MR. R. UHAR: Roger Uhar, U-H-A-R, 2 protestant. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, 3 4 Mr. Uhar. 5 Lisa Palmer, ANC-2E. MS. PALMER: CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, 6 7 Ms. Palmer. 8 Are there any preliminary matters that 9 need to be brought to the attention of the Board? 10 Yes, Mr. -- you are Mister? 11 MR. J. UHAR: I'm John Uhar. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ah, yes. Yes, 13 sir? MR. J. UHAR: The Il Canale is 14 currently under four stop work orders and under 15 16 DC Code 25-311, I don't understand --CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, I'm just --17 18 MR. J. UHAR: I don't understand why 19 they are still operating. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, that's 21 not before us, sir. That is another agency. You 22 would have to address that with another agency,

1 but we strictly deal with the alcohol license and 2 so that is not an issue that this Board would have jurisdiction over. 3 Any other preliminary matter that 4 5 needs to be brought to the attention of the Board? 6 7 All right. Then this matter is 8 scheduled for a Protest Hearing on 9/11 at 1:30 9 All right. p.m. Now that we have scheduled 10 All right. 11 this hearing -- this matter for a Protest Hearing, there are a few things that I would like 12 13 to instruct the applicant and the protestants 14 about, so that the Protest Hearing is focused and addresses only those issues that are being 15 16 protested. The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to 17 18 this case. 19 You should have received by electronic 20 or regular mail a letter explaining the protest 21 process, a copy of the Protest Information Form 22 and a copy of the Exhibit Form. If you do not

have these documents, please, contact Assistant General Counsel April Randall following this hearing. 3

4 It is imperative that you review the 5 rules closely and adhere to them before and during the Protest Hearing. You are also 6 7 required to complete and submit the Protest 8 Information Form (PIF) and the Exhibit Form seven 9 days before the date of the hearing. These two forms and accompanying documents need to be 10 11 submitted to ABRA's Legal Division and to all 12 opposing parties in this matter.

13 If we do not receive a copy of your 14 PIF, your application or your protest, whichever side you are representing, may be subject to 15 16 dismissal. Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of the Exhibit Form and the exhibits themselves, 17 18 your exhibits may be excluded from the record 19 upon a finding that the opposing party has been 20 prejudiced or no good cause for failure to submit 21 has been shown.

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Likewise witnesses other than a party

may also be subject to exclusion if not
identified in the PIF.

Accordingly, these forms are very important as they greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. They likewise provide notice to opposing parties enabling them to better prepare for the hearing.

Basically, what I just said, seven days before the Protest Hearing, you are supposed to exchange the documents and witnesses with each side. If that is not done, if a side objects to it, unless you can show good cause why it is not done, the Board is not going to allow it to happen.

17 If you don't understand the process, 18 please contact, either side, Assistant General 19 Counsel April Randall at (202) 442-4353. 20 Any questions that you have, you are 21 welcome to ask her about how to do a PIF, when it

needs to be submitted, how it should be

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1	submitted, because if it's not, if when we come			
2	here on 9/11 and if it's not done, we are not			
3	going to the Board will now allow the			
4	witnesses or exhibits.			
5	Well, you as yourself as a witness can			
6	testify, but if you want to bring in someone else			
7	or bring in other documents and other witnesses,			
8	unless you can show good cause why it was not			
9	done, the Board is not going to allow you to do			
10	that. Okay?			
11	So, yes, ma'am, do you have any			
12	questions?			
13	MS. PALMER: Yeah, just a process			
14	question.			
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am.			
16	MS. PALMER: If you could clarify, if			
17	the ANC signs an agreement before September 11			
18	and the abutting neighbors do not, would you just			
19	review how that would work?			
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Now			
21	in this particular case, if the ANC signs a			
22	settlement agreement, because there are abutting			

1 property owners --2 MS. PALMER: Right. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- they still 3 4 remain. 5 MS. PALMER: Right. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So if one or if 6 7 -- so if -- even if one brother decides that he 8 wants to sign a settlement agreement and the 9 other abutting property owner decides that he is 10 not going to, then we are still going to have a 11 hearing. 12 So the only way we will not have a 13 hearing is if all three parties either 14 individually or separately sign settlement 15 agreements. 16 MS. PALMER: And what is the ANC's 17 responsibility after signing a settlement 18 agreement related to the hearing? Do I --19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You would have 20 no responsibility, so you would provide a 21 settlement, the settlement agreement to the Board for its review and then we will say that the ANC 22

1	has signed a settlement agreement and they are no			
2	longer a party in this matter.			
3	MS. PALMER: Okay.			
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So that's it.			
5	But the hearing because since as an abutting			
6	property owner they have their individual			
7	standing, so therefore unless they sign onto a			
8	settlement agreement, we are going to move			
9	forward.			
10	The only time that if the ANC signs a			
11	settlement agreement where the protestants would			
12	fall is if it were a Group of Five or More.			
13	MS. PALMER: Right, okay.			
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But if it's not			
15	an Group of Five or More, the hearing will move			
16	on with the other parties who have standing.			
17	It appears that I will see you on			
18	September 11th and I think that's the first			
19	hearing when we come back. We go on break after			
20	next week and so we will be off for a couple of			
21	weeks and so I guess when we come back from			
22	break, then I'll see you guys here for a hearing,			

1 it appears that way. 2 Have a good summer and take care. Thank you. 3 MS. PALMER: 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And one last 5 thing, I always support settlement agreements. 6 And the reason I support settlement agreements is 7 because this is your neighborhood. You can 8 decide the way you want an establishment to 9 operate in your neighborhood. None of us, I don't believe any of the 10 11 Board Members, live in the neighborhood, so I 12 don't necessarily want to make decisions about 13 your neighborhood, but if we have to, then so be 14 it. Anyway, have a great day. Thank you 15 16 very much. 17 MS. PALMER: Thank you. 18 MS. HIRAO: Thank you. 19 MR. R. UHAR: Thank you. 20 MR. J. UHAR: Thank you very much. 21 (Whereupon, the Protest Hearing 22 (Status) was concluded at 9:47 a.m.)
