**ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF THE GROUP OF FIVE OR
MORE INDIVIDUALS' PROTEST**

The Application filed by Iraklion, LLC, t/a Iraklion (Applicant), for a Transfer from Safekeeping to a New Location at 1412 I Street, NW, Washington, D.C., of its Retailer's Class CN License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on October 24, 2023.

On October 24, 2023, the Board dismissed the Protest of the Group of Five or More Individuals because the Group of Five or More Individuals is a group of corporations that

are not a group of no fewer than five (5) residents or property owners sharing a common ground. Title 25 of the D.C. Official Code §§ 25-601(1)(A) and 25-601(2).

The Group of Five or More Individuals may file a Motion for Reconsideration within ten (10) days from the date of this Order if it disagrees with the findings of the Board.

ORDER

The Board does hereby, this 25th day of October 2023, **DISMISS** the Protest of the Group of Five or More Individuals. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Parties.

The Board advises the parties that the protests of ANC 2C and JP Morgan Chase Bank, National Association remain, and the Protest Status Hearing is set for November 8, 2023, at 10:30 a.m. and the Protest Hearing for December 6, 2023, at 1:30 p.m.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879- 1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
