3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The
4	next case we now move to our show cause hearing
5	status calendar. And the first case on our show
6	cause hearing status calendar is Case Number 19-
7	CC-00027, Ivy City Tavern, License Number 93795.
8	Will the parties please approach and
9	identify themselves for the record, please.
10	MR. RIVERO: Good morning, board
11	members. Fernando Rivero for the District of
12	Columbia.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
14	Mr. Rivero.
15	MS. YOHANNES: Sidon Yohannes on behalf
16	of ICT.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
18	Ms. Yohannes.
19	MR. CASTEN: Gregory Casten, owner of
20	the Ivy City Tavern.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Casten?
22	MR. CASTEN: C-A-S-T-E-N. Yes, sir.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
2	sir. Thank you for being here this morning.
3	Are there preliminary matters in this
4	case?
5	MR. RIVERO: Yes. The parties have an
6	offer in compromise to present to the Board.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is
8	that, sir?
9	MR. RIVERO: The offer in compromise
LO	consists of a warning, mandatory warning for
L1	Charge 1.
L2	And for Charge 2, dismissal of the
L3	charge.
L 4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Yohannes,
L5	it's my understanding that there is a, there is a
L6	OIC. And the OIC is that there is a mandatory
L7	warning and for Charge 1, and that Charge 2 will
L8	be dismissed.
L9	Is this your understanding as to, is
20	this your understanding as to the OIC?
21	MS. YOHANNES: Yes.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your client

1	aware that by accepting an offer in compromise
2	that they're giving up their right to a hearing?
3	MS. YOHANNES: Yes.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your client
5	also aware that by accepting an offer in
6	compromise that they're giving up their right to
7	appeal this matter?
8	MS. YOHANNES: Yes.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. With
10	that said, I then make a motion that the offer in
11	compromise of a warning, a mandatory warning for
12	Charge 1, and for Charge 2, that Charge 2 will be
13	dismissed.
14	Is there a second?
15	MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Second.
16	MEMBER CATO: Second.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Silverstein
18	and Cato have seconded the motion.
19	All those in favor, say aye.
20	(Chorus of ayes.)
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed?
22	(No response.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The matter passed 5-0-0, and the Board will be issuing a Board order.

Prior to moving on, one of the reasons why, and I am, and Mr. Casten, --

MR. CASTEN: Yes, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- I'm glad that you're here today. And one of the reasons why I am, although the Board agreed with, although I voted to accept this OIC, I just think that it is outrageous that a 14-year-old could go to your establishment and was sold alcohol. It is outrageous, sir.

And I hope that you do whatever it is that you do that none of your employees does that again. It is just outrageous. It's a 14-year-old who looks like a 14-year-old, who wasn't acting any older. And I just don't understand how your establishment could make this breach of protocol.

I understand it would be -- it's never understandable for alcohol to be sold to a person

1	who's younger than 21. If this person was 20,
2	19, 18, 17 one could say that maybe the person's
3	older. But not a 14-year-old, sir.
4	And I'm glad that you're here and for
5	you to know how, as the Board chair, how I feel
6	about this issue. And so I would hope that I
7	never see you here again for another sale to a
8	minor because this is just outrageous. Okay?
9	Have a good day. Thank you very much.
10	MS. YOHANNES: Thank you.
11	(Whereupon, at 9:58 a.m., the above-
12	entitled matter was concluded.)
