ORDER LIFTING SUSPENSION

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) lifts the suspension imposed on JJ Restaurant, Inc., t/a JJ Restaurant, holder of a Retailer Class CR License No. 107397 subject to conditions based on the fulfillment of the majority of the conditions set forth in Board Order No. 2018-557.

The Board notes that the Respondent reported to ABRA Investigator Brashears that they do not use the second floor; however, ABRA's records show that the Respondent applied for and received a license that allows use of the second floor. Under these circumstances, the Board requires that sufficient cameras be installed on the second floor in accordance with the Offer-in-

Compromise. Nevertheless, the Board will allow the Respondent to open with the understanding that cameras will be installed by the close of business on October 19, 2018.


ORDER

Therefore, on this 3rd day of October 2018, the Board hereby **LIFTS** the suspension of ABRA License No. 107397, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Respondent may reopen upon the retrieval and posting of its license on the premises;
2. The Respondent shall install a sufficient number of security cameras so that all areas potentially accessible by patrons on the first and second floors may be clearly visible in any security footage recorded by the cameras. The license holder shall permit ABRA to re-inspect the camera system to determine if it satisfies this Order.
3. The camera system shall be installed by the 5:00 p.m. on October 19, 2018.
4. ABRA is authorized to suspend the license on October 20, 2018 if the Respondent does not comply with this Order, and the suspension shall run until the camera system complies with this Order.

Copies of this Order shall be sent to the parties.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
