ORDER REINSTATING LICENSE


The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, on this 24th day of April 2019, hereby reinstates ABRA License No. 107397, which was cancelled by Board Order No. 2019-191. The reinstatement is based on evidence that a court has allowed the Petitioner, Gladys Nunez, to take possession of the license. Furthermore, this reinstatement is solely for the limited purpose of allowing the Petitioner to file for an involuntary transfer. The Petitioner is advised that she has 45 days to file for the involuntary transfer of the license in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-361 or the license shall be deemed abandoned and shall be cancelled. Instructions for filing an involuntary transfer may be found on ABRA's website.¹


¹ If the involuntary transfer being requested is based on the license holder owing a debt to the Petitioner, an appropriate affidavit shall be filed with the requested involuntary transfer. 

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, Reeves Center, 2000 14th Street, NW, 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
