ORDER SUA SPONTE DISMISSING THE PROTEST FILED BY A GROUP OF FIVE OR MORE INDIVIDUALS

In Board Order No. 2020-200, issued on April 29, 2020, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) approved the Settlement Agreement filed by Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6D and La Famosa, LLC, t/a La Famosa, and it remains in effect.


On June 6, 2020, the Board received a protest petition filed by Sean T. Morris on behalf of a group of District of Columbia residents (Group of Five or More). D.C. Official Code § 25-609(b) provides that "...In the event that an affected ANC submits a settlement agreement to the Board on a protested license application, the Board, upon its approval of the settlement

agreement, shall dismiss any protest of a group of no fewer than 5 residents or property owners meeting the requirements of 25-601(2)..."

Therefore, by operation of law, the Board hereby *sua sponte* **DISMISSES** the protest petition filed by the Group of Five or More Individuals.

A copy of this Order shall be provided to Mr. Morris on behalf of the Group of Five or More.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code§ 25-433(d)(l), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thilty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Coult of Appeals, 430 E StTeet, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
