The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We're back on
4	the record. Our next case is a protest hearing,
5	Case No. 19PRO-00098, GLO-Lalibela Ethiopian
6	Restaurant and Lounge, License No. 104701. Would
7	the parties please approach and identify
8	themselves for the record. We'll start with the
9	licensee.
10	MR. JACKSON: Jeff Jackson representing
11	the Applicant.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jackson.
13	MS. TESFA: Marie Tesfa.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry? Who
15	are you?
16	MS. TESFA: Marie, M-A-R-I-E Tesfa T-E-
17	S-F-A.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: T-S-F and who
19	are you, ma'am?
20	MS. TESFA: The owner.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who else?
22	MS. TESFA: S-I-N-A-Y-E-T Tesfa, T-E-S-
23	F-A.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Speak up, ma'am.
25	MS. TESFA: S-I-N-A-Y-E-T T-E-S-F-A.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who are you,
2	ma'am?
3	MS. TESFA: Manager.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: There's a sign-
5	in sheet. Could everyone please sign in, please?
6	And the protestant.
7	MS. SOLOMON: Good afternoon. My name
8	is Effie, E-F-F-I-E, last name Solomon, S-O-L-O-
9	M-O-N.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who are you,
11	ma'am?
12	MS. SOLOMON: From DC International
13	Hostel.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What's your role
15	there?
16	MS. SOLOMON: Manager.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who else do
18	we have?
19	MR. BHOLA: Terry, T-E-R-Y Bhola, B-
20	H-O-L-A.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, can
22	you spell your last name again, sir?
23	MR. BHOLA: Sure. B-H-O-L-A.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: B-H-O, pull the
25	microphone between the two of you.

1	MR. BHOLA: B-H-O-L-A.
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: L-A? How do you
3	pronounce that?
4	MR. BHOLA: Bhola.
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Bhola? And who
6	are you, sir?
7	MR. BHOLA: Yes. I am the manager of
8	DC International Hostel.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I mean, you're
10	the manager. Who is the owner of DC
11	International?
12	MS. SOLOMON: He's not here.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is he coming?
14	MS. SOLOMON: No. He's out of town.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do we have a
16	letter stating that you can represent them at
17	this matter today?
18	MR. BHOLA: No.
19	MR. JACKSON: Excuse me. That's why I
20	wanted to have the protest dismissed, because the
21	owner of the property never was present during
22	the status hearing, nor was he ever present
23	during the negotiations. And they just manage
24	the property for him, and that's who I initially
25	was in contact with. But he never drafter a

1	letter giving the managers permission to
2	represent him in this protest.
3	MS. SOLOMON: You never talked to the
4	owner of the building.
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But hold on a
6	minute, hold on a minute, hold on. We had a
7	protest status hearing. So who was at the
8	protest status hearing, because I would not have
9	
10	MR. JACKSON: Their manager.
11	MS. SOLOMON: The business owner.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who was at the
13	protest status hearing?
14	MS. SOLOMON: The business owner.
15	MR. JACKSON: He was never here.
16	MS. SOLOMON: He was the business
17	owner.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can we get a
19	transcript? We don't need to do that.
20	MR. JACKSON: You said the business
21	owner, not the property owner.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, we
23	don't need to do that. I mean, I know that when
24	I have Maybe someone can pull me the
25	transcript from the protest status hearing,

because I know when I have a protest status hearing, I always go through the process and ask who folks are. If the person doesn't identify themselves as an owner, if they say that they're the manager, then I'm going to say if you come to the hearing, the owner needs to show up or you need to have a letter of representation saying that you are empowered to do this.

So let me see, let me read the transcript from the last time you guys were in front of me. Let me see what I said, let me see who was here, and I'll make a decision based on what was there.

MR. JACKSON: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So rather than we say who was there or who wasn't there, let me see because that's one of the reasons why every time people come in front of me, you tell me your name. The first thing I ask you, who are you in relation to this establishment.

MR. JACKSON: I agree.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I always do that. So we're off the record for a minute.

(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 3:07:35 p.m. and resumed

2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We're back on
3	the record. At our show cause hearing status, we
4	had Mr. Farid Salin. And who is Mr. Salin?
5	MS. SOLOMON: He's the business owner.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: He is the owner
7	of
8	MS. SOLOMON: The business.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: the business.
10	And is Mr. Salin in here today?
11	MS. SOLOMON: No, he's out of town.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And you're Ms.
13	Solomon?
14	MS. SOLOMON: Yes, sir.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And you are Mr.
16	Bhola?
17	MR. BHOLA: Yeah.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do either of you
19	have a letter from the owner stating that you are
20	able to represent them today? Represent the
21	owner at this protest hearing?
22	MS. SOLOMON: No, sir.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You have nothing
24	in writing?
25	MS. SOLOMON: It's an old one. I do

1	have an old one, but
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What old one
3	what?
4	MS. SOLOMON: I do have a presentation.
5	He gave me power of attorney.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You have a what?
7	MS. SOLOMON: He did give me power of
8	attorney, just to do for anything, but not
9	specifically this.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But not You
11	don't have
12	MS. SOLOMON: We didn't know that we
13	had to get that, but I am his legal power of
14	attorney.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But you have not
16	provided this. You don't have a power of
17	attorney where Mr. Fahid, I'm sorry, Mr. Salin,
18	has stated that he authorizes you to represent
19	him today in this protest hearing, is that
20	correct?
21	MS. SOLOMON: No, sir. Yeah, that's
22	correct.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You don't have
24	that.
25	MS. SOLOMON: Yes.

1	MR. BHOLA: Can I say something?
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What do you need
3	to say, sir?
4	MR. BHOLA: We are included in the
5	email conversation.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, sir. No,
7	sir. Sir, I had the at the show cause hearing
8	status, he was here. Every time I go to a
9	hearing, I always, when I have a hearing, I ask
10	people who are you? Can you tell me who you are?
11	If you are not the owner, then I need to get a
12	letter from someone authorizing us, saying that I
13	authorize Ms. Solomon and Mr. Bhola to represent
14	me here today at this protest hearing status.
15	MR. BHOLA: Okay, let
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Let you what?
17	MR. BHOLA: Obviously, we're clearly at
18	a disadvantage, so would it be possible to
19	reschedule again for the last time?
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What do you mean
21	you're at a disadvantage?
22	MR. BHOLA: Well, I mean that we do not
23	have the letter that can show
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Why you don't
25	have the letter? I mean, I'm just asking. Why

1	you don't have the letter? Can I come to your
2	home and say, you're not there, and say I'm the
3	homeowner, I can make all the decisions for you?
4	MR. BHOLA: Right, no, I get your
5	point. Is there a way which we can reschedule so
6	we can get that letter? We can have that letter
7	by tomorrow.
8	MEMBER SHORT: Please speak up, sir.
9	Speak into the mic.
10	MR. BHOLA: Sure. We can have that
11	letter as soon as tomorrow or by this afternoon
12	if that would help the situation.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jackson, I
14	mean? Mr. Jackson, what is it that you want me
15	to do?
16	MR. JACKSON: Dismiss the protest.
17	MR. BHOLA: Let me add to that again.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, you
19	said what?
20	MR. BHOLA: I just want to say we are
21	at a disadvantage, but we're very adamant about -
22	-
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Adamant about
24	what?
25	MR. BHOLA: About seeing this through

to the very end.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, part of the problem is that adamant about seeing this through to the end is that I know you're adamant, but you're not the owner. I can't take -- and this is a protest hearing that was scheduled for today.

MR. BHOLA: Clear.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And the owner is not here, and you're unable to give me a letter of authorization saying that you can represent the owner today here. And the owner of the other business is saying that because you can't prove that you can represent this entity, that I should dismiss the protest. I shouldn't continue the hearing. That's what they're telling me.

MR. JACKSON: In addition to, Mr. Chairman, they never submitted the PIF, either.

MS. SOLOMON: The what?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you're saying there's no PIF?

MR. JACKSON: There's no PIF from the protestant.

MR. BHOLA: What is a PIF?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other

representation you want to make, Mr. Jackson?

MR. JACKSON: Yes. Based upon the investigative reports, based upon the evidence that we presented, we don't feel that the applicant had a adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, and I'd like for the board to consider renewing the application and dismissing the protest.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Anything else you want to say? Mr. Bhola? Ms. Solomon? Anything else you want to say?

MR. BHOLA: No.

MS. SOLOMON: No.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: As Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the District of Columbia, in accordance with DC Official Code Section 2574B4 of the Open Meetings Act, I move that ABC Board hold a closed meeting for the purpose of seeking legal advice from our counsel, excuse me, on Case No. 19PRO-00098, GLO-Lalibela Ethiopian Restaurant and Lounge, License No. 104701, pursuant to DC Official Code Section 2547B4 of the Open Meetings Act. And deliberating on just, yeah -- is there a second?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has seconded the motion. I will now take a roll call vote on the motion before us now that has been seconded. Mr. Short?

MEMBER SHORT: I agree.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?

MEMBER CATO: I agree.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson, I agree. As it appears that the motion has passed, I hereby give notice that ABC Board will recess these proceedings to hold a closed meeting in the ABC Board conference room, pursuant to Section 2547B of the Open Meetings Act. I'll be right back, okay? We can wait, thank you.

(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 3:21:06 p.m. and resumed at 3:25:07 p.m.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We're back on the record in GLO Case No. 19PRO-00098. This matter was scheduled for a protest hearing today. We had a protest status hearing on October 9th. On October 9th, the owner of the establishment, Mr. Salin, who is a protestant in this matter, appeared for the protest hearing. I informed him today, he was aware that a protest hearing was

scheduled today. Today Mr. Salin is not here for this protest. I have two present, Ms. Solomon and Mr. Bhola. Ms. Solomon introduced herself as an employee of DC International, and Mr. Bhola also introduced himself as a manager of that establishment.

I did ask Ms. Solomon and Mr. Bhola whether or not they have a letter of representation from the owner stating that they are able to represent him today at this hearing. I have been informed that they do not have that letter. They have asked for the board to continue this matter so they can provide this information, and the owner of the establishment is not in agreement. So therefore, my recommendation is that we're going to dismiss the protest.

The reason we're going to dismiss the protest is because the abutting property owner has failed to appear at the protest hearing. So that's my recommendation to the board, so therefore, I make a motion that the protest be dismissed and that the license be renewed because failure of the protestant to appear at the hearing. Is there a second?

MEMBER CATO: Second.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato seconded the motion. All of those in favor, say aye.

(Chorus of aye.)

The matter passed, 3, zero, zero. What this means to the protestant, we will issue a decision dismissing the protest. The protestant has 10 days to appeal this decision to provide the board with good cause why the owner was not here today. If the protestant has failed to respond to our order in 10 days and provide us good cause why he was not here today, the license will be renewed. Okay? Have a good day. Thank you very much. And with that, the board is adjourned for the day. Thank you.
