3	AGENT FLETCHER: Would the parties in
4	the matter of Little Beast, please, come forward.
5	The parties in the matter of Little Beast. This
6	is Case No. 18-PRO-00028, Gordon Restaurant-Chevy
7	Chase, LLC.
8	MR. KOLKER: Which side is which?
9	AGENT FLETCHER: The right side is for
10	the applicant. This side is for the protestant.
11	MR. KOLKER: Okay.
12	AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Gordon, you are
13	the owner?
14	MR. GORDON: I'm a partner.
15	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
16	Present on behalf of the Group of 11?
17	MR. KOLKER: My name is Peter Kolker,
18	K-O-L-K-E-R, is the last name.
19	AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Kolker, are there
20	any other individuals present from your group
21	today?
22	MR. KOLKER: Yes, there are.

1	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Hi. You can
2	line up right behind Mr. Kolker. There is a
3	microphone on the table and just state your name
4	and spell it for the record, please.
5	MS. FOSTER-CROWDER: Can you hear me?
6	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
7	MS. FOSTER-CROWDER: It's Lee Foster-
8	Crowder.
9	AGENT FLETCHER: How do you spell it?
10	Ms. FOSTER-CROWDER: Foster, F-O-S-T-
11	E-R hyphen C-R-O-W-D, as in dog, E-R.
12	AGENT FLETCHER: And what's the first
13	name?
14	Ms. FOSTER-CROWDER: Lee.
15	AGENT FLETCHER: L-E-E?
16	MS. FOSTER-CROWDER: Yes, it's do
17	you need the official on my passport name?
18	AGENT FLETCHER: No, just your
19	MS. FOSTER-CROWDER: Okay.
20	AGENT FLETCHER: L-E-E is good.
21	MS. FOSTER-CROWDER: Okay. That's my
22	middle name, but that's what I use.

1	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
2	Thank you very much.
3	MS. FOSTER-CROWDER: Okay.
4	MR. GEORGIEV: George Georgiev, G-E-O-
5	R-G-I-E-V, as in victory.
6	AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
7	MR. MILES-McLEAN: Good morning.
8	AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning.
9	MR. MILES-McLEAN: Stuart Miles-
10	McLean. Spelled, the first name is S-T-U-A-R-T
11	last name is M-I-L-E-S hyphen M-C capital L-E-A-
12	N.
13	AGENT FLETCHER: L-E-A-N. Thank you
14	very much.
15	MR. MILES-McLEAN: Thank you.
16	AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Kolker, there are
17	four individuals present from your group today,
18	which means that your group is granted
19	conditional standing.
20	MR. KOLKER: Okay.
21	AGENT FLETCHER: At the upcoming
22	Status Hearing, one more person needs to appear

that is not here today. 1 2 MR. KOLKER: All right. At that time, the 3 AGENT FLETCHER: 4 Board would grant full standing to your group, but we will proceed with scheduling the dates. 5 Is there anyone here representing 6 Deborah Meredith or Milton Meredith? 7 8 MR. KOLKER: Well, I'm representing 9 them, because all of those individuals who entered the protest or signed our Protest Letter 10 11 designated me in the Protest Letter to be their 12 representative. 13 AGENT FLETCHER: The Protest Letter 14 filed by the Merediths appears to be separate 15 from the one you filed. I'll take another look. 16 In your Protest Letter, on your cover letter, Mr. 17 Kolker, you mentioned that you were -- there were 18 a Group of 11 residents and there were a group of 19 11 residents that signed the Protest Letter that 20 you submitted. 21 The Merediths filed a separate Protest

Letter.

But they also signed the 1 MR. KOLKER: 2 one that we filed and if I may show it to you? AGENT FLETCHER: That's okay. 3 If it's here I'll find it. Give me one second. 4 5 thanks for pointing that out. I'm going to take I got it right here. So I'm going to 6 a look. 7 make a note to disregard the one that they filed, because they also filed a separate Protest 8 9 Letter. 10 MR. KOLKER: Yes. 11 AGENT FLETCHER: So just for the

AGENT FLETCHER: So just for the record, we are going to disregard the Protest Letter that they filed and just include them in your Group of then 13, because the two of them make 13 for your group.

MR. KOLKER: Okay.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So, Mr.

Kolker, you are representing a Group of 13 and still just one more who is not present today needs to come at the Status Hearing.

MR. KOLKER: They come in even while we are speaking, because they are on route, but

1 if not, they will be at the next hearing. 2 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. We need to set a date for a mediation, Status Hearing and 3 4 Protest Hearing. I'll give you the date for the 5 Status and Protest Hearing first. The date for the Status Hearing is 6 7 June 20, June 20 at 9:30 a.m. 8 MR. GORDON: Would that be here? 9 AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. 10 MR. KOLKER: Okay. Is it possible for 11 that date to be changed? Because I have to be 12 out of the country in the -- on the week of the 17th of June. 13 14 AGENT FLETCHER: The dates being given today, Mr. Kolker, are actually the next 15 16 available dates on the Board's full calendar, so 17 I'll give you the date and you can petition the 18 Board to change the date for the reason you 19 stated. And then they will grant you a 20 continuance should they so decide. 21 MR. KOLKER: Okay. 22 AGENT FLETCHER: The other option that

you have, Mr. Kolker, because at the Status 1 2 Hearing, the only thing that happens is that the Board wants to know if the parties participated 3 in mediation and whether or not the matter was 4 5 settled. All right. 6 MR. KOLKER: 7 AGENT FLETCHER: So if you want, you 8 can designate the one other person that must 9 come. 10 MR. KOLKER: I see, okay. 11 AGENT FLETCHER: You can designate 12 that one person and if they show, that's fine and 13 they can just say --14 And they would simply MR. KOLKER: report about whether the mediation was successful 15 16 or not? 17 AGENT FLETCHER: The mediation, 18 exactly. And in your case, they will report 19 about whether or not mediation was successful or 20 not and that one additional person will cause the 21 Board to grant full standing to your protest.

Okay.

MR. KOLKER:

1	AGENT FLETCHER: And so if you want to
2	do that, instead of rescheduling.
3	MR. KOLKER: Yes. All right. That's
4	what we will do instead.
5	AGENT FLETCHER: And I'll make a note
6	of that.
7	MR. KOLKER: And is that at 10:00?
8	AGENT FLETCHER: That is going to be
9	at 9:30.
10	MR. KOLKER: 9:30.
11	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, on June 20 at
12	9:30.
13	MR. KOLKER: Okay.
14	AGENT FLETCHER: The Protest Hearing
15	is set for July 18 at 1:30, July 18 at 1:30 for
16	the Protest Hearing.
17	MR. KOLKER: All right.
18	AGENT FLETCHER: And, Mr. Kolker, when
19	will you be out of town?
20	MR. KOLKER: I'll be out of town from
21	June 15th. Excuse me, let me just look for a
22	moment here, so I can from June 15th and I

1	return on June 24th.
2	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
3	MR. KOLKER: So basically June 15th to
4	June 22nd is when I'm out of town.
5	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. I just wanted
6	to make sure.
7	MR. KOLKER: I'm counting the weekend,
8	okay, so
9	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
10	MR. KOLKER: I'm back on the 25th.
11	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Just to
12	MR. KOLKER: I'll be back for that
13	for the Protest Hearing on July 18.
14	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. I'm just
15	checking for the mediation dates.
16	MR. KOLKER: Oh, I see. Okay.
17	AGENT FLETCHER: And I'll the dates
18	that I'm going to give you precede the 15th if
19	you are available.
20	MR. KOLKER: Okay.
21	AGENT FLETCHER: The next available
22	date for mediation is Thursday, May 31st, that's

1	Thursday, May 31st.
2	MR. KOLKER: Just a moment, please.
3	AGENT FLETCHER: And that would be at
4	9:00, 10:00, 11:00, 11:30, any time between 9:00
5	and 1:00.
6	MR. KOLKER: Just a minute. Can I
7	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
8	MR. KOLKER: just consult here?
9	AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.
10	MR. GORDON: Can I ask about the
11	mediation?
12	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
13	MR. GORDON: You would have a mediator
14	here?
15	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, I'm the Board's
16	Mediator. It would be me.
17	MR. GORDON: You are the Board's
18	Mediator?
19	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
20	MR. GORDON: So that would occur on
21	May 31st at?
22	AGENT FLETCHER: If that's a good date

1	for everyone, it will be on the 31st at whatever
2	time you choose.
3	MR. GORDON: It's a good date for us.
4	MR. KOLKER: That's a problem for our
5	side, because Ms. Foster-Crowder, whose presence
6	is necessary, is out of town.
7	AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.
8	MR. KOLKER: But comes back on June
9	4th.
10	AGENT FLETCHER: On June 4? Well, let
11	me ask you this, would okay, let me check the
12	4th first. We could do it on Tuesday, June 5 if
13	that works for you, Mr. Gordon? June 5th?
14	MR. GORDON: Okay.
15	MR. KOLKER: Yeah, that's fine.
16	AGENT FLETCHER: Do you have a
17	preference for any time between 9:00 and 1:00?
18	9:00, 9:30, 10:00?
19	MR. KOLKER: 9:30?
20	AGENT FLETCHER: 9:30.
21	MR. KOLKER: And then can you answer
22	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.

1	MR. KOLKER: you will be the
2	mediator?
3	(Phone Rings)
4	MR. KOLKER: Excuse me. Sorry.
5	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
6	MR. KOLKER: You will be the mediator.
7	Okay.
8	AGENT FLETCHER: I am the Board's
9	Mediator, yes.
10	MR. KOLKER: Okay. So that would be
11	June 5th at 9:30?
12	AGENT FLETCHER: 9:30.
13	MR. KOLKER: Okay. And it would be
14	here? Is it
15	AGENT FLETCHER: It will. Most likely
16	it will be in this room. When you check-in, the
17	person out front will let you know whether or not
18	you can come in this room. Most likely it's
19	going to be right here.
20	MR. KOLKER: Okay. Or else they will
21	redirect us?
22	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. She will just

1	have you come in through that door right there.
2	MR. KOLKER: Okay. All right.
3	AGENT FLETCHER: In the back.
4	Mediation is set for Tuesday, June 5 at 9:30.
5	MR. GORDON: Okay. Can I ask about
6	process, please?
7	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
8	MR. GORDON: We mediate on June 5th.
9	If we come to terms, then we report on June 20th?
10	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. If you come to
11	if you enter into if you come to mediation
12	on June the 5th and you enter into a settlement
13	agreement and submit it to the Board, you would
14	not need to come on June the 20th, to the Status
15	Hearing.
16	MR. GORDON: All right. And then the
17	Protest on July 18th?
18	AGENT FLETCHER: That would be
19	canceled if you submit a settlement agreement
20	that the Board approves.
21	But let me make another note just for
22	the record. The Mr. Gordon, you entered into

a settlement agreement with the ANC?

MR. GORDON: Correct.

AGENT FLETCHER: And just for the record, what that means is that if the ANC enters into a settlement agreement with an -- if the ANC enters into a settlement agreement with an establishment, upon approval of the settlement agree, the Board dismisses any group of individuals.

Mr. Kolker is representing a Group of 13. The ANC agreement has been submitted. There is a chance that that agreement will go on the Board's Agenda for review on this coming Wednesday. If the agreement goes on the Board's Agenda for review this coming Wednesday or any Wednesday prior to your mediation, the Board will -- if they approve the agreement, then they will dismiss the group of individuals. That's the --

MR. GORDON: We are aware of this Wednesday date. And we will be in attendance.

AGENT FLETCHER: On Wednesday, I'm not aware that you have a hearing before the Board.

1	MR. GORDON: Oh, we don't.
2	AGENT FLETCHER: You don't. Yeah, you
3	don't have a hearing on Wednesday.
4	MR. GORDON: Ah.
5	AGENT FLETCHER: The Board comes
6	there is a full Board on Wednesdays.
7	MR. GORDON: Right.
8	AGENT FLETCHER: When they come in on
9	Wednesdays, if there are any settlement
10	agreements for review
11	MR. GORDON: Um-hum.
12	AGENT FLETCHER: the review them
13	behind closed doors. So there is no hearing.
14	MR. GORDON: Right.
15	AGENT FLETCHER: So I'm not aware that
16	you are on a you have a hearing for Wednesday.
17	MR. GORDON: Okay.
18	AGENT FLETCHER: It's just that they
19	will review the settlement agreement when they
20	are here on Wednesday.
21	MR. GORDON: All right.
22	MR. KOLKER: Will we have an

opportunity to submit something to the Board in advance of that Wednesday hearing, in which we request that the Board defer their consideration of that settlement agreement until the July 18th hearing?

We are in negotiations on two fronts at the same time.

AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.

MR. KOLKER: One of them is the liquor license and the other is the public space permit.

And we would like to be able to present our position to the Board, so that they could consider after all these matters have been resolved, if we are able to resolve them.

AGENT FLETCHER: The -- if the Board approves the -- so to answer your question, first of all, Mr. Kolker, that's not part of their procedure, so that's not something they would do.

But once the Board issues an order approving a settlement agreement, it comes out in the form of a Board Order and when there is a Board Order issued, the parties have an

1	opportunity to seek reconsideration of the Board
2	Order.
3	And so, you know, at that time, you
4	would have an opportunity to say whatever you
5	wanted to say, but it would be after the Board
6	Order has been issued approving the settlement
7	agreement.
8	MR. KOLKER: If I make a submission
9	and ask that the Board consider it, would that at
10	least be presented before the Board at their
11	hearing?
12	AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, any you can
13	make any submission to the Board at any time
14	MR. KOLKER: Okay.
15	AGENT FLETCHER: to go on the
16	Board's Agenda for review.
17	MR. KOLKER: Okay.
18	AGENT FLETCHER: And so, yes, you can
19	do that.
20	MR. KOLKER: Okay. Thank you.
21	AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum. Any
22	questions at all? Any other questions?

MR. GORDON: Well, the only comment I 1 2 would like to make is that the settlement agreement with the ANC has substantially reduced 3 4 some of the things that we have asked, so that 5 many of the complaints or the -- yeah, complaints that have been put forth by the complainants are 6 7 taken care of. 8 AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum. 9 So I hope that the ANC --MR. GORDON: settlement agreement with the ANC is -- follows 10 11 your process on Wednesday. 12 AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum. 13 MR. GORDON: And then we learn right after that what the outcome is? 14 15 Yeah, you can call. AGENT FLETCHER: 16 If the Board reviews your settlement agreement on 17 Wednesday, you may call Thursday afternoon after 18 12:00 and ask whether or not the Board approved 19 the settlement agreement. 20 Are you familiar with Martha Jenkins 21 or April Randall, either one of those individuals? 22

1	MR. GORDON: I don't know them.
2	AGENT FLETCHER: You can contact
3	well, let me spell April Randall's last name for
4	the record. Her last name is spelled R-A-N-D-A-
5	L-L, that's April Randall.
6	MR. GORDON: Um-hum.
7	AGENT FLETCHER: Martha Jenkins is the
8	person that you can contact. Martha Jenkins is
9	our General Counsel. Martha Jenkins, that's M-A-
10	R-T-H-A J-E-N-K-I-N-S. You may contact Martha
11	Jenkins by calling (202) 442-4423.
12	MR. GORDON: And April?
13	AGENT FLETCHER: April has the same
14	number. In fact, I would suggest you contact
15	April first, because she will know first.
16	MR. GORDON: Okay.
17	AGENT FLETCHER: April Randall will
18	know first whether or not the settlement
