The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Then let's move to our fact finding hearing calendar. The next case on our fact finding hearing calendar is Case Number -- the applicant is Michael Steve Zanders, Highland Community Entertainment Hall. The date of the event is October 26, 2019. Is Mr. Zanders in the audience?

You can have a seat over to the side, sir. And can you also please remove your hat, please, sir? Can the parties please introduce themselves for the record? We'll start with the investigator.

MR. PUENTE: Kevin Puente, ABRA investigator.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
Mr. Puente. Mr. Zanders.

MR. ZANDERS: Michael Steve Zanders, Highland Community Entertainment Hall.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

It's my understanding, sir, you had applied for two one day licenses. One was on the 23rd. I believe one was on the 23rd. And the second one is on the 26th, which is this weekend.

Because you had never applied for a license before from the Agency, the Board had recommended that we approve the first license and monitor the event and have you come in for a fact finding hearing regarding the second event, which is this week.

And in preparing for the case today,
I saw that you applied for a permanent license
for this location. I guess you applied for a CX
license, I believe.

So maybe you can tell us about you, this event and basically what is it that you're trying to do at this location, sir?

MR. ZANDERS: Okay. Basically, at the event that we have on the 26th, it's like an oldie by goodie event that we're having with the Intruders and the Quiet Storm Band.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Maybe you could also start off by telling us who you are, what is it you're trying to do? I guess it's somewhat changed a little bit since you are now applying for a license and which we normally don't do a qualification hearing for a license.

But I'm saying that since you're here, you can just give us some background about you

and what is your concept and what is it you're trying to do at the location.

MR. ZANDERS: Okay. I comp serve at the location. We're trying to put something in Southeast Washington, a venue where they can have wedding receptions. We throw boxing events, dance events. I also run the Woodland Tigers Youth Sports and Educational Program.

And with that, we're trying to get something in the community for our youth, the seniors, having wedding receptions and a place where they can come and rent out. As you know, they don't have nothing in the community and the area. So they can have a place to rent for, like, wedding receptions, meetings, dances, you know, cabarets and stuff like that.

And we're also doing, like talent night and stuff like that with other DC talent.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I see from your basic business license you have a public hall. So what's that?

MR. ZANDERS: Yes, a public hall license. You're aware that to get a public hall license you have to go in front of the ANC Commission in which they approved our public hall

license because they liked the concept of what we were trying to do in the community.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You said they did or did not?

MR. ZANDERS: They did. They approved it. We got a letter from the ANC Commission to go forward with the public hall license.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Puente, you had an opportunity to monitor the event, the last event. Can you tell us what it is you were able to ascertain from your monitoring activities of the facility and the event.

MR. PUENTE: Yes. So his last event was Friday, October 11. Myself and a couple of other investigators went out there. We went out there. We spoke with Mr. Zanders. He had security present. He was checking IDs at the front entrance as well as walking around the venue.

He had food catered, provided for the guests. There was tables set up. People sit down and eat as well as a dance floor in the middle. It was, as he called it, an oldie dance for the older people. It was a much older crowd. There no one young at any of the bars set up.

It was ran pretty good. I went back out there around 2:00, 2:15. It was shut down on time for the license. By 2:30, everyone was gone. So it was ran very well from what I can tell.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Zanders, I see in your -- who owns the building that you're currently in?

MR. ZANDERS: Rahimian Investment.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, who?

MR. ZANDERS: Rahimian Investment.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And the reason I'm asking you is because normally when you apply for a license, we get a license from a landlord saying that you give permission for the person to have the event in the building.

But I see that the letter was signed by -- you have Highland Community Entertainment Hall. I guess you signed -- and I guess I'm trying to figure out -- it appears that the same person who is having the event is giving the individual the authority to have an event in the building. But you're not saying that you're the owner. So who owns the -- because --

MR. ZANDERS: We are renting from

Rahimian Investment.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But if you're renting from that person, shouldn't it be -- shouldn't it be the landlord sent a letter to the agent just saying that you give the -- you authorize that individual to utilize the space for the purpose rather than you authorizing yourself to use the space?

MR. ZANDERS: The letter that we got for the landlord, I took it to him personally.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, the letter that I have in my package here, it says, I, Michael S. Zanders, of Highland Community Entertainment Hall, LLC hereby authorize Michael S. Zanders for the sale, consumption of alcoholic beverages on October 29 from 10:00 to 1:00 to apply for the license. And the letter was signed by Michael S. Zanders, Highland Community Entertainment Hall. So this is not a letter from a landlord authorizing the use of the property.

MR. ZANDERS: But I have a lease. I'm a leaseholder from the property. And I addressed that situation with the young lady in the license office. And she gave me a form to take to him to sign. And he signed it and filled it out, and I
