
ORDER ON DISMISSAL

This matter arises from the charge filed by the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia contained in Show Cause Notice for Case No. 18-CMP-00065, which alleges a violation of the Respondent's settlement agreement. The Government and the Respondent appeared before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board on September 26, 2018. Before proceeding to the hearing, the Government voluntarily dismissed the charge due to the prosecutor's determination in the interests of justice that the Respondent was protected from the finding of a violation by the notice and cure provision of its settlement agreement.

Therefore, on this 26th day of September 2018, the Board hereby **DISMISSES** the charge in Case No. 18-CMP-00048. The ABRA shall deliver copies of this Order to the Government and the Respondent.



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, Reeves Center, 2000 14th Street, NW, 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202-879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
