CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, everyone. I would like to welcome you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Today is October 2, 2019.

I first would like to introduce Members of the Board with us today.

To my far right is Ms. Rafi Crockett and to my immediate right is Mr. Bobby Cato. To my far left is Ms. Rema Wahabzadah and to her immediate left is Mr. James Short.

My name is Donovan Anderson. I'm Chairman of the Board. The Board has five Members in attendance today for the conduct of business and that constitutes a quorum.

I would like to mention three things before we first get started.

So you can step back, Mr. Bailey, and 6 7 I'll recall the case in a couple of minutes. 8 right. Thank you. Which is my normal procedure. 9 I usually give 30 minutes, but I didn't take the Bench at 9:30 this morning, but I'll give them a 10 11 reasonable period of time to show up, which is 12 probably in the next 15 minutes. If not, I will 13 recall the case. Okay. All right. 14 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter 15 went off the record at 9:50 a.m. and resumed at 16 9:57 a.m.) 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 18 Before moving on to our 10:00 hearing, let me 19 once again recall our Protest Hearing (Status) 20 Case, Case No. 19-PRO-00097, Mama `San, License 21 No. 114205. 22 Would the parties, please, approach 23 and identify themselves for the record?

will issue an order dismissing the protest. The protestant will have 10 days to give us good cause why they were not here today.

If they have not responded and even if they respond and this Board determines that good cause did not exist for them to be here, the Agency will move forward and issue you your license without any conditions, meaning that there will be no settlement agreement that you have to sign, sir.

MR. BAILEY: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

MR. BAILEY: All right, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Have a good

day.

MR. BAILEY: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So as I said before, we will issue a decision in 10 days dismissing the ANC. They then have to respond and give us good cause why they were not here today. And if the Board determines that's no good cause, we will dismiss their protest and the license will be issued without any conditions.

MR. BAILEY: Thank you.
