**ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF THE ASSOCIATION OF
BLACK SOCIAL WORKERS' PROTEST**

The Application filed by ChoDaeBak, Inc., t/a Mart Liquors, for renewal of its Retailer's Class A License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on June 21, 2021.

On June 21, 2021, the Board dismissed the Protest of the Association of Black Social Workers because it is not a citizens association. D.C. Official Code § 25-601(3).

The Association of Black Social Workers may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

Additionally, the Board's agent advised Sharif Omar Group and James Ray Group at the Roll Call Hearing that four (4) more individuals must appear at the Protest Status Hearing in order to be granted standing as a Group of Five Individuals. Sharif Omar Group and James Ray Group were originally granted conditional standing at the Roll Call Hearing.

ORDER

The Board does hereby this 23rd day of June 2021, **DISMISS** the Protest of the Association of Black Social Workers. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Parties.

The Board advises the Parties that the protests of ANC 8C, Sharif Omar Group, Joyce Doyle Group, and James Ray Group remain, and the Protest Status Hearing is set for July 15, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. and the Protest Hearing to a date to be determined.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879- 1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
